

Adroddiad ar Hynt Cymru'n Ennill

Cyflwynwyd y papur i'r Pwyllgor Datblygu Economaidd yn ei gyfarfod ar 31 Hydref. Cyflywnir yn awr i'r Pwyllgor Addysg a Dysgu Gydol Oes er gwybodaeth.

Pwrpas

1. Pwrpas y papur hwn yw rhoi adroddiad ar hynt y gwaith o weithredu *Cymru'n Ennill*.

Y cefndir

2. Ar ôl cyfnod o ymgynghori eang, lansiodd Llywodraeth Cynulliad Cymru *Cymru'n Ennill* ar 28 Ionawr 2002. Cyhoeddwyd y ddogfen ategol *Cynllun Gweithredu Sgiliau a Chyflogaeth* ar 27 Chwefror 2002. Mae'r strategaeth yn canolbwytio ar:
 - gynyddu gallu pob rhan o'r economi i arloesi, defnyddio gwybodaeth a chynnal gwaith ymchwil a datblygu;
 - adeiladu ar ein cryfderau sylweddol ym maes gweithgynhyrchu;
 - gynyddu nifer y swyddi sydd mewn gwasanaethau ariannol a gwasanaethau busnes;
 - helpu mwy o bobl i gael swyddi, er mwyn gostwng lefelau anweithgarwch economaidd;
 - wasgaru cyfoeth ar draws Cymru, gan ddefnyddio'r holl fesurau sydd ar gael inni, gan gynnwys y Cronfeydd Strwythurol Ewropeaidd, Cymorth Rhanbarthol Dewisol, Awdurdod Datblygu Cymru, adnoddau Bwrdd Croeso Cymru ac ELWa, a'r rhaglen Rhoi Cymunedau'n Gyntaf.
3. Fel yn achos pob prosiect, mae'r modd y caiff ei weithredu yn hollbwysig. Mae Grwp Prosiect wedi'i sefydlu i oruchwyllo'r gwaith o weithredu'r strategaeth. Ymhlieth yr aelodau mae cynrychiolwyr o blith adrannau Llywodraeth y Cynulliad, Swyddfa Cyllid Ewropeaidd Cymru, Awdurdod Datblygu Cymru, Bwrdd Croeso Cymru, ELWa, Cymdeithas Llywodraeth Leol Cymru (CLILC) a Job Centre Plus.
4. Hefyd, mae camau wedi'u cymryd i gryfhau'r berthynas ar lefel strategol ac o ran gweithredu polisiau rhwng y gwaith a argymhellir yn *Cymru'n Ennill* a'r Rhagleni Cronfeydd Strwythurol Ewropeaidd.
5. Bydd Llywodraeth Cynulliad Cymru yn cyhoeddi adroddiad blynnyddol llawn ar gynnydd yn gynnar yn haf 2003. Bydd hwn yn cynnwys adolygiad manwl o economi a phatrymau economaidd Cymru, dadansoddiad o gynnydd o'i gymharu â thargedau a diweddar u'r cynllun gweithredu i gymryd i ystyriaeth gyfleoedd a datblygiadau newydd.

6. Mae'r papur hwn yn rhoi adroddiad hanner blwyddyn ar gynnydd. Yn Atodiad 1 ceir gwybodaeth fanylach am gynnydd ym mhob maes.

Targedau

7. Yn *Cymru'n Ennill* pennwyd nifer o dargedau i'w cyflawni erbyn 2010 ac roedd y ddogfen yn cadarnhau y byddai'r rhain yn cael eu mesur yn erbyn gwaelodlin 2001. Mae'r gwaelodlinau i gyd wedi'u sefydlu ac fe'u dangosir isod. Byddwn yn dangos perfformiad o'i gymharu â'r targedau hyn yn yr Adroddiad Blynnyddol. Bydd yr Adroddiad Blynnyddol hefyd yn cynnwys y wybodaeth ddiweddaraf ar newidiadau i'r Cynnyrch Mewnwladol Crynswth (a ddefnyddir gan *Cymru'n Ennill* i fesur llwyddiant yn gyffredinol), gan bwysleisio ar yr un pryd nad oes modd pennu amserlen gwbl bendant ar gyfer cyflawni mesurau ar y lefel hon.

8. Mae gwaith ar y gweill hefyd i ddatblygu mesurau ategol o ran perfformiad economaidd a lles; eto, adroddir ar hyn yn yr Adroddiad Blynnyddol.

Ymchwil

9. Un o'r addewidion pwysig yn *Cymru'n Ennill* yw gwella'n dealltwriaeth o faterion economaidd sy'n effeithio ar Gymru. Sefydlodd Llywodraeth Cynulliad Cymru Banel Ymgynghori ar Ymchwil Economaidd (ERAP) ym

mis Ebrill 2002. Ei rôl yw:

- Cyngori Llywodraeth y Cynulliad ar raglen ymchwil, monitro a gwerthuso economaidd.
- Cyngori Llywodraeth y Cynulliad a Phwyllgorau priodol y Cynulliad ar ganlyniadau'r rhaglen hon.
- Hybu cydweithrediad ym maes ymchwil economaidd a rhannu deallusrwydd rhwng Llywodraeth y Cynulliad, ei phrif asiantaethau a phartneriaid eraill.
- Cyngori ar ledaenu canfyddiadau gwaith ymchwil; a
- Cyngori ar y ffordd orau o ddatblygu gallu ac arbenigedd sefydliadau yng Nghymru i gyfrannu i'r agenda ymchwil hon.

10. Mae'r Panel wedi argymhell rhaglen ymchwil ar gyfer 2002-03 ac mae hon bellach ar y gweill; dangosir y prif astudiaethau isod. Bydd yn ystyried blaenoriaethau ar gyfer rhaglen dreigl dair blynedd o waith ymchwil yn yr hydref.

Prif Lwyddiannau

11. Mae prif lwyddiannau 'Cymru'n Ennill' mewn perthynas â phob blaenoriaeth wedi'u rhestru isod. Ceir y manylion llawn yn Atodiad 1.

Hybu Arloesedd

- Mae cynllun datblygu strategol wedi'i ddatblygu ar gyfer y rhwydwaith o Ganolfannau Technium ledled Cymru. Mae rheolwr cenedlaethol y WDA wedi'i benodi ar gyfer y Canolfannau Technium.
- Mae'r Technium OpTIC gwerth £14.7m wedi'i lansio yn Llanelwy.
 - Mae grant o £4.44m wedi'i gymeradwyo dan Amcan 1 tuag at y swm o £10.6m ar gyfer Prifysgol Cymru, Abertawe, i greu Technium Digidol. Mae'r gwaith adeiladu yn mynd rhagddo.

- Mae'r gwaith o adeiladu'r uned Technium II yn Abertawe wedi cychwyn.
- Mae'r gwaith o adeiladu'r Biotechnium yn yr Ardd Fotaneg Genedlaethol, Llanarthne, ger Caerfyrddin, wedi dod i ben.
- Mae'r cynigion ar gyfer y Technium Meddalwedd ym Mharc Menai, a Chanolfannau Technium Rhanbarthol yn Aberystwyth a'r Cymoedd yn dod yn eu blaen yn dda.
- Mae'r gwaith o gynllunio'r Ganolfan Masnacheiddio Technoleg wedi'i gwblhau, ac mae cynllun busnes llawn wedi'i ddraftio. Caiff staff arwain eu penodi ym mis Mawrth 2003, a bydd gwaith yn dechrau o hynny ymlaen.
- Cytunwyd ar £1.1m o arian Amcan 1 i ddatblygu'r Ganolfan Arloesedd Busnes yng Nglynebwyl. Bydd y cyfleuster yn creu 220 o swyddi ac yn ysgogi twf cwmniau eraill yn ei sgil.
- Mae UWIC wedi ennill y contract ar gyfer y Gwasanaeth Ymgynghorol Gweithgynhyrchu ac mae Prifysgol Caerdydd wedi ennill y contract ar gyfer y Ganolfan Ranbarthol dros Ragoriaeth ym maes Gweithgynhyrchu. Mae'r gwaith o sefydlu a recriwtio yn mynd rhagddo ac mae achlysur lansio ar y cyd wedi'i drefnu ar gyfer Tachwedd 2002.
- Mae'r prosiect gwerth £2.89m ar gyfer Canolfan Technoleg Gwybodaeth a Chyfathrebu'r Cymoedd (VITCC) yn Nhredegard yn mynd rhagddo.
- Bydd Cynllun Gweithredu Arloesedd yn cael ei gyhoeddi i ddibenion ymgynghori ym mis Tachwedd 2002, gan ddwyn ynghyd yr elfennau hyn a'r strwythur cliriach o ran gwaith ac arian i gefnogi arloesedd, a gweithgareddau eraill i hybu syniadau arloesol ym myd busnes.
- Trosglwyddwyd SMART i'r WDA ar 1 Ebrill 2002; mae'r gwaith gwerthuso yn mynd rhagddo, i'w gwblhau erbyn Mawrth 2003.
- Mae'r Gronfa Arloesi Capasiti Ymchwil (gwerth £8.7m) wedi'i lansio a'r Gronfa Buddsoddiadau Ymchwil Wyddonol wedi'i chryfhau (£35.5m).
- SUPERMAN, prosiect Amcan 1, grant o £5.3m i Brifysgol Cymru, Caerdydd, i greu diwylliant o arloesedd technolegol o fewn cwmniâu i'w helpu i gystadlu ar lefel fyd-eang.
- Mae'r WDA wedi helpu bron i 2,000 o fusnesau drwy ei Raglenni Arloesi a Thechnoleg.

Hybu Entreprenuriaeth

- Yn dilyn yr achlysur lansio cychwynnol yn 2000, mae'r Cynllun Gweithredu Entreprenuriaeth ar waith yn llawn erbyn hyn. Mae £15.32m o arian Amcan 1 wedi'i ymrwymo.
- Lansiwyd y Grant Buddsoddi gan y Cynulliad yn swyddogol yn Ebrill 2002. Cofrestrodd 880 ddiddordeb; daeth 250 cais llawn i law; a gwnaed 107 o gynigion (£3.5 m wedi'i ymrwymo). Disgwylir i'r prosiectau hyn ddenu buddsoddiad o dros £16m o'r sector preifat a chreu dros 200 o swyddi.

- Mae'r rhaglen *Potentia* wedi cynorthwyo 1,000 o bobl mewn ardaloedd difreintiedig ac mae 250 o'r rheini wedi mynd i mewn i fyd busnes.
- Mae'r Prosiect Dynamo 3 blynedd, gwerth £10m, bellach wedi'i lansio yn ysgolion Cymru.
- Mae 70 o entrepreneuriaid wedi'u penodi i hybu entrepreneuriaeth mewn ysgolion. Llwyddodd tim o entrepreneuriaid o Ysgol Tregib, Sir Gaerfyrddin i ennill gwobr y DU am Fenter Busnes yr Ifanc ym mis Gorffennaf 2002 a hefyd y drydedd wobr yn y rowndiau terfynol Ewropeaidd.
- Rhoddyd 188 o ysgoloriaethau entrepreneuriaeth i ddarparu cymorth ariannol i raddedigion newydd sy'n sefydlu cwmnïau.
- Lansiwyd ymgyrch hysbysebu dros yr haf i godi ymwybyddiaeth am yr amrywiaeth o gyfleoedd sydd ar gael i bobl ar draws Cymru i ddechrau eu busnes eu hunain.
- Cronfa Ecsploracio Gwybodaeth gwerth £10m ar gyfer 2002-03 i gefnogi 78 o brosiectau cydweithredol rhwng cwmnïau a sefydliadau. £4.5m o gymorth Amcan 1 tuag at y prosiect hwn.
- Cafwyd arian gan yr Adran Iechyd tuag ar 'barc geneteg rhithwir' yng Nghymru. Mae staff yn cael eu reciriwtio ar hyn o bryd.
- Llwyddwyd i sicrhau £45m o arian Amcan 1 tuag at Gyllid Cymru.

Gwneud Cymru yn Wlad sy'n Dysgu

- Mae'r gwaith o weithredu'r Cynllun Gweithredu Sgiliau a Chyflogaeth yn mynd rhagddo. Ymhlieth y llwyddiannau cynnar mae:
 - Ail Arolwg Sgiliau Dyfodol Cymru wedi'i gomisiynu i adolygu anghenion sgiliau unigolion a chyflogwyr yng Nghymru yn y dyfodol.
 - 8 Cyngor Sgiliau Sector wedi'u trwyddedu neu'n cael eu datblygu. Mae Grwp Cyflogwyr Newydd wedi'i sefydlu i gynghori Partneriaeth Sgiliau Dyfodol Cymru a Chronfa Datblygu Sgiliau wedi'i datblygu i fynd i'r afael â'r diffyg mewn sgiliau ledled Cymru.
 - Ymgymherwyd ag ymgyrch Strategaeth Sgiliau Sylfaenol, ac effaith fawr wedi'i chofnodi. Cymerodd dros 12,000 o oedolion a phlant ran mewn rhaglenni llythrennedd a rhifedd teuluol yn ystod 2001-02 a hyfforddwyd 1000 o athrawon mewn cwricwla llythrennedd a rhifedd newydd.
 - Ysgogwyd gwaith gan Dasglu'r Fargen Newydd yng Nghymru i wella'r Fargen Newydd, gan gynnwys cyswllt cryfach â sectorau.
 - Lansiwyd y prosiect Gweithwyr sy'n Dysgu yn Llanelli, er mwyn asesu effaith darparu dysgu am ddim i weithwyr cyflogedig.
 - Yn Ebrill 2002, cyhoeddwyd cynlluniau peilot y Fagloriaeth Gymreig mewn 19 canolfan.
 - Gwnaed nifer o welliannau i raglenni dysgu, gan gynnwys dileu rhwystrau oedran a chyflwynwyd Cyfrifon Dysgu Cwmni.

- Ehangu Cronfa Dysgu Undeb Cymru (WULF).
- Ym Mawrth 2002, lansiwyd strategaeth y Cynulliad ar gyfer Addysg Uwch 'Cyrhaedd yn Uwch'.

Hyrwyddo Technolegau Gwybodaeth a Chyfathrebu

- Lansiwyd Band Eang Cymru, gwerth £100m, ym mis Gorffennaf 2002 i ddod â'r dechnoleg ddiweddaraf i 310,000 o gartrefi ychwanegol a 67,000 o fusnesau ychwanegol.
- Mae'r cynlluniau Cymhorthdal Lloeren DSL a 'Try Before You Buy' ar waith.
- Mae'r cam peilot 'Cyfle Cymru' a ariannwyd gan Amcan 1 wedi dod i ben a lansiwyd y gwasanaeth porth allweddol ym mis Ebrill 2002. Mae 14 partner yn awr yn cyflwyno adolygiadau e-fasnach i dros 1,200 o fentrau bach a chanolig.
- Cyhoeddwyd £0.75m o arian gan y Cynulliad ar gyfer y Rhwydwaith Canolfan Cefnogi TGCh Cymru Gyfan dros y tair blynedd o 2002. Mae'r gwaith o reoli'r rhwydwaith yn cael ei adolygu yng ngoleuni Adolygiad Cymorth Busnes y WDA.
- Mae @TEB, Canolfan achredu *Technology Means Business* (TMB) yng Nghymru wedi llwyddo i gael arian Amcan Un. Mae hon yn darparu ffioedd achredu â chymhorthdal ar gyfer cynghorwyr yn yr ardaloedd Amcan Un ac mae'n ariannu datblygiad rhaglen hyfforddi TMB arlein gyda chymorth tiwtoriaid. Mae @TEB yn parhau i hyrwyddo manteision achredu TGCh ac mae'n denu cynghorwyr drwy Gymru gyfan.
- Ymgeisiodd dros 200 o fentrau bach a chanolig am Wobrau E-fasnach arlein am fusnes y DU. Roedd safon sawl cais yn uchel, sy'n dangos pa mor barod yw mentrau bach a chanolig yng Nghymru i ddefnyddio TGCh er mwyn gwneud eu busnes yn fwy effeithlon.
- Mae arlein ar gyfer busnes y DU yn cynorthwyo Siambwr Fasnach Caerdydd i redeg Clwb e-Funes. Dyma un o'r clwbiau mwyaf llwyddiannus ac mae'n denu dros 80 o fentrau bach a chanolig, sy'n dangos bod busnesau bach a chanolig o'r farn bod defnyddio TGCh yn effeithiol yn eu busnesau yn bwysig iawn.
- Cynorthwyodd 550 o gwmniâu ar raglenni cymorth e-fusnes y WDA.

- Cyhoeddwyd y cynllun gweithredu drafft Busnes Cynaliadwy Cymru er mwyn ymgynghori arno yn gynnar ym mis Hydref 2002.
- Lansiwyd pecyn grant newydd i annog perchnogion coetir cynhenid i ddod â'u coetir dan reolaeth.
- Gweithio ar gompact gyda CLILC i hybu cydweithrediad ar bolisiau Datblygu Cynaliadwy, i'w lansio.
- Lansiwyd y Cynllun Adfywio i gysylltu twristiaeth a mwynhad o gefn gwlad ym mis Ebrill 2002.
