Cwestiynau i'r Gweinidog dros Iechyd a Gwasanaethau Cymdeithasol Questions to the Minister for Health and Social Services

Comisiwn Gwasanaethau Iechyd Arbenigol ar gyfer Cymru (Corff i Ddisodli) Specialised Health Services Commission for Wales (Replacement Body)

Q1 Kirsty Williams: Will the Minister make a statement on the proposed structure for the replacement body for the Specialised Health Services Commission for Wales? (OAQ18325)

The Minister for Health and Social Services (Jane Hutt): As part of the structural reforms of NHS Wales, an arm's-length commissioning agency will be established to undertake specialised health service commissioning. The agency will also provide a commissioning support and advisory service to local health boards and the NHS Wales department. It will be established in April 2003 at the same time as the local health boards. I will present a paper on these proposals in the next meeting of the Health and Social Services Committee.

Kirsty Williams: Will you confirm that this body will be headed by an independent chair appointed under Lord Nolan's principles?

Jane Hutt: I confirm that an independent chair will be appointed.

David Lloyd: A fydd y corff newydd hwn yn comisiynu gwasanaethau ar gyfer awtistiaeth?

Jane Hutt: Fifty categories of service will be commissioned by this new agency. I will give a full report on this to the Health and Social Services Committee, which will inform you about particular areas and services, such as autism.

David Melding: Many organisations in the voluntary sector that deliver services will have to negotiate with up to 44 commissioning authorities—22 social services departments and 22 local health

C1 Kirsty Williams: A wnaiff y Gweinidog ddatganiad ar y strwythur arfaethedig ar gyfer y corff i ddisodli'r Comisiwn Gwasanaethau Iechyd Arbenigol ar gyfer Cymru? (OAQ18325)

Y Gweinidog dros Iechyd a Gwasanaethau Cymdeithasol (Jane Hutt): Fel rhan o'r diwygiadau strwythurol yn GIG Cymru, sefydlir asiantaeth gomisiynu hyd braich i ymgymryd â chomisiynu gwasanaethau iechyd arbenigol. Bydd yr asiantaeth hefyd yn darparu gwasanaeth cymorth comisiynu ac ymgynghorol i'r byrddau iechyd lleol ac i adran GIG Cymru. Fe'i sefydlir yn Ebrill 2003 ar yr un pryd â'r byrddau iechyd lleol. Cyflwynaf bapur ar y cynigion hyn yng nghyfarfod nesaf y Pwyllgor Iechyd a Gwasanaethau Cymdeithasol.

Kirsty Williams: A wnewch gadarnhau mai cadeirydd annibynnol wedi'i benodi yn unol ag egwyddorion yr Arglwydd Nolan a fydd yn bennaeth ar y corff hwn?

Jane Hutt: Cadarnhaf y caiff cadeirydd annibynnol ei benodi.

David Lloyd: Will this new body commission services for autism?

Jane Hutt: Comisiynir 50 o gategorïau gwasanaeth gan yr asiantaeth newydd hon. Rhoddaf adroddiad llawn ar hyn i'r Pwyllgor Iechyd a Gwasanaethau Cymdeithasol, a fydd yn eich hysbysu am y meysydd a'r gwasanaethau penodol, fel awtistiaeth.

David Melding: Bydd llawer o gyrrff yn y sector gwirfoddol sy'n darparu gwasanaethau'n gorfol negodi â hyd at 44 o awdurdodau comisiynu—22 adran gwasanaethau cymdeithasol a 22 bwrdd

boards. Would it not be appropriate for this new specialist commission to consider all-Wales services in general, including those provided by voluntary organisations?

Jane Hutt: At present, local services are commissioned locally. Some of these are through the local authority, because there is often a link between health and social care, and some are through the health authority. Those responsibilities will cross through to the new local health boards. We are considering areas where we need to ensure that there is, possibly, a lead commissioning body or a local and national remit of that organisation to take those issues on board.

iechyd lleol. Oni fyddai'n briodol i'r comisiwn arbenigol newydd hwn ystyried gwasanaethau i Gymru gyfan yn gyffredinol, gan gynnwys y rhai a ddarperir gan gyrff gwirfoddol?

Jane Hutt: Ar hyn o bryd, fe gomisiynir gwasanaethau lleol yn lleol. Ceir rhai ohonynt drwy'r awdurdod lleol, gan fod cyswllt yn aml rhwng iechyd a gofal cymdeithasol, a cheir rhai drwy'r awdurdod iechyd. Trosglwyddir y cyfrifoldebau hynny i'r byrddau iechyd lleol newydd. Yr ydym yn ystyried meysydd lle y mae'n bosibl y bydd yn rhaid inni sicrhau bod corff comisiynu arweiniol neu gylch gwaith lleol a chenedlaethol i'r corff hwnnw i ystyried y materion hynny.

Meddygon Teulu General Practitioners

Q2 Janice Gregory: What support is being provided for the recruitment and retention of general practitioners in Wales? (OAQ18278)

Jane Hutt: I have allocated an additional £1 million to initiatives to recruit GPs to Wales, and to retain them beyond the age of 55. These initiatives include £5,000 to attract newly qualified GPs to take up employment in Wales; £1,000 a year to GPs aged 55 to 64 to encourage them to continue practising in primary care, and a range of discretionary initiatives that health authorities can use to aid GP recruitment.

C2 Janice Gregory: Pa gefnogaeth sy'n cael ei darparu ar gyfer cyflogi a chadw meddygon teulu yng Nghymru? (OAQ18278)

Jane Hutt: Yr wyf wedi dyrannu £1 filiwn ychwanegol i fentrau i recriwtio meddygon teulu yng Nghymru, ac i'w cadw ar ôl iddynt gyrraedd 55 oed. Mae'r mentrau hyn yn cynnwys £5,000 i ddenu meddygon teulu sydd newydd gymhwys i weithio yng Nghymru; £1,000 y flwyddyn i feddygon teulu rhwng 55 a 64 oed i'w hannog i ddal i ymarfer mewn gofal sylfaenol, ac amryw o fentrau dewisol y gall awdurdodau iechyd eu defnyddio i'w helpu i recriwtio meddygon teulu.

Janice Gregory: I am sure that you are aware that in my constituency, and others, as well as the problem of recruiting and retaining GPs there is also a problem in attracting locum GPs, especially to Valleys communities. This means that in some cases patients wait weeks to see a GP. What actions can we take to address this severe problem?

Janice Gregory: Yr wyf yn sicr eich bod yn ymwybodol bod problem ychwanegol yn fy etholaeth i, ac mewn rhai eraill, yn ogystal â'r broblem o recriwtio a chadw meddygon teulu, sef denu dirprwy feddygon teulu, yn enwedig i gymunedau'r Cymoedd. Golyga hynny fod cleifion mewn rhai achosion yn aros wythnosau i weld meddyg teulu. Pa gamau y gallwn eu cymryd i ymdrin â'r broblem ddifrifol hon?

Jane Hutt: This is a serious problem. That is why those attractive recruitment and retention initiatives are so important. It will be the local health boards' responsibility to ensure that we have adequate service

Jane Hutt: Mae hon yn broblem ddifrifol. Dyna pam y mae'r mentrau recriwtio a chadw deniadol hynny mor bwysig. Cyfrifoldeb y byrddau iechyd lleol fydd sicrhau bod gennym staff gwasanaethu

personnel in terms of GPs for each community and each area. I am pleased that there has been extra recruitment in your community, which will address some of the issues. We must also consider GP contracts—which will boost the morale of GPs, and the whole primary care team—which we must take forward to address these shortages and pressures.

Jonathan Morgan: The World Health Organisation rates Britain among the top three countries in terms of its level of primary health care and level of commitment from the workforce. Do you agree that the Assembly needs to provide support for at least another 100 GPs in Wales by 2004, and for even more ambitious targets by 2007?

Jane Hutt: We must recruit more GPs. Our workforce targets, which we will discuss in a few weeks in the Health and Social Services Committee, will address these issues. The new GP contract will provide a good, basic working environment and fair remuneration, which will attract and retain GPs. We also have initiatives to recruit from overseas if necessary. There will be a wide range of options for GPs and their practices, which we will take forward with the GP contract and our recruitment and retention initiative.

Jocelyn Davies: In the Valleys, single GP practices are commonplace and, as we have just heard, it may take weeks to get an appointment. Given that GPs are so overworked, should we also expect them to deliver preventative measures and routine health checks, which form a vital part of the strategy to improve health in Wales generally?

Jane Hutt: That goes back to our primary care strategy. We are about to launch the action plan for that. It is about the whole primary care team. The role of nurses, as well as GPs, is critical in terms of health prevention and the scrutiny that we need to ensure for these services, particularly in our poorest communities where there is chronic

A ydych yn cytuno bod angen i'r Cynulliad ddarparu cymorth ar gyfer o leiaf 100 o feddygon teulu ychwanegol yng Nghymru erbyn 2004, ac ar gyfer targedau mwy uchelgeisiol byth erbyn 2007?

Jane Hutt: Rhaid inni recriwtio rhagor o feddygon teulu. Bydd ein targedau gweithlu, a drafodwn ymhenech ychydig wythnosau yn y Pwyllgor Iechyd a Gwasanaethau Cymdeithasol, yn rhoi sylw i'r materion hyn. Bydd y contract newydd i feddygon teulu'n darparu amgylchedd gweithio sylfaenol da a thâl teg, a fydd yn denu ac yn cadw meddygon teulu. Mae gennym fentrau hefyd i recriwtio o dramor os oes angen. Bydd amrywiaeth eang o ddewisiadau i feddygon teulu a'u practisiau, y byddwn yn eu datblygu gyda'r contract meddygon teulu a'n menter recriwtio a chadw.

Jocelyn Davies: Yn y Cymoedd, mae practisiau ag un meddyg teulu yn gyffredin ac, fel yr ydym newydd ei glywed, fe all gymryd wythnosau i gael apwyntiad. O wybod bod gan feddygon teulu ormod o waith, a yw'n iawn inni hefyd ddisgwyl iddynt weithredu mesurau ataliol a gwneud archwiliadau iechyd rheolaidd, sy'n rhan annatod o'r strategaeth i wella iechyd yng Nghymru'n gyffredinol?

Jane Hutt: Mae hynny'n gysylltiedig â'n strategaeth gofal sylfaenol. Yr ydym ar fin lansio'r cynllun gweithredu ar ei chyfer. Mae'n ymwneud â'r holl dîm gofal iechyd sylfaenol. Mae rôl nyrsys, yn ogystal â meddygon teulu, yn hollbwysig o ran atal iechyd gwael a'r archwilio y mae'n rhaid inni ei sicrhau ar gyfer y gwasanaethau hyn, yn

Ymwybyddiaeth o Clamydia Awareness of Chlamydia

Q3 Janice Gregory: What actions is the Minister taking to raise awareness of chlamydia? (OAQ18277)

Jane Hutt: Last December the Assembly launched a campaign to raise public awareness about sexually transmitted infections. The rising incidence of chlamydia and its possible effects on health, including infertility, is a major theme of the campaign. Evaluation of the campaign is ongoing, but early indications show that it has been well received by young people.

Janice Gregory: I congratulate you on the awareness campaign launched last December. A constituent asked me to raise this issue, as her 24-year-old daughter is now sterile because of this awful and silent disease, which, in most cases, is not recognised until it is too late. Will there be an ongoing campaign to raise awareness of this terrible disease, and will you provide the results of any evaluation of the campaign?

Jane Hutt: That is the tragic outcome of diseases such as chlamydia. Raising awareness of chlamydia is a priority in our strategic framework to promote sexual health, and that is why we launched a campaign to target 16 to 30-year-olds. We are considering ways of providing more regular screening and opportunistic testing of young people and those in older age groups to detect chlamydia, so that it can be treated and such terrible outcomes averted. I am committed to taking this forward. We have started this campaign and we are determined to see it through in order to treat and prevent chlamydia in Wales.

David Davies: I was unaware of the cause and effects of this disease until the beginning

C3 Janice Gregory: Pa gamau y mae'r Gweinidog yn eu cymryd i godi ymwybyddiaeth o clamydia? (OAQ18277)

Jane Hutt: Fis Rhagfyr diwethaf, lansiodd y Cynulliad ymgyrch i hybu ymwybyddiaeth y cyhoedd o heintiadau a drosglwyddir yn rhywiol. Mae amlder cynyddol clamydia a'i effeithiau posibl ar iechyd, gan gynnwys anffrwythlondeb, yn brif thema yn yr ymgyrch. Mae'r gwerthuso ar yr ymgyrch yn mynd rhagddo, ond yr arwyddion cynnar yw ei bod wedi cael derbyn nad da gan bobl ifanc.

Janice Gregory: Fe'ch llonyfarchaf ar yr ymgyrch ymwybyddiaeth a lansiwyd fis Rhagfyr diwethaf. Gofynnodd un o'm hetholwyr imi godi'r mater hwn, gan fod ei merch 24 mlwydd oed yn anffrwythlon yn awr oherwydd y clefyd cudd ac ofnadwy hwn nas darganfyddir, yn y rhan fwyaf o achosion, neu ei bod yn rhy hwyr. A fydd ymgyrch barhaus i hybu ymwybyddiaeth o'r clefyd ofnadwy hwn, ac a wnewch ddarparu canlyniadau unrhyw werthusiad o'r ymgyrch?

Jane Hutt: Dyna ganlyniad trychinebus clefydau fel clamydia. Mae hybu ymwybyddiaeth o clamydia yn flaenoriaeth yn ein fframwaith strategol i hyrwyddo iechyd rhywiol, a dyna pam y gwnaethom lansio ymgyrch i dargedu pobl ifanc 16 i 30 mlwydd oed. Yr ydym yn ystyried dulliau o ddarparu sgrinio mwy rheolaidd a phrofi manteisgar ar gyfer pobl ifanc a rhai mewn grwpiau oedran hŷn i ddarganfod clamydia, fel y gellir ei drin ac osgoi canlyniadau mor ofnadwy. Yr wyf wedi ymrwymo i fwrw ymlaen â hyn. Cychwynnasom yr ymgyrch hon ac yr ydym yn benderfynol o'i dilyn i'r pen er mwyn trin ac atal clamydia yng Nghymru.

David Davies: Nid oeddwn yn ymwybodol o achos ac effeithiau'r clefyd hwn tan

Statistics show that many people are likely to be affected by chlamydia—almost one in three people in some parts of the United States of America—and that it is fairly cheap and easy to treat if it is caught early enough. We may not be representative but, given the fact that so few people are aware of chlamydia, do you agree that we should redouble our efforts to educate the public about this worrying disease?

Jane Hutt: I am grateful to Janice Gregory for bringing this to my attention. We are focusing on this in the Assembly. Chlamydia is an invisible disease for many, as Janice said, and we must draw more public attention to it. The number of diagnosed cases of chlamydia in Wales has doubled over the past five years. I welcome the Assembly's support for this campaign. The campaign must focus on prevention, as well as treatment. Our condom campaign is key to preventing the spread of sexually transmitted diseases, including chlamydia. We must focus on screening to identify the disease and providing treatment to cure it. I am grateful for your interest in taking this forward.

Jane Hutt: Yr wyf yn ddiolchgar i Janice Gregory am ddod â hyn i'm sylw. Yr ydym yn canolbwytio ar hyn yn y Cynulliad. Mae clamydia'n glefyd anweledig i lawer, fel y dywedodd Janice, a rhaid inni dynnu mwy o sylw ato ymysg y cyhoedd. Mae nifer yr achosion o clamydia a gafodd eu canfod yng Nghymru wedi dyblu dros y pum mlynedd diwethaf. Croesawaf gefnogaeth y Cynulliad i'r ymgyrch hon. Rhaid i'r ymgyrch ganolbwytio ar atal, yn ogystal â thrin. Mae ein hymgyrch condomau'n hollbwysig er mwyn atal clefydau a drosglwyddir yn rhywiol, gan gynnwys clamydia, rhag lledaenu. Rhaid inni ganolbwytio ar sgrinio er mwyn canfod y clefyd a darparu triniaeth i'w wella. Yr wyf yn ddiolchgar am eich diddordeb wrth fwrw ymlaen â hyn.

Lorraine Barrett: You have partly answered my question. What strategy is available to help young people withstand the pressure to become sexually active and to reinforce the message of the importance of protected sex?

Lorraine Barrett: Yr ydych wedi ateb fy nghwestiwn yn rhannol. Pa strategaeth sydd ar gael i helpu pobl ifanc i wrthsefyll y pwysau i ddod yn rhywiol weithredol ac i ategu'r neges am bwysigrwydd rhyw diogel?

Jane Hutt: Those are the key messages of our campaign for young people, especially the 16 to 30-year-old target group. The campaign has generated much uptake and interest, and has resulted in pressure on the genito-urinary medicine service in Wales, by way of additional consultant appointments. We must link our work on health promotion among young people with the work being done on sex education in schools, in co-operation with my colleague, Jane Davidson. The Assembly must take this seriously.

Jane Hutt: Dyna negeseuon allweddol ein hymgyrch i bobl ifanc, yn enwedig y grŵp targed 16 i 30 mlwydd oed. Mae'r ymgyrch wedi ennyn ymateb a diddordeb mawr, ac mae hynny wedi arwain at bwysau ar y gwasanaeth cenhedlol-droethol yng Nghymru, ar ffurf apwyntiadau ychwanegol ag ymgynghorwyr. Rhaid inni gysylltu ein gwaith ar hybu iechyd ymysg pobl ifanc â'r gwaith a wneir ar addysg rhyw mewn ysgolion, mewn cydweithrediad â'm cyd-Weinidog, Jane Davidson. Rhaid i'r Cynulliad gymryd hyn o ddifrif.

Targedau Newydd yn Is-adran y Gweinidog New Targets within the Minister's Division

Q4 Alun Cairns: Will the Minister make a statement on new targets set within her division? (OAQ18350)

Jane Hutt: Following the service and financial framework planning round, health authorities have been informed that targets have been set for cardiac surgery, angiography, orthopaedics, cancer and waiting times in general. Another key service priority is the need to sustain an adequate accident and emergency response in line with the emergency pressures planning guidance.

Alun Cairns: The Society of British Neurological Surgeons states that children should have access to neurological intervention within two hours of need. Does the Minister believe that this should be a target within her division and, if so, does she accept that the recent Specialised Health Services Commission for Wales report on children's services is fundamentally flawed, as children from west Wales will not have access to neurological intervention within two hours of need?

Jane Hutt: There is consultation on the SHSCW report on the specialist health needs of children in Wales. I will make an announcement in Committee in July about the immediate funding required to support the important specialist services for children. The consultation period between July and September will enable Members to voice their opinions on the SHSCW report.

The Leader of the Opposition (Ieuan Wyn Jones): I note that you refer to targets to be achieved rather than commitments. I remind you of the manifesto on which you fought the 1999 Assembly election. It contained a commitment that no-one would wait more than six months for out-patient treatment or more than 18 months for in-patient treatment.

C4 Alun Cairns: A wnaiff y Gweinidog ddatganiad ar y targedau newydd a osodwyd yn ei his-adran? (OAQ18350)

Jane Hutt: Yn dilyn cylch cynllunio y fframwaith gwasanaethau ac ariannol, hysbyswyd yr awdurdodau iechyd bod targedau wedi'u gosod ar gyfer llawfeddygaeth y galon, angiograffeg, orthopedeg, canser ac amseroedd aros yn gyffredinol. Blaenoriaeth gwasanaeth allweddol arall yw'r angen i gynnal ymateb digonol i ddamweiniau ac achosion brys yn unol â'r canllawiau cynllunio ar bwysau argyfwng.

Alun Cairns: Mae Cymdeithas Llawfeddygon Niwrolegol Prydain yn datgan y dylai plant allu derbyn ymyriad niwrolegol o fewn dwy awr pan fo angen. A yw'r Gweinidog yn credu y dylai hynny fod yn darged yn ei his-adran ac, os felly, a yw'n derbyn bod diffyg sylfaenol yn adroddiad diweddar y Comisiwn Gwasanaethau Iechyd Arbenigol ar gyfer Cymru ar wasanaethau plant, gan na fydd plant o orllewin Cymru'n gallu derbyn ymyriad niwrolegol o fewn dwy awr pan fo angen?

Jane Hutt: Mae ymgynghori ar adroddiad y Comisiwn Gwasanaethau Iechyd Arbenigol ar gyfer Cymru ar anghenion iechyd arbenigol plant yng Nghymru. Byddaf yn gwneud cyhoeddiad yn y Pwyllgor yng Ngorffennaf am yr arian sydd ei angen ar unwaith i gynnal gwasanaethau arbenigol pwysig i blant. Bydd y cyfnod ymgynghori rhwng Gorffennaf a Medi yn galluogi'r Aelodau i fynegi eu barn am adroddiad y comisiwn.

Arweinydd yr Wrthblaid (Ieuan Wyn Jones): Sylwaf eich bod yn cyfeirio at dargedau i'w cyrraedd yn hytrach nag at ymrwymiadau. Fe'ch atgoffaf am y maniffesto y gwnaethoch ymladd etholiad Cynulliad 1999 ar ei sail. Yr oedd ymrwymiad ynddo na fyddai neb yn disgwyl am fwy na chwe mis am driniaeth claf allanol neu am fwy na 18 mis am driniaeth claf mewnol.

It is unlikely that those targets will be achieved by 2003. What excuse will you offer the Welsh electorate for failing to meet them?

Jane Hutt: I think the Welsh electorate wants to see that the health service is improving and with more resources going to it. An extra £1 billion has already gone to the health service as a result of a Labour Chancellor allocating funds and Assembly backing for the service, and an extra £1.8 billion will come over the next five years. That is what people want to see. They also want to see delivery on the targets that the Assembly has set. We have met the 12-month cardiac target and we are seeing a reduction in our other target objectives.

Mae'n annhebygol y cyrhaeddir y targedau hynny erbyn 2003. Pa esgus a gynigwch i etholwyr Cymru am fethu â'u cyrraedd?

Jane Hutt: Credaf fod etholwyr Cymru am weld y gwasanaeth iechyd yn gwella, ac â rhagor o adnoddau'n mynd iddo. Mae £1 biliwn ychwanegol wedi mynd at y gwasanaeth iechyd eisoes o ganlyniad i ddyrannu cyllid gan y Canghellor Llafur a chefnogaeth y Cynulliad i'r gwasanaeth, a daw £1.8 biliwn ychwanegol dros y pum mlynedd nesaf. Dyna'r hyn y mae pobl am ei weld. Maent hefyd am weld cyflawni'r targedau a osododd y Cynulliad. Jane Hutt: Pembrokeshire and Derwen NHS Trust has developed a strategic outline case, which is currently with the health authority for approval. The strategic outline case should be submitted to the Welsh Assembly Government shortly. When the case is approved, the trust will proceed to develop its outline business case in which a preferred option will be identified and costed. If the preferred option is not suitable for public private partnership or a private finance initiative, the trust will then submit the scheme for capital funding.

Q5 Cynog Dafis: When does the Minister expect to receive an application for funding from Pembrokeshire and Derwen NHS Trust to provide a new community hospital in Tenby? (OAQ18329)

Jane Hutt: Mae Ymddiriedolaeth GIG Sir Benfro a Derwen wedi datblygu achos amlinellol strategol, sydd gyda'r awdurdod iechyd ar hyn o bryd i'w gymeradwyo. Can you confirm that every study thus far has come to the conclusion that a community hospital is needed in Tenby? The present hospital is wholly inadequate. Can you also give an assurance to the Assembly that resources will be available to provide an appropriate

Jane Hutt: There has been extensive public consultation on proposals to modernise community services for adults and older people in Pembrokeshire. There has not been consensus on the provision of services in Tenby, Saundersfoot and Narberth. However, clarity has emerged on what services we need in terms of intermediate care, minor injuries and consultants' out-patient appointments. We are now moving forward and I have asked for a report for early next week on the situation at Tenby, and I will report back to the Assembly as soon as possible.

The Leader of the Welsh Conservatives (Nick Bourne): Further to Cynog's question, the people of Tenby have waited a long time for this hospital and we understood that there was a commitment to fund such a hospital. There is still a delay. The hospital is inadequate but the staff are excellent. However, it is vital that you get behind this and speak to the local trust to ensure that this project is delivered along with the promises made.

Jane Hutt: The trust and the health authority have been responsible for bringing me this outline strategic case and then turning it into a business plan that we can consider in terms of funding needs. I am as anxious as you that we conclude this matter and get moving to meet the people's needs in this area.

Jane Hutt: There are issues throughout Wales and community health councils make their representations to me. I will consider the issue in north Powys. However, we must also note that there were 54,000 emergency calls during January to March of 2002, which was 16 per cent higher than the same period in 2001. There is increased demand and pressure on the ambulance trust. I recently allocated an extra £1 million, which is direct revenue from the Assembly to the ambulance trust, and £3.6 million of direct capital for improving its equipment and vehicles. We are addressing this issue, but I will consider the north Powys situation.

Glyn Davies: There have been several instances of emergency ambulances being delayed unnecessarily in north Powys. The area's community health council has told me that one reason for this is that ambulances are used for other purposes. Ambulances are required to cover a vast area. There are long periods when no emergency services are available. Will you discuss this worrying situation with the area's community health council?

As many as 5,000 people needed emergency treatment last week, which is more than this time last year. We must be realistic. However, you will know that since July 2001, the number of people waiting over four months for cataract surgery has been cut by nearly 60 per cent. Members will know of people who have benefited from that huge increase in the cataract surgery programme in Wales. We must keep to those targets to ensure that we do not see an increase in people waiting for cataract surgery, which can transform their vision and lives. We must also address the issue of pressure on the service.

David Davies: Are you aware that 313 people are waiting for MRI scans in the Gwent Health Authority area and that 135 people are waiting for CT scans? Are you also aware that many of those people have some form of cancer and that the longer it takes for patients to be scanned, the less chance they have of being properly treated for such terrible diseases?

Jane Hutt: Waiting for scans is unacceptable in terms of our timescales. However, as a result of the extra £40 million, which has been invested in the health service for capital renewal, 10 new CT and MRI scanners are being commissioned. I am delighted that I will be visiting Singleton Hospital this week to look at its new CT scanner. Our investment in the health service is resulting in more CT and MRI scanners, which will

stated that waiting times will compare favourably with the best by 2003-04. Will you explain what comparing with the best means in this context, given that the number of patients waiting over six months for cataract surgery has risen by over 100 to 800 in four months. How does that compare to the targets that were set in the plan?

Jane Davidson: Yr ydym yn gwneud llawer iawn i gynorthwyo athrawon mewn ysgolion. Yr ydym wedi sefydlu mentrau i fynd i'r afael ag ymddieithrio, ac ymysg y pwysicaf o'r rhain y mae'r grŵp triwantiaeth, sy'n cyfarfod heddiw ac a fydd yn cyflwyno cynigion i ailsgrifennu cylchlythyr 3/99, sy'n darparu canllawiau ar gynhwysiant cymdeithasol.

Tom Middlehurst: Yr wyf yn sicr eich bod yn cydnabod y rôl ganolog y mae darlithwyr a staff addysg bellach yn ei chwarae wrth gyflawni ein hagenda uchelgeisiol ar ddysgu. A wnewch y cwbl a allwch i sicrhau bod y colegau'n rhoi sylw'n ddi-oed i'r anfodlonrwydd cynyddol yn y sector mewn cysylltiad â'r problemau hirsefydlog sy'n ymwneud â thâl ac amodau?

Jane Davidson: O dan ddeddfwriaeth a basiwyd yn 1992, sefydlwyd colegau'n sefydliadau annibynnol. Lle pob coleg yw negodi tâl â'i aelodau staff. Yr wyf yn deall yn iawn pam yr oedd aelodau staff yn bryderus bod Cymdeithas y Colegau wedi argymhell codiad tâl o 1.5 y cant—llai na chwyddiant—a ninnau'n ffyddiog bod yr arian ychwanegol a ddarparwyd gan y Cynulliad yn darparu ar gyfer 4.1 y cant. Disgwyliaf i golegau Cymru fod yn deg a chyflawn wrth sicrhau eu bod yn cefnogi eu staff dysgu.

Athrawon yn Rhannu Swyddi Job Sharing for Teachers

C5 Eleanor Burnham: A wnaiff y Gweinidog ddatganiad am rannu swyddi yn achos athrawon? (OAQ18315)

Jane Davidson: Employment arrangements are matters for individual schools. Job sharing can be an important element of a school's strategy for securing an appropriate work-life balance for its staff. It can help support social inclusion and equality of opportunity. Job sharing by teachers can have considerable benefits for staff, schools and pupils. Schools can make the best use of skilled and experienced teachers who might not otherwise be able to teach and it provides pupils with a model of alternative ways of working.

Eleanor Burnham: A gytunwch fod rhannu swyddi yn rhywbeth gwerth chweil? Gobeithiaf nad ydych yn cydweld â phobl sydd yn gwrtwynebu hyn ac yn dweud ei fod yn golygu cost ychwanegol.

Jane Davidson: No, I do not. I am a great fan of job sharing. I would like to see more of it in education not least because, in smaller schools, a greater number of teaching staff would help to cover the national curriculum. Job sharing could also reduce the costs of providing cover for absent staff because job sharers could swap days and cover for each other. Absence due to ill health could also be reduced because individuals would be less tired and stressed, and experienced staff could return to work quicker after maternity leave. Job sharing could also provide an alternative to early retirement. Schools would be in a win-win situation if they were to actively consider job sharing.

Owen John Thomas: There must be many teachers who are qualified in subjects for which there is a demand, such as science subjects, modern languages, or teaching through the medium of Welsh, but who are not teaching at the moment, possibly because

Q5 Eleanor Burnham: Will the Minister make a statement regarding job sharing for teachers? (OAQ18315)

Jane Davidson: Mae trefniadau cyflogaeth yn faterion i ysgolion unigol. Fe all rhannu swyddi fod yn elfen bwysig o strategaeth ysgol i sicrhau cydbwysedd priodol rhwng bywyd a gwaith i'w staff. Gall helpu hybu cynhwysiant cymdeithasol a chydreddoldeb cyfle. Mae rhannu swyddi gan athrawon yn gallu dod â chryn fudd i staff, ysgolion a disgyblion. Gall ysgolion wneud y defnydd gorau o athrawon medrus a phrofiadol na fyddent yn gallu dysgu fel arall, o bosibl, ac mae'n cynnig model o ddulliau gweithio eraill i'r disgyblion.

Eleanor Burnham: Do you agree that job sharing is worthwhile? I hope that you do not share the view of those who oppose it and say that it leads to additional costs.

Jane Davidson: Nac ydwyt. Yr wyf yn frwd iawn dros rannu swyddi. Hoffwn weld mwy ohono mewn addysg, yn fwy na dim am y byddai mwy o staff dysgu mewn ysgolion llai o gymorth i gwmpasu'r cwricwlwm cenedlaethol. Byddai rhannu swyddi'n fod hefyd i leihau costau dirprwyo dros staff absennol gan y gallai y rhai sy'n rhannu swyddi gyfnewid diwrnodiau a dirprwyo dros ei gilydd. Gellid lleihau absenoldeb oherwydd iechyd gwael gan y byddai unigolion yn llai blinedig ac o dan lai o bwysau, a gallai staff profiadol ddychwelyd i weithio'n gynt ar ôl seibiant mamolaeth. Gallai rhannu swyddi fod yn ddewis yn lle ymddeol yn gynnar. Byddai ysgolion yn sicr o fod ar eu hennill pe byddent yn rhoi ystyriaeth weithredol i rannu swyddi.

Owen John Thomas: Rhaid bod llawer o athrawon sydd â chymhwyster mewn pynciau y mae galw amdanyst, fel pynciau gwyddoniaeth, ieithoedd modern, neu ddysgu drwy gyfrwng y Gymraeg, nad ydynt yn dysgu ar hyn o bryd, am fod ganddynt blant

they have young children. What are you doing to encourage them back into teaching?

Jane Davidson: It is a myth that there are great teacher shortages in Wales. We have demonstrated time and again that such teacher shortages do not exist. In some parts of Wales, it is difficult to get a job if you are a newly qualified teacher. However, in other parts there are still shortages, certainly in particular subject areas. We are working closely with the General Teaching Council for Wales on those areas. We want to encourage those teachers who have registered with GTCW as teachers to consider returning to the profession. In that context, job sharing is an opportunity that teachers should take up and discuss with local education authorities.

David Melding: Is the Minister aware that job sharing in the education sector in general is important? In specialist schools, it is often difficult to recruit expert assistants and therapists because they cannot share jobs effectively at the moment.

Jane Davidson: In terms of work-life balance and individuals' jobs, we must ensure that, wherever possible, school governing bodies and local education authorities consider job sharing. On therapists, there is a cross-over between the health and education services. You will know, David, from Health and Social Services Committee meetings, that Jane Hutt and I are working closely on this issue and will publish a report in September on proposals to increase the number of therapists in Wales. A key recommendation in that report is likely to be to examine such ways of working.

Jane Davidson: O ran y cydbwysedd rhwng bywyd a gwaith a swyddi unigolion, rhaid inni sicrhau, lle bynnag y bo modd, fod cyrff llywodraethu ysgolion ac awdurdodau addysg lleol yn ystyried rhannu swyddi. Cyllido Ysgolion ym Mhowys School Funding in Powys

Q6 Nick Bourne: Will the Minister make a statement on the levels of school funding in Powys? (OAQ18308)

C6 Nick Bourne: A wnaiff y Gweinidog ddatganiad am lefelau cyllido ysgolion ym Mhowys? (OAQ18308)

Jane Davidson: Preliminary information indicates that the authority has increased its overall education budget for 2002-03 by 6.4 per cent. The authority benefits from a £975,021 special grant for junior class sizes and key stage 3, a £163,443 special grant for rural and small schools, and will benefit from its share of the £18.7 million special grant that I announced on 31 May.

Nick Bourne: On small schools—which I believe are defined as schools with less than 60 children for these purposes—you may not be aware that two such schools in Libanus and Trecastle in Powys are threatened with closure. I attended a meeting yesterday in Trecastle. The standard of educational performance at the school there is excellent. Will you reiterate your schools policy, which states that a school should not close if its educational standards are high and the curriculum is being delivered excellently?

Jane Davidson: School organisation policy is a matter for the local authority. We have agreed our strategy on small and rural schools; it is a public document. All local authorities will be required to take account of that in making their decisions.

Mick Bates: We all welcome the extra £18.7 million. We would also like to know from where it came, but that is another issue. Do you agree that the annual budget causes unnecessary anxiety throughout Wales and that a longer budgetary cycle of, say, three years, would be a massive improvement?

Jane Davidson: Good practice already exists, whereby some authorities provide schools with indicative budgets for up to three years ahead. I want that to become the norm. The Education Bill currently before Parliament will, when enacted, require local authorities to set up local fora to discuss budgetary issues with schools. Such structured dialogue is the right way to address schools' need to plan ahead and will also ensure that we receive the same evidence from all 22 local authorities in Wales for consequent Assembly decisions.

Jane Davidson: Mae'r wybodaeth ragarweiniol yn dangos bod yr awdurdod wedi cynyddu ei gyllideb addysg gyffredinol am 2002-03 o 6.4 y cant. Nick Bourne: Ynghylch ysgolion bach—y credaf mai'r diffiniad ohonynt i'r dibenion hyn yw ysgolion â llai na 60 o blant—mae'n bosibl na wyddoch fod bygythiad i gau dwy ysgol o'r fath yn Libanus a Threcastell ym Mhowys. Bûm yn bresennol mewn cyfarfod ddoe yn Nhrecastell. Mae safon y perfformiad addysgol yn yr ysgol yno'n rhagorol. A wnewch ailddatgan eich polisi ysgolion, sy'n datgan na ddylai ysgol gau os yw ei safonau addysgol yn uchel a'r cwricwlwm yn cael ei ddarparu'n rhagorol?

Jane Davidson: Mae polisi ar drefniadaeth ysgolion yn fater i'r awdurdod lleol. Yr ydym wedi cytuno ar ein strategaeth ar ysgolion bach a gwledig; mae'n ddogfen gyhoeddus. Bydd yn ofynnol i'r holl awdurdodau lleol ystyried hynny wrth wneud eu penderfyniadau.

Mick Bates: Yr ydym oll yn croesawu'r £18.7 miliwn ychwanegol. Hoffem wybod hefyd o ble y daeth, ond mater arall yw hynny. A ydych yn cytuno bod y gyllideb flynyddol yn peri gofid diangen ledled Cymru ac y byddai cylch cyllidebol hwy o dair blynedd, dyweder, yn welliant aruthrol?

Jane Davidson: Mae arfer da'n bodoli eisoes, lle y mae rhai awdurdodau'n darparu cyllidebau dynodol i ysgolion am hyd at dair blynedd i'r dyfodol. Yr wyf am i hynny ddod yn norm. Pan gaiff y Mesur Addysg sydd gerbron y Senedd ar hyn o bryd ei droi'n ddeddf, bydd yn ofynnol i'r awdurdodau lleol sefydlu fforymau lleol i drafod materion cyllidebol gyda'r ysgolion. Deialog strwythur dig o'r fath yw'r dull gorau o ymdrin ag angen ysgolion i gynllunio at y dyfodol a bydd hefyd yn sicrhau ein bod yn derbyn yr un dystiolaeth gan bob un o'r 22

awdurdod lleol yng Nghymru ar gyfer penderfyniadau dilynol gan y Cynulliad.

Cynog Dafis: A yw'r Gweinidog yn cydymdeimlo ag athrawon a rhieni plant Ysgol Gynradd Gymunedol Llanandras a ddaeth i'r Cynulliad ddoe i wrthdystio dros yr hyn a ddigwyddodd yn yr ysgol honno? Ni fyddant yn gyfarwydd â'r ffigurau a ddatganodd y Gweinidog heddiw, oherwydd ar ddechrau'r flwyddyn ariannol bresennol, yr oedd yr ysgol yn wynebu toriad o 1 y cant yn ei chyllid a bu'n rhaid diswyddo staff. Yr oedd hynny cyn i'r ysgol gael gwybod ei bod yn derbyn arian ychwanegol ar gyfer cyllido'r cynllun tâl yn ôl perfformiad. A wnaiff y Gweinidog sicrhau na ddigwydd annibendod o'r math hwnnw eto ac y bydd ysgolion yn derbyn gwybodaeth glir a chywir yn y dyfodol am yr arian sydd ar gael iddynt yn hytrach na sbin parhaus y Llywodraeth hwn y maent wedi cael llond bol arno?

Jane Davidson: I reject the suggestion that there is continuous spin from this Government. Local authorities were responsible for sending their budget information to the Assembly by 31 March. Powys County Council was the last local authority to deliver this information. If we had received all the information on 31 March, no authority would have had to make teachers redundant in the last week of May as a result of waiting for the additional money promised in my statement at the beginning of May. We made that promise, but we did not receive the information from all the local authorities. Local authorities are responsible for the delivery of local education, but they must deliver key outcomes for issues that are top priorities for the Assembly and must ensure that information is properly provided. The Minister for Finance, Local Government and Communities is setting up a group, with the Welsh Local Government Association, to ensure that that situation does not occur again. The education budget fora will ensure that we get the right information from local authorities through structured dialogue between schools and local authorities on setting budgets.

Cynog Dafis: Does the Minister sympathise with the teachers and parents of the children of Presteigne Community Primary School, who visited the Assembly yesterday to protest about what happened at their school? They will not recognise the figures that the Minister quoted today because at the beginning of the current financial year the school faced a cut of 1 per cent in its budget and had to dismiss staff. That was before the school was told that it would receive additional money to fund the performance-related pay scheme. Will the Minister ensure that that kind of mess does not happen again and that schools receive clear and accurate information about the money available to them instead of the continuous spin from this Government, which they are fed up with?

Jane Davidson: Gwrthodaf yr awgrym bod sbin parhaus gan y Llywodraeth hon. Yr oedd yr awdurdodau lleol yn gyfrifol am anfon eu gwybodaeth cyllideb at y Cynulliad erbyn 31 Mawrth. C7 Glyn Davies: A wnaiff y Gweinidog ddatganiad am y mesurau i hybu ymwybyddiaeth o dechnoleg gwybodaeth a chyfathrebu mewn ysgolion cynradd? (OAQ18313)

Jane Davidson: Since 1998-99, the Welsh Assembly Government has made nearly £60 million available to improve the provision and use of ICT in all schools in Wales. This includes funding for training, equipment and support through grants for education support and training; the equipping of ICT learning centres in 240 schools; laptops for over 400 primary school teachers, and the recent provision of interactive whiteboards and other multimedia equipment for every school in Wales. All schools in Wales, including primary schools, should now be connected to the internet. The Assembly's 'Cymru Ar-lein' initiative will take this further by securing broadband connectivity for every school over the next three years.

The Welsh Assembly has also recently awarded the contract for the development of the national grid for learning Cymru to Curriculum Data Wales. This initiative will have a major role in raising awareness of ICT in schools and developing high-quality digital content to support teaching and learning.

Q7 Glyn Davies: Will the Minister make a statement on measures to promote awareness of information and communications technology in primary schools? (OAQ18313)

Jane Davidson: Ers 1998-99, mae Llywodraeth Cynulliad Cymru wedi darparu ymron i £60 miliwn i wella'r ddarpariaeth a'r defnydd o dechnoleg gwybodaeth a chyfathrebu yn yr holl ysgolion yng Nghymru. Mae hyn yn cynnwys cyllid ar gyfer hyfforddiant, offer a chymorth drwy grantiau cynnal addysg a hyfforddiant; cyfarparu canolfannau dysgu TGCh mewn 240 o ysgolion; cyfrifiaduron arffed i dros 400 o athrawon ysgol gynradd, a darparu byrddau gwyn rhwngweithiol ac offer amlgyfrwng eraill yn ddiweddar i bob ysgol yng Nghymru. Dylai'r holl ysgolion yng Nghymru, gan gynnwys ysgolion cynradd, fod wedi'u cysylltu â'r rhyngrwyd. Bydd menter 'Cymru Ar-lein' y Cynulliad yn mynd â hynny ymhellach drwy sierhau cysylltedd band llydan i bob ysgol dros y tair blynedd nesaf.

Yn ogystal â hynny, yn ddiweddar fe ddyfarnodd Cynulliad Cymru y contract i ddatblygu'r grid cenedlaethol ar gyfer dysgu Cymru i Curriculum Data Wales. Bydd rôl bwysig i'r fenter hon wrth hybu ymwybyddiaeth o dechnoleg gwybodaeth a chyfathrebu mewn ysgolion a datblygu cynnwys digidol o ansawdd da i hybu dysgu ac addysgu.

Glyn Davies: Thank you for your response, Minister. However, I recently visited a primary school in Powys that had a paltry four computers for over 100 children. Do you believe that that is adequate? Will you raise the matter with the local education authority, so that young people in Powys have more opportunities to learn about computers and information and communications technology?

Jane Davidson: Mae gan ysgolion amrediad o offer TGCh. Mae hynny'n ganlyniad i gydweithio rhwng yr ysgol, yr awdurdod addysg lleol a'r Cynulliad. Yr ydym wedi cymryd y cam a ganmolwyd yn gyffredinol o

That will ensure that every pupil in Wales has access to that high-quality interactive computer arrangement. The whiteboard will revolutionise teaching in a way that individual computers will not.

Helen Mary Jones: Whiteboards will not revolutionise teaching unless teachers can use them. I accept that money is being made available for training, but I often hear concerns expressed—particularly in smaller primary schools—about the teachers having the time to undertake that training. It is no good courses being funded if schools cannot afford to employ supply teachers to release permanent staff to take up those courses. What are your views on that? Could schools use some of that budget to employ supply teachers, which would release teachers for training?

Jane Davidson: LEAs have been asked to submit their outline spending plans by this week. It is important to reassure schools that LEAs will provide training in the use of whiteboards. Some schools may not be fully aware of that, as the initial catalogue of training for LEAs did not include money for it. However, we insisted upon it and financed it following our whiteboard initiative, to ensure that all pupils in Wales get the best out of that initiative.

Jane Davidson: New regulations require that, from 1 October 2001, all new buses, coaches and minibuses—except those designed to carry mainly standing passengers—must be fitted with seat belts. Over time, this should improve the safety of all bus transport, including school bus

transport. The new regulations also signal the beginning of the end of the three-for-two concession, which allows three children under 14 years of age to share a double seat.

Brian Gibbons: That is welcome news. Most of us who are familiar with school transport facilities in Wales recognise that progress needs to be made to bring buses up to standard. Parents concerned about safe transport to schools will welcome these new regulations.

Jane Davidson: In about half an hour's time, I will launch a document, published by the National Association of Council Contract Community Transport Workers, which will help raise the profile of the issue of transporting pupils to and from school safely. It is funded by the Department for Education and Skills, and is about sharing best practice and giving transport operators safety guidance. Many education and social services departments felt that there ought to be a reference guide for determining operational procedures, policies and best practice for local authority transport services, including transporting children with special needs.

Alun Cairns: Improved seat belt provision on buses is important, and I am sure that you will agree that the Safe Routes to Schools initiative is also important in relation to school children's safety. Will you express your appreciation and support for the lollipop men and women who help children cross the

Jane Davidson: I am happy to express my appreciation of and support for the lollipop men and women of Wales, and to endorse your support for the Safe Routes to Schools programme, for which we doubled the money available this year. This initiative encompasses several Assembly portfolios and encourages the greater use of public transport, walking and cycling. There are now about 22 projects in Wales, covering around 80 schools. That is good news and the programme should be developed further.

Brian Hancock: Do you agree that the work done by Belt Up School Kids and Pat Harris has been instrumental in road safety, and will you consider recommending a reduction in the travelling distance to school which entitles children and young people to free transport?

Jane Davidson: No. Local authorities can choose to provide transport at their discretion. Wrexham County Borough Council is the first authority to consider providing yellow school buses. That is an interesting initiative, which would provide highly visible buses, deliberately higher than normal vehicles, containing special padded seats and equipped with lap-top belts, with specially-trained drivers. Children would be picked up at identified points, parents would have a direct phone link to the bus control centre, and full training would be provided. That contrasts dramatically with other arrangements across Wales. I will be interested to see the outcome of Wrexham council's work.

The Government may make statements in Plenary whenever it wishes to do so, and I always encourage that, but the Government may also choose, for whatever reason, to make statements outside Plenary. [Interruption.] Order. You have taken advantage of your opportunity as a Member to raise a point of order on this matter, which the public and the Government Ministers will have heard.

David Davies: Point of order. This is a related issue. I tabled a question two months ago to the Minister for Education and Lifelong Learning, asking for a copy of every publication sent out to schools during the last three years in the Assembly's name. I realise that it might take time to find a lorry big enough for this, but two months is far too long to wait. In the interests of democracy I would like an answer to that question.

Y Strategaeth i Ofalwyr The Carers' Strategy

The Deputy Presiding Officer: I have selected amendments 1 and 2 in the name of Jocelyn Davies, and amendment 3 in the name of Jonathan Morgan.

The Minister for Health and Social Services (Jane Hutt): I propose that

the National Assembly:

- 1. welcomes the significant progress made through the carers strategy in Wales implementation plan in improving and promoting the health and well being of carers and those for whom they care;*
- 2. acknowledges the contribution of the plan to the Welsh Assembly Government's main themes and values for Wales;*
- 3. supports the proposal to continue to develop the strategy for carers and implementation plan;*
- 4. reaffirms the contribution made by individual volunteers and voluntary groups to this strategy. (NDM1076)*

I am pleased to propose this motion. This week is Carers' Week, which is an important week for paying tribute nationally and locally to carers, and for celebrating the important role of the 350,000 carers in Wales. The General Household Survey published yesterday stated that the number of carers in Wales is rising and could be about 423,000; I am sure that that is still an underestimate.

The Assembly agrees on the need to support carers in their caring role and I am pleased to support the three amendments to the motion in the constructive spirit in which they are offered. I will address each of them later.

publishing the second report of the carers' strategy implementation plan, 'Caring about Carers'. Copies of the report are being made available to all Members and are available in the Library, on the intranet and on the carers' website. My foreword to the report emphasises that a key aim was to ensure that improving carers' health and wellbeing is integral to other Welsh Assembly Government policies and programmes. Therefore, Jocelyn's second amendment is relevant.

'The Strategy for Carers in Wales—The Implementation Plan' was one of the Welsh Assembly Government's earliest initiatives. The overarching objective of the implementation plan is to improve the health and wellbeing of carers in Wales and of those for whom they care. The plan is built around five main priority areas: health and social care; information; support; young carers; and carers and employment. In line with my commitment to reviewing progress and monitoring the plan annually, we discussed the first report of the implementation plan last year in Plenary. That gave an account of the previous year's progress and outlined the programme of work for this year. The second report, published today, highlights the past year's achievements and outlines an ambitious work programme for 2002 and beyond.

A significant step forward in regard to progress was the approval last year by the Assembly of regulations to implement the Carers and Disabled Children Act 2000 from 1 July 2001. That legislation allows for carers, for the first time, to receive services in their own right. Local authorities, working with carers and their organisations, have taken the opportunities offered by the legislation and have used the resources provided by our carers' special grant to increase service and support provision and to develop a more diverse range of services to directly benefit carers. I was delighted that we were also able to make available some £3.1 million of additional resources for local authorities to undertake assessments in this respect.

My report to the Health and Social Services Committee in February outlined the sound evidence based on the improvements that these changes and the wider strategy are making to carers' lives across Wales. Local authorities, service providers and carers are together seeking to maximise the opportunities offered by the changes to meet their local needs. The report also outlined measures to record and collect information on carers' assessments as part of local authorities' performance management programme development and my commitment to report back to the Committee by the autumn on outcomes from an all-Wales study on carers' assessments. Jonathan Morgan's amendment 3 reflects what we are already doing.

In addition to implementing the provisions of the Carers and Disabled Children Act 2000, I will briefly mention progress made in other areas. Recently, I agreed local authority plans for £4.6 million in carers' special grants for 2002-03. Local authority plans to support carers are now a key part of the social services planning processes. This money is in addition to support to carers through mainstream programmes, integrating the needs of carers into the development of other policies and programmes to ensure that their needs are addressed across all policy boundaries. It provides the commitment to long term support, which Plaid Cymru urges in amendment 1.

The campaign targeted adult and young carers and cared-for people. Extensive coverage was given in the press and on radio, and the new National Assembly carers website was launched. Last autumn, young carers were the focus of a major Assembly conference that

We are building on this baseline from a variety of sources and are commissioning a major, wide-ranging qualitative research study to identify remaining gaps. The partnership underpinned in 'Improving Health in Wales' has resulted in carers having a voice on each local health board so that they play a full role in shaping health and wellbeing strategies and to ensure that local plans take full account of carers' needs. I am glad to announce today that Carers Wales is helping us with an open and transparent process of selecting and appointing carers to serve on each local health board, to be completed by October.

This year we will focus on services and support for people who care for black and minority ethnic communities. Many of these communities are first and second generation residents in Wales. Many elderly, frail people may feel vulnerable and isolated, and we must respect cultural differences and reach out to these communities. Like young carers, they present a unique set of needs. I have mentioned the work that we are taking forward, and we must ensure that programmes recognise the difficulties that

There is still more to do, but the most important achievement will be putting the wellbeing of carers firmly at the top of the Assembly's agenda.

I declare my usual interest as a general practitioner and a county councillor. In the context of this debate, I also declare an interest as the vice-chair of Crossroads—Caring for Carers in Swansea and Neath Port Talbot, and as the vice-president of the Alzheimer's Society, Swansea.

I welcome this debate on carers and I am grateful that the Government supports our amendments. I pay tribute to the key contribution made by carers throughout Wales. They often provide care in difficult circumstances; many feel that the support available to them is insufficient, and many suffer illhealth or financial problems as a result of their roles as carers. That is what

prompted the development of the carers' strategy and the provision of adequate funding for it. Its purpose is to provide care and support through respite care, telephone helplines, providing information about services, benefits and flexible working hours and many other attractive ideas to support carers.

Carers often feel isolated, and that they have to overcome all sorts of obstacles in order to get help. They also suffer exhaustion as a result of working without respite. This should no longer be the case; help is now available from many sources. We must ensure that carers and prospective carers—which we all are—know how to access help, what help is available, where it is available and what the local provisions are. Often, the process of accessing information is complicated and confusing, especially for ageing carers. I have been told of problems as a result of the number of carer assessments and delays. Another problem is that people are not aware of these assessments.

Also, when carers need additional help, it must be of a high quality, reliable and provided by individuals who have been trained in the necessary skills, such as how to lift someone, so that they can work safely.

Organisations such as Crossroads—Caring for Carers and the Alzheimer's Society are concerned about their long-term funding. That is what prompted amendment 1. In the early days of the carers' special grant, there were instances of delays in payments by local authorities. Concerns remain about the Assembly's mechanism for monitoring how local authorities deal with funding for carers. Who reviews local authorities' performance? What can the voluntary sector do if it is not content with the performance of a local authority?

As a county councillor, I know of numerous examples of exemplary work by local authorities in this field. This work includes providing telephone help and information lines, providing specific

welcomes the acceptance in principle by the Welsh Assembly Government that data on the number of carers assessments should be collected on an annual basis.

I thank the Minister for her constructive remarks, and for supporting our amendment. We will support Plaid Cymru's amendments. This is one of those pleasant debates where everyone is in agreement and where we need only emphasise certain points. Much progress is being made in terms of carers. The Government has had a good year; it has been responsive to many of the issues raised and has been keen to build on good work. The Minister was right to start by referring to the general household survey, which shows an increase in the number of carers in Britain and, therefore, in Wales. About 16 per cent of the adult population are carers. That is an astonishing figure, showing people's commitment to the care and welfare of their relatives and friends.

To concentrate on one figure, something like 140,000 of all carers in Wales become carers for the first time in any one year. That is an awful lot of people who need support, advice and information. That should be provided as soon as they become carers, or even just before, if that can be foreseen. They can then get the best possible advice on benefits, on how to combine work and other commitments with a caring role, whether they should give up employment or try to remain employed—which is often the best

support, organising events to promote the strategy's aims, and developing services for specialist groups.

Much good work is being done to support the huge contribution made by carers throughout Wales. However, it is still early days. A considerable challenge remains to meet the requirements of carers in Wales. We look forward to and welcome the numerous exciting developments in this vital area.

advice. When we consider the structure of services to support carers across Wales, we should remember that many people become carers for the first time in any week, month or day.

I join the Minister in welcoming the new initiative, sponsored by Carers Wales and other partner organisations, to support carers in work. It builds on the pioneering work undertaken by Centrica in the private sector, and has also been rolled out among public agencies. It is a key element of the carers' strategy, because many people will have to combine caring with paid employment—it is appropriate that they do so. They probably lead more balanced lives as a result, and should expect a level of support from public agencies and the Assembly.

The health sector is crucial in supporting carers. Much work has been done, and I welcome the fact that carers will sit on local health boards—a real achievement. When that amendment was proposed, the Government graciously supported it as something that would help carers achieve goals that will help them to live more balanced lives.

This morning, I met someone from the Parkinson's Disease Society, who reminded me that around 6,000 people suffer from that condition in Wales, most of them are also reliant on carers to manage their condition daily. Support and information is needed immediately and throughout the duration of their illness; it is crucial. The best place to get that is usually from their GP surgery or practice nurse.

I am pleased that the Minister for Rural Affairs and Assembly Business has allowed an hour's debate for the second report—

David Melding: It is appropriate for you to pick me up on that. I am pleased that the Minister for Rural Affairs and Assembly Business recommended that an hour's debate be allowed, and I hope that it will become an annual event. Carers' numbers are increasing. They play an essential role in society, and we must improve our ways of supporting them. Work is in progress and must be continued.

I am pleased that we will improve data on the number of carers' assessments, which is important. We need some measure of how local authorities are recording carers' assessments, and how they are taking forward the crucial carers' support for which they are responsible.

To conclude, respite care is important to carers. I know that we have heard this in many debates, but it is appropriate that we revisit the matter. My one special plea—which results from my visits undertaken for the Health and Social Services Committee's work on healthcare for young children—is that we spend more time on the issue of parent carers of children under five years old with severe disabilities, who get less support and respite care than any other carer. That is perverse, and is a particular problem with childcare.

Kirsty Williams: I concur with the comments made by Dai Lloyd and David Melding in commending another successful year of driving the carers' agenda forward. Many people want to continue caring; it is their choice. They just need support to enable them to carry out their caring responsibilities.

I gloi, mae gofal seibiant yn bwysig i ofalwyr. Gwn ein bod wedi clywed hynny mewn llawer o ddadleuon, ond mae'n briodol inni ailystyried y mater. Yr unig apêl arbennig sydd gennylf—sy'n ganlyniad i'm hymweliadau ar gyfer gwaith y Pwyllgor Iechyd a Gwasanaethau Cymdeithasol ar ofal iechyd i bobl ifanc—yw y dylem dreulio mwy o amser ar rieni sy'n ofalwyr i blant dan bum mlwydd oed sydd ag anableddau difrifol, sy'n cael llai o gymorth a gofal seibiant nag unrhyw ofalwyr eraill. Mae hynny'n wrthnysig, ac mae'n broblem benodol ynghylch gofal plant.

Kirsty Williams: Yr wyf yn cyd-fynd â sylwadau Dai Lloyd a David Melding wrth ganmol blwyddyn lwyddiannus arall o hyrwyddo'r agenda gofalwyr. Mae'n briodol i'r Cynulliad ymfalchiö yn y cynnydd a wnaeth mewn cyfnod cymharol fyr, wrth ddynodi cyfraniad gofalwyr i'n cymdeithas, a rhoi'r strategaeth ar waith i'w helpu i barhau â'u cyfrifoldebau gofalu. Mae llawer am barhau i ofalu; eu dewis yw hynny. Y cwbl y mae arnyt ei angen yw cymorth i'w galluogi i gyflawni eu cyfrifoldebau gofalu.

On carer representation on local health boards, I agree wholeheartedly with David. This is a positive step forward in allowing carers' voices to be heard in the commissioning, planning and, in some cases, delivery of healthcare services within communities. My only plea to the Minister is for further details of how those representatives will be supported in that environment because, although they will have personal experience of accessing and receiving services, it could be intimidating for them to articulate their views and get their point of view across when faced with an array of professional individuals who work within the service. We should also consider the ability of carers to attend meetings, because active carers will need the provision of respite care. We need further details on how this important appointment to the local health board will work.

We must be vigilant with regard to local government's performance in relation to carers' assessments, as councils across Wales have been slow to offer carers' assessments. Well-informed carers, who are aware of their rights, can inquire, but local authorities seem to be slow in actively informing carers that they are entitled to an assessment of individual needs, and that the local authority will act upon that. We must examine the level to which local authorities implement carers' assessments, and ensure that the identified services are then delivered. Although it is a statutory responsibility to deliver these services, we know that people who are cared for do not always receive the services they need, let alone the carers.

Moving towards a voucher scheme and giving carers a level of independence and choice in their ability to purchase services is to be welcomed. However, the direct payment scheme currently available to disabled people throughout Wales is another area that is not being fully utilised by many local authorities. In Cardiff and the Vale, the

Ynghylch y gynrychiolaeth i ofalwyr ar y byrddau iechyd lleol, yr wyf yn cytuno'n llwyr â David. Mae hwn yn gam cadarnhaol o ran rhoi gwrandawriad i lais y gofalwyr wrth gomisiynu, cynllunio ac, mewn rhai achosion, darparu gwasanaethau gofal iechyd mewn cymunedau. Yr unig apêl sydd gennyf i'r Gweinidog yw am fanylion pellach am y dull o gynorthwyo'r cynrychiolwyr hynny yn yr amgylchedd hwnnw oherwydd, er y bydd ganddynt brofiad personol o gyrraedd a derbyn gwasanaethau, gallai godi ofn arnynt pan ydynt yn mynegi ac yn cyfleu eu barn a hwythau'n wynebu rhes o unigolion proffesiynol sy'n gweithio yn y gwasanaeth. Rhaid inni fod yn wyliadwrus ynghylch perfformiad llywodraeth leol mewn cysylltiad ag asesiadau gofalwyr, gan y bu cynghorau ledled Cymru'n araf wrth gynnig asesiadau gofalwyr. Mae gofalwyr gwybodus, sy'n ymwybodol o'u hawliau, yn gallu gwneud ymholiadau, ond mae'n ymddangos bod yr awdurdodau lleol yn araf wrth hysbysu gofalwyr yn weithredol fod ganddynt hawl i gael asesiad o'u hanghenion unigol, ac y bydd yr awdurdod lleol yn gweithredu ar sail hynny. Rhaid inni gael gwybod i ba raddau y mae'r awdurdodau lleol yn gweithredu asesiadau gofalwyr, a sicrhau bod y gwasanaethau a ddynodir yn cael eu darparu wedyn. Er bod darparu'r gwasanaethau hynny'n gyfrifoldeb statudol, gwyddom nad yw pobl sy'n derbyn gofal bob amser yn derbyn y gwasanaethau y mae arnynt eu hangen, heb sôn am y gofalwyr.

Mae'r camau tuag at gynllun talebau ac at roi rhywfaint o annibyniaeth a dewis i ofalwyr o ran eu gallu i brynu gwasanaethau i'w croesawu. Fodd bynnag, mae'r cynllun talu uniongyrchol sydd ar gael ar hyn o bryd i bobl anabl ledled Cymru'n faes arall nad yw'n cael ei ddefnyddio'n llawn gan lawer o

direct payment scheme is supported by the Cardiff and Vale Coalition of Disabled People, which provides the framework to support people who choose the direct payment option. However, this is a rare example. In my county of Powys, the people who receive direct payment have no support whatsoever; in fact, their expenditure has not been monitored for the last three years, and they could be spending it on anything they want. That lack of support inhibits the ability of some people to apply for the direct payment scheme because purchasing your own services is a big departure from receiving them. People must be given support so that they have the confidence to pursue this avenue of care.

Dai is right: there is still widespread concern throughout Wales about the ongoing relationship between the voluntary sector and local authorities. We must examine how carers' organisations liaise with local authorities in developing carers' strategies for their individual counties, and ensure that the voluntary sector voice is heard. Local authorities must realise that they are primarily service commissioners, and not necessarily service providers, as there are many organisations that can provide good, cost-effective services for carers.

The crunch will come next year. This is the third year of our welcome, special grant, which is hypothecated so that local authorities cannot spend it on anything else. However, there is real fear in communities across Wales about what will happen next year if the money is not hypothecated, and becomes part of the revenue settlement grant. We have seen that learning disability services have melted away since the end of hypothecated funding, when the money for those services went into the revenue grant. We must bite the bullet and begin discussing what will happen to financial support for carers next year. The decision will be for another Assembly, but we must begin the discussion now.

Ym Mhowys, fy sir i, nid yw'r rhai sy'n derbyn taliadau uniongyrchol yn cael unrhyw gymorth o gwbl; a dweud y gwir, nid yw eu gwariant wedi'i fonitro yn y tair blynedd diwethaf, a gallent ei wario ar unrhyw beth a ddymunant. Mae'r diffyg cymorth hwnnw'n cyfyngu ar allu rhai pobl i ymgeisio am y cynllun talu uniongyrchol gan fod prynu'ch gwasanaethau eich hun yn wahanol iawn i'w derbyn. Rhaid i bobl gael cymorth fel eu bod yn ddigon hyderus i ddilyn y llwybr gofal hwn.

Mae Dai yn iawn: mae pryder cyffredinol o hyd ledled Cymru ynghylch y berthynas gyfredol rhwng y sector gwirfoddol a'r awdurdodau lleol. Rhaid inni ystyried y modd y mae mudiadau gofalwyr yn cysylltu â'r awdurdodau lleol wrth ddatblygu strategaethau i ofalwyr ar gyfer eu siroedd unigol, a sicrhau gwrandawiad i lais y sector gwirfoddol. Jocelyn Davies: This is a good opportunity to show our commitment to carers by providing long-term funding that will allow the voluntary organisations and local authorities to make secure plans for the future to support carers in their areas. That is the point of our amendment 1. By supporting it, the Minister and the Welsh Conservatives have demonstrated this Assembly's commitment to continuing this strategy by ending the uncertainty of funding—

Ieuan Wyn Jones: Do you believe that supporting that amendment is good news for organisations such as Crossroads—Caring for Carers in my constituency, which does excellent work? However, it often finds that when its lottery grant expires after three years, it must find further funding to carry on. This long-term funding would be excellent news for such organisations.

Jocelyn Davies: It is excellent news, and we should all be aware of the huge savings that carers make to the public purse. The average carer is said to save us £10,000 a year. Within the UK, it is believed that that would total around £57 billion. In Wales, it adds up to £3.5 billion a year. That is more than our entire health budget at present.

Three in every five people will become a carer in their lifetime—to a parent, a partner, a child or another family member. The number of carers is bound to increase significantly over the coming decades as the population ages, with more of us living longer and healthier lives. It will not be unusual for 70-year-olds to be caring for 90-year-old parents, and according to our older persons' strategy, we want more older people to remain in their own homes for longer. There is bound to be an impact on their carers. Although people will be healthier and more independent, they will still need considerable support. It is vital that this strategy complements our strategy for older people.

As more people become carers in one

Dywedir bod pob gofalwr yn arbed £10,000 y flwyddyn i ni ar gyfartaedd. Yn y DU, credir y byddai hynny'n dod i gyfanswm o tua £57 biliwn. Yng Nghymru, mae'n dod i £3.5 biliwn y flwyddyn. Mae hynny'n fwy na'n cyllideb iechyd gyfan ar hyn o bryd.

Bydd tri ym mhob pump o bobl yn dod yn ofalwyr yn ystod eu hoes—i riant, i gymar, i blentyn neu aelod arall o'r teulu. capacity or another, we will need to find ways of ensuring that employers go some way to ensuring that work can be balanced with care responsibilities at home. Will the Minister tell us about what the Assembly as an employer is doing in that respect? What incentives are we putting in place for those working for us to care for someone? The vast majority of carers who have left work to care for someone and hope to return to work recognise that it is difficult or impossible to do so and are forced to accept that their responsibilities stand in the way. We need to develop incentives for employers to put carer friendly practices in place. Will the Minister outline how we can encourage local authorities, quangos and other bodies that we fund to facilitate that?

I am pleased that this debate has been tabled today. The role of carers in our community has been undervalued and largely ignored until now. Acknowledging and supporting the role of carers is in all our interests and I look forward to the reviews of this strategy so that we can ensure that any current shortfalls are swiftly addressed.

Lorraine Barrett: This week is Volunteers Week. It is appropriate therefore that we acknowledge the enormous amount of work done by carers because they are also volunteers, often giving up their own lives to look after their loved ones. I particularly welcome the proposal to appoint a project officer to work with the black and ethnic minority communities. Will the Minister ensure that this officer, if appointed, identifies the black and ethnic minority communities across Wales? Some of these communities are often small, particularly in the rural areas. People can feel particularly isolated and unsure about where to get their support.

I will highlight another group of people who have particular needs. Will the Minister ensure that the lesbian, gay and bisexual communities are not forgotten in this strategy? People of differing sexual

However, they need to seek that support if they end up in a caring situation. They should be entitled to the same care packages as any other section in our community, even if they are perceived by some people as different.

Helen Mary Jones: Canolbwytiaf ar anghenion gofalwyr ifanc. Gwyddom am y pwysau y gall gofalu ei roi ar bobl ifanc a'r effaith y gall hynny ei gael ar eu hiechyd, eu haddysg a'u datblygiad cymdeithasol. Fodd bynnag, mae'n bwysig cofio bod pobl ifanc yn aml yn dewis gofalu. Fel llawer o ofalwyr eraill, maent yn croesawu'r cyfle i ddangos eu cariad tuag at aelodau o'u teuluoedd sy'n dioddef neu'n wynebu problem drwy ofalu amdanyst. Yn aml, bydd y bobl ifanc hyn yn poeni am ofyn am help rhag ofn y bydd yr help honedig hwnnw'n troi'n ymyrraeth i fywyd y teulu na chroesewir gan y rhieni na'r plant.

Cyfeiria'r adroddiad hefyd at ymchwil a wnaed gan Brifysgol Cymru, Bangor a Phrifysgol Cymru, Abertawe sy'n dangos bod gan bobl ifanc sy'n gofalu ofynion eithaf syml. Maent am gael cefnogaeth addas iddynt hwy a'u teuluoedd, am dderbyn gwybodaeth gan ddarparwyr gwasanaethau a chynnal deialog â hwy. Helen Mary Jones: I will concentrate on the needs of young carers. We know of the pressure that caring can place on young people and the effect that it can have on their health, education and social development. However, we should bear in mind that young people often choose to care. Like many other carers, they welcome the opportunity to show their love for ailing family members by caring for them. These young people are often reluctant to ask for help in case that so-called help becomes intrusion into that family's life that is not welcomed by the parents or the children.

The report also refers to research by the University of Wales, Bangor and the University of Wales, Swansea, which shows that young people who care have relatively basic needs. They want appropriate support for themselves and their families, information from service providers and an ongoing dialogue with them. Too often, when social workers or health carers visit the home, they only speak to the adults and forget the role of the children and young people.

Young people also request a programme to raise awareness among professionals of their contribution as young carers. They ask specifically, as do all carers, for flexible care packages, which meet different needs at different times. For example, a young carer caring for his or her sick mother will need more assistance

However, the report also refers to many Assembly Government initiatives relating to children and young people without clarifying precisely how these initiatives will proactively involve young carers and address their needs. Much of what is being done and the proposed next steps are welcome. However, the references to these initiatives in the form in which they appear look suspiciously like padding. Will the Minister rectify that by explaining how 'Extending Entitlement' and 'Children and Young People: A Framework for Partnership' will address the needs of children and young people who are carers? Will she give us some specific information about the purpose of those initiatives?

What does the Minister propose to do to ensure that young carers can access services in whichever language they choose to use? This is a particularly important issue for children and young people in some of our rural communities where getting access to a social worker who speaks Welsh, for example, or an ethnic minority language in other communities, can be difficult.

during examinations than at any other time. Flexible support of this kind at the appropriate times is not always available.

The demands are quite straightforward and clear. A massive investment is needed to ensure that they are met throughout Wales. The report refers to the steps already taken and some, as many other Members have mentioned, are positive. I praise the excellent work of some projects that work with young people who care across various communities throughout the country. They provide practical and emotional support and can also provide an advocacy service to help young people to communicate with officialdom.

The report also outlines the next steps to be taken, which are welcome, namely a national forum for young carers and a clearer definition of what exactly a young carer is.

A wnaiff y Gweinidog iawn am hynny drwy egluro sut y bydd 'Ymestyn Hawliau' a 'Plant a Phobl Ifanc: Fframwaith ar gyfer Partneriaeth' yn ymdrin ag anghenion plant a phobl ifanc sy'n ofalwyr? A wnaiff roi rhywfaint o wybodaeth benodol i ni am bwrrpas y mentrau hynny?

Beth y mae'r Gweinidog yn bwriadu'i wneud i sicrhau bod gofalwyr ifanc yn gallu cael gwasanaethau ym mha bynnag iaith y dewisant ei defnyddio? Mae hyn yn fater arbennig o bwysig i blant a phobl ifanc mewn rhai o'n cymunedau gwledig lle y gall fod yn anodd cael gweithiwr cymdeithasol sy'n siarad y Gymraeg, er enghraifft, neu iaith leiafrifol ethnig mewn cymunedau eraill.

Will the Minister also explain why the special educational needs code of practice appears in this section of the report? It is difficult to see how it is relevant. Young carers have special educational needs, but they are not the kind that need statementing. They need an imaginative, clever and well-thought-through response from schools. The issue is not about special educational needs tribunals. Will the Minister explain why the code appears in the report?

We have all welcomed the strategy. The regular reports that we are receiving are immensely helpful. There is good work taking place and great progress is being made. It is important, however, that the Minister recognises—Kirsty Williams, Dai Lloyd and Jocelyn Davies have already referred to this—the deep fear that exists in this community that all this work would fall apart if the special central support runs out at the end of this year. People do not want this work to follow the route that the mental handicap strategy sadly followed. I would like the Minister to ensure us today that that will not happen and that she would be prepared to take action against local authorities that do not meet their responsibilities to carers in the short and long term.

We cannot afford to let carers down. As others have said, carers contribute enormously to our nation. We must ensure that their needs are met.

The Minister for Health and Social Services (Jane Hutt): I am glad that there has been so much cross-party support and consensus. Everyone wants to pay tribute to carers and the organisations that represent them. Supporting carers is vital and the voice and strength of the carers' movement in Wales means that we can look forwards and not backwards in terms of their future treatment. We look forward to their strong role and for them to receive recognition. That means that we need information about carers. David, Kirsty, Helen Mary and Dai mentioned carers assessment.

A wnaiff y Gweinidog egluro hefyd pam y mae'r cod ymarfer anghenion addysgol arbennig yn ymddangos yn yr adran hon o'r adroddiad? Anodd gweld sut y mae'n berthnasol. Mae gan ofalwyr ifanc anghenion addysgol arbennig, ond nid ydynt o'r math y mae angen datganiad ar eu cyfer. Mae arnynt angen ymateb dyfeisgar, ystyriol a llawn dychymyg gan ysgolion. Nid yw'r mater hwn yn ymwneud â thribiwnlysoedd anghenion addysgol arbennig. A wnaiff y Gweinidog egluro pam y mae'r cod yn yr adroddiad?

Yr ydym oll wedi croesawu'r strategaeth. Mae'r adroddiadau rheolaidd a gawn yn ddefnyddiol dros ben. Mae gwaith da'n digwydd a gwneir cynydd mawr. Fodd bynnag, mae'n bwysig bod y Gweinidog yn cydnabod—mae Kirsty Williams, Dai Lloyd a Jocelyn Davies wedi cyfeirio at hyn eisoes—yr ofn mawr sy'n bodoli yn y gymuned hon y byddai'r holl waith hwn yn ymddatod os deuai'r cymorth canolog arbennig i ben ar ddiwedd y flwyddyn hon. Nid yw pobl am weld y gwaith hwn yn mynd yr un ffordd ag a wnaeth y strategaeth anfantais meddwl, gwaetha'r modd. Byddwn yn falch pe byddai'r Gweinidog yn ein sicrhau heddiw na fydd hynny'n digwydd ac y byddai'n barod i gymryd camau yn erbyn awdurdodau lleol nad ydynt yn cyflawni eu cyfrifoldebau at ofalwyr yn y tymor byr a hir.

Ni allwn fforddio siomi gofalwyr. Fel y dywedodd eraill, mae gofalwyr yn cyfrannu'n helaeth i'n cenedl. Rhaid inni sicrhau y caiff eu hanghenion eu diwallu.

Y Gweinidog dros Iechyd a Gwasanaethau Cymdeithasol (Jane Hutt): Yr wyf yn falch bod cymaint o gefnogaeth a chonsensws trawsbleidiol. Mae pawb yn dymuno talu teyrnged i ofalwyr a'r cyrff sy'n eu cynrychioli. Mae'n hollbwysig cefnogi gofalwyr ac mae llais a chryfder y mudiad gofalwyr yng Nghymru'n golygu y gallwn edrych ymlaen ac nid yn ôl o ran sut yr ydym yn ymwneud â hwy yn y dyfodol. Edrychwn ymlaen at eu rôl gadarn a'r gydnabyddiaeth a gânt. Mae hynny'n golygu bod arnom angen gwybodaeth am ofalwyr. Soniodd

David, Kirsty, Helen Mary a Dai am asesu gofalwyr.

Brian Hancock: I want to pick up on an interesting point. As Lorraine Barratt said earlier, carers are often volunteers. There are many volunteer organisations throughout Wales. As it is Volunteers Week, I wish to name a few in my constituency: the Cancer Care line, Crossroads- Caring for Carers and, as it is Jubilee year, the Gwent Association of Voluntary Organisations, which was established 75 years ago.

The Deputy Presiding Officer: Order. Will you please ask a question?

Brian Hancock: Will you join me in congratulating and thanking these organisations for their services?

Jane Hutt: I congratulate the volunteers. As you say, there is a close link between Volunteers Week and Carers Week. I also the congratulate GAVO's work.

The carers assessment is important. It was introduced by legislation and has been available since July 2001. Widespread publicity for the carers assessment is essential. That has been achieved through the media and the Assembly, and carers' groups have also provided information. It is not just a quick fix promotional campaign. As David said, 140,000 new carers come on board every year. We must recognise that publicity, promotion and services must be ongoing and that they should grow, not just be a one-off when legislation is introduced. Local authorities have been given extra money through the local government revenue settlement: £3.2 million in 2001-02, and an additional £2.6 million for next year, to help them implement the carers assessment. On Kirsty's point about data and monitoring evaluation, the management information systems that the local authorities are now developing on social services will provide the data that we need.

Brian Hancock: Dymunaf fynd ar drywydd un pwynt diddorol. Fel y dywedodd Lorraine Barratt yn gynharach, gwirfoddolwyr yw llawer o'r gofalwyr. Mae llawer o fudiadau gwirfoddolwyr ledled Cymru. Gan mai Wythnos y Gwirfoddolwyr yw hon, dymunaf enwi rhai yn fy etholaeth i: y Llinell Gymorth Canser, Croesffyrdd Cymru—Gofalu am Ofalwyr ac, ym mlwyddyn y Jiwbilî, Cymdeithas Cyrff Gwirfoddol Gwent, a sefydlwyd 75 mlynedd yn ôl.

Y Dirprwy Lywydd: Trefn. A wnewch ofyn cwestiwn, os gwelwch yn dda?

Brian Hancock: A wnewch ymuno â mi i longyfarch a diolch i'r mudiadau hyn am eu gwasanaethau?

Jane Hutt: Llongyfarchaf y gwirfoddolwyr. Fel y dywedwch, mae cysylltiad agos rhwng Wythnos y Gwirfoddolwyr ac Wythnos y Gofalwyr. Yr wyf hefyd yn llongyfarch Cymdeithas Cyrff Gwirfoddol Gwent ar ei gwaith.

Mae'r asesiad gofalwyr yn bwysig. Fe'i cyflwynwyd drwy ddeddfwriaeth a bu ar gael ers Gorffennaf 2001. Mae'n hollbwysig bod cyhoeddusrwydd eang i'r asesiad gofalwyr. Sierhawyd hynny drwy'r cyfryngau a'r Cynulliad, ac mae'r grwpiau gofalwyr wedi darparu gwybodaeth hefyd. Nid ymgyrch hyrwyddo sy'n cynnig ateb sydyn ydyw. Fel y dywedodd David, mae 140,000 o ofalwyr newydd yn dechrau bob blwyddyn. Rhaid inni sylweddoli'r angen parhaus am gyhoeddusrwydd, hyrwyddo a gwasanaethau a'r angen iddynt dyfu, ac nid bod yn rhywbeth unwaith yn unig pan gyflwynir deddfwriaeth. Rhoddwyd arian ychwanegol i'r awdurdodau lleol drwy'r setliad refeniw llywodraeth leol: £3.2 miliwn yn 2001-02, a £2.6 miliwn ychwanegol ar gyfer y flwyddyn nesaf, i'w helpu i weithredu'r asesiad gofalwyr. Ynghylch pwynt Kirsty am werthuso data a monitro, bydd y systemau gwybodaeth reoli y mae'r awdurdodau lleol yn eu datblygu'n awr ar wasanaethau

cymdeithasol yn darparu'r data y mae arnom eu hangen.

Protocols have been developed. We are also integrating carers not only in terms of their role on local health boards, which will be vital, but also in terms of developing policy. On Monday, I visited the Carers Forum in the Vale of Glamorgan. Members there said that they had exerted influence on their special grant from the Assembly this year. The carers' groups in the Vale of Glamorgan came together and decided to recruit an advocacy worker. That has now been included in the council's special grant for the forum. Therefore, carers are already beginning to influence joint planning, as that special grant demonstrates.

David's point on respite care is also important. Respite care not only involves care for the elderly, or care in a residential setting. We must be much more innovative and imaginative about respite options. There is a need for respite care during the day, especially on weekdays. Helen Mary raised a point about young carers. We must be flexible with young carers at different times of the year or week. We must build opportunities, which is where the voluntary sector will be innovative, as it already is. Having met young, disabled people who are dependent on their parents as carers, they do not want to be offered one option of respite care, they want many imaginative options.

On Kirsty's point about the role of carer representatives on local health boards, that role will be a great and powerful one. I am delighted that Carers Wales will help us with the selection, and it will liaise with its local contacts. It will also help with the support. We are already talking to the voluntary sector about support for voluntary sector members on local health boards, as well as carer representatives. Our councils for voluntary action and service around Wales will play their role and are keen to do so.

Fe ddatblygwyd protocolau. Yr ydym hefyd yn integreiddio gofalwyr nid yn unig yng nghyd-destun eu rôl ar fyrddau iechyd lleol, a fydd yn hollbwysig, ond hefyd yng nghyd-destun datblygu polisi. Ddydd Llun, ymwelais â'r Fforwm Gofalwyr ym Mro Morgannwg. Dywedodd yr aelodau yno eu bod wedi dylanwadu ar eu grant arbennig o'r Cynulliad eleni. Daeth y grwpiau gofalwyr ym Mro Morgannwg at ei gilydd a phenderfynu recriwtio gweithiwr eiriolaeth. Mae hynny wedi'i gynnwys bellach yng ngrant arbennig y cyngor i'r fforwm. Felly, mae gofalwyr eisoes yn dechrau dylanwadu ar gynllunio ar y cyd, fel y mae'r grant arbennig hwnnw yn ei ddangos.

Mae pwynt David am ofal seibiant yn bwysig hefyd. Mae gofal seibiant yn ymwneud â mwy na gofal am yr henoed, neu ofal mewn sefyllfa breswyl. Rhaid inni fod yn fwy arloesol a dyfeisgar yng hylch y dewisiadau ar gyfer seibiant. Mae angen gofal seibiant yn ystod y dydd, yn enwedig yn ystod yr wythnos. Cododd Helen Mary bwynt yng hylch gofalwyr ifanc. Rhaid inni fod yn hyblyg yn ein hymwneud â gofalwyr ifanc ar wahanol adegau o'r flwyddyn neu'r wythnos. Rhaid inni greu cyfleoedd, a bydd y sector gwirfoddol yn arloesol yn hynny o beth, fel y mae eisoes. Gan fy mod wedi cwrdd â phobl anabl ifanc sy'n dibynnu ar eu rhieni am ofal, gwn nad ydynt am gael cynnig un dewis o ofal seibiant, maent am gael llawer o ddewisiadau dyfeisgar.

Yng hylch pwynt Kirsty am rôl cynrychiolwyr y gofalwyr ar fyrddau iechyd lleol, bydd y rôl honno'n un fawr a phwerus. Yr wyf wrth fy modd y bydd Gofalwyr Cymru yn ein helpu wrth ddethol, a bydd yn gweithio â'i gysylltiadau lleol. Bydd hefyd yn helpu i roi cymorth. Yr ydym eisoes yn siarad â'r sector gwirfoddol yng hylch cymorth i aelodau'r sector gwirfoddol ar fyrddau iechyd lleol, yn ogystal â chynrychiolwyr y gofalwyr. Bydd ein cynghorau gweithredu a gwasanaethu gwirfoddol ledled Cymru'n

chwarae rhan, ac maent yn awyddus i wneud hynny.

We must also ensure that carers are represented, and do not just have a token presence on the local health board but are part of a community of carers that they can relate to. On Jocelyn, Ieuan, Kirsty and Helen Mary's concerns on long-term funding and how it will be addressed, clearly, the special grant and the strategy have had a huge impact on what we have done and we have all embraced that and taken it forward. The money has increased year on year. We will not turn the clock back; carers will not turn the clock back. The Assembly and local government will be scrutinised, to ensure that the clock is never turned back to the pre-carers strategy time when we had no plan, no commitment, and carers' voices were not heard. Lorraine made important points for the needs of black and ethnic minority communities to be reflected throughout Wales. That is why we stipulated in the special grant that everybody must consider these needs and cultural differences. That is our commitment to equality of opportunity that also embraces issues of barriers to gay and lesbian people and same sex couples. We must take that on board and do so in terms of the wide diversity in our community.

Finally, on Helen Mary's point, we must ensure that our children and young people's framework is more strategic to reflect inclusively all of our concerns at a national and local level. We must therefore ensure that young carers' voices are heard in the youth forums developing in all parts of Wales and that they are represented on the schools councils—

Helen Mary Jones: I am grateful to you for making that point on the record. However, if you look at the report, there are references to the young persons initiative and, by implication, that means that the Government will do something about including young

Rhaid inni sicrhau hefyd y caiff gofalwyr gynrychiolaeth, ac nad yw eu presenoldeb ar fyrdau iechyd lleol yn symbolaidd yn unig ond yn hytrach yn rhan o gymuned o ofalwyr y gallant uniaethu â hi. Ynghylch pryderon Jocelyn, Ieuan, Kirsty a Helen Mary am ariannu tymor hir a sut yr ymdrinnir â hynny, mae'n amlwg bod y grant arbennig a'r strategaeth wedi cael effaith fawr iawn ar yr hyn a wnaethom ac yr ydym oll wedi croesawu hynny a'i hyrwyddo. Mae'r arian wedi cynyddu o flwyddyn i flwyddyn. Ni fyddwn yn troi'r cloc yn ôl; ni fydd gofalwyr yn troi'r cloc yn ôl. Helen Mary Jones: Yr wyf yn ddiolchgar i chi am wneud y pwynt hwnnw ar goedd. Fodd bynnag, os edrychwch ar yr adroddiad, mae cyfeiriadau at y fenter pobl ifanc a, drwy oblygiad, mae hynny'n golygu y bydd y Llywodraeth yn gwneud

carers; however, that is unclear. Will you answer my question about the SEN code; perhaps you will write to me? It seems inappropriate to include it in the report and could feed the concerns of some young carers that they are being treated as odd.

Jane Hutt: I will respond following consultation with my colleague, Jane Davidson. We were highlighting all the issues and policies of interest to young carers, but we must ensure that their needs are reflected in the core planning and commissioning of services. That includes education as well as health and social care. Our research with young carers has shown us how to take this forward. We also know that, as a result of our special grant, young carers groups are now meeting and working throughout Wales and making a real difference to young people's lives. I am hosting a reception at NCM, which is next door to the Assembly, after this Plenary session to celebrate the work of carers and to champion the carers strategy through our communities. I hope that people will join us for that. It is a celebration, but it is also a campaign. We must never forget that the Assembly is campaigning for carers in partnership.

Jane Hutt: Ymatebaf ar ôl ymgynghori â'm cyd-Weinidog, Jane Davidson. Dadl Fer Short Debate

Ailagor y Rheilffordd o Riwabon i Abermo **Reopening the Ruabon to Barmouth Railway Line**

Eleanor Burnham: I am delighted to have this opportunity to use the short debate as a basis for reconnecting Wales. I was brought up on a farm in Cynwyd in the beautiful Dee valley looking down on the Ruabon to Barmouth railway line. The whistle of the train was greatly welcomed in a rural community that was not yet clogged up with cars. The train provided links that enabled tourists to travel calmly through one of the most beautiful valleys in the world. It also brought mail and goods directly and swiftly to local people. It was an age of immaculately manned stations. I recently looked at an early photograph of Ruabon station staff in 1902, which showed a smart team that was proud to be of service to its local community at a busy junction. It is now, unfortunately, a shabby shadow of its former self. Since Beeching, we have a decimated, skeleton rail service, unmanned stations, inadequate lighting, hostile environments and often disgusting facilities for local people and tourists. I am not looking back through rose-tinted spectacles but looking forward to a vision of expanding an integrated transport system for people and freight—contrary to a recently published ‘Beeching Mark 2’ report by the Institute of Directors.

Many of us use railways abroad where governments and regions invest heavily in integrated transport systems as part of the social fabric and for commercial activity. At the recent Welsh Liberal Democrat conference, we debated reconnecting Wales in a fully integrated transport system. The 1999 Babtie report looked at connecting Wales in all directions. Devolution gives us

Nid gweld popeth yn y gorffennol yn hyfryd yr wyf, ond edrych ymlaen at weledigaeth o ehangu system drafnidiaeth integredig i bobl a nwyddau—yn groes i'r adroddiad ‘Beeching Mark 2’ a gyhoeddwyd yn ddiweddar gan Sefydliad y Cyfarwyddwyr.

Mae llawer ohonom yn defnyddio rheilffyrdd dramor lle y mae llywodraethau a rhanbarthau'n buddsoddi'n helaeth mewn systemau trafnidiaeth integredig fel rhan o wead cymdeithas ac ar gyfer gweithgarwch masnachol. Yng nghynhadledd ddiweddar Democraidiad Rhyddfrydol Cymru, cawsom ddadl ar ailgysylltu Cymru drwy system drafnidiaeth gwbl integredig. Yn

the perfect chance to invest in our disadvantaged and hinterland regions to stimulate tourism and recharge faltering local economies, particularly after foot and mouth disease.

This week, I spoke to Father Deiniol from Ffestiniog, who travelled on this line before it closed. There were 14 coaches and the train had to stop twice at most stations because of its length. From Bala junction westwards, there was standing room only. This line could not, therefore, have closed through lack of use. The year before closure, new track was laid at Llangollen. The rails on the line were high-quality steel, and the closure had an impact locally for at least 10 years. It has led to greater road congestion throughout those parts of Wales that the line crossed.

The original Llangollen railway line, which ran from Ruabon to Barmouth, was closed to passenger trains in December 1964 and the track was lifted in 1968. In September 1975, Llangollen station was reopened with three miles of trackbed towards Corwen. In 1981, Her Majesty's Railway Inspectorate passed the railway track as being fit for use by passenger trains. That was the first track to be reopened in the Dee valley for 16 years.

Throughout a 20-year period, the track was progressively laid by dedicated volunteers. Capital and associated infrastructure costs could have been prohibitive. Fortunately significant assistance was received from the public and private sectors in grant aid and donations. Llangollen railway is now the most popular tourist attraction in the area and makes a significant contribution to the local economy. It has been estimated that the railway generates an annual income of £1.5 million for the Dee valley. Passenger numbers average 80,000 per year and it employs around 12 full-time paid staff. It also provides facilities for three young apprentices who are being trained in traditional engineering skills.

adroddiad Babtie yn 1999 ystyriwyd ailgysylltu Cymru ym mhob cyfeiriad. Mae datganoli'n rhoi cyfle perffaith inni fuddsoddi yn ein rhanbarthau difreintiedig a chefnwlad i hybu twristiaeth ac adnewyddu economïau lleol sigledig, yn enwedig ar ôl clwy'r traed a'r genau.

Yr wythnos hon, bûm yn siarad â'r Tad Deiniol o Ffestiniog, a deithiai ar y rheilffordd hon cyn ei chau. Yr oedd 14 o gerbydau ac yr oedd yn rhaid i'r trêb stopio ddwywaith yn y rhan fwyaf o'r gorsafoedd oherwydd ei hyd. O gyffordd y Bala tua'r gorllewin, nid oedd ond lle i sefyll. Felly, ni allai'r rheilffordd hon fod wedi'i chau oherwydd diffyg defnydd. Y flwyddyn cyn ei chau, gosodwyd cledrau newydd yn Llangollen. Defnyddiwyd dur o ansawdd da i wneud y cledrau, ac effeithiodd y cau ar yr ardal am o leiaf 10 mlynedd. Mae wedi arwain at fwy o dagfeydd ar y ffyrdd drwy'r rhannau hynny o Gymru yr oedd y rheilffordd yn mynd drwyddynt.

Caewyd rheilffordd wreiddiol Llangollen, a redai o Riwabon i Abermo, i drenau teithwyr yn Rhagfyr 1964 a chodwyd y cledrau yn 1968. Ym Medi 1975, ailagorwyd gorsaf Llangollen ynghyd â thair milltir o drac i gyfeiriad Corwen. Yn 1981, cymeradwyodd Arolygiaeth Rheilffyrdd Ei Mawrhydi y trac rheilffordd fel un a oedd yn addas i'w ddefnyddio gan drenau teithwyr. Hwnnw oedd y trac cyntaf i'w ailagor yn nyffryn Dyfrdwy am dros 16 mlynedd.

Drwy gydol cyfnod o 20 mlynedd, gosodwyd y cledrau'n raddol gan wirfoddolwyr ymroddedig. Gallasai'r costau cyfalaf a seilwaith cysylltiedig fod yn afresymol. Yn ffodus, derbyniwyd cymorth sylweddol gan y sectorau cyhoeddus a phreifat ar ffurf cymorth grant a rhoddion. Rheilffordd Llangollen yw'r atyniad twristaidd mwyaf poblogaidd yn yr ardal bellach ac mae ei chyfraniad i'r economi leol yn sylweddol. Amcangyfrifwyd bod y rheilffordd yn cynhyrchu incwm blynnyddol o £1.5 miliwn i ddyffryn Dyfrdwy. Caiff 80,000 o deithwyr y flwyddyn ar gyfartaledd ac mae'n cyflogi tua 12 o staff taledig llawn amser. Mae hefyd yn darparu cyfleusterau i

dri phrentis ifanc a hyfforddir mewn sgiliau peirianneg traddodiadol.

It is estimated that around 250 volunteers are required to keep the railway operating. This year almost £1 million has been committed to three major projects, including around £400,000 from the heritage lottery fund. Two stations and a viaduct—a listed structure—were found to be in urgent need of repair at a cost of around £360,000. Contractors are completing the final phases of this work. It is the first work to be undertaken on the viaduct since 1936. It has proved impossible to obtain significant grant aid for this work and the railway has launched a public appeal. Therefore, please dig deep into your pockets.

The third project was the erection of a building to provide covered accommodation for rolling stock. Llangollen railway intends to operate trains to Corwen within the next four years. All parties consider that it is fundamental to the regeneration of Corwen.

Llangollen railway has long since outgrown the clichéd image of a bunch of enthusiasts ‘playing’ at trains, and is a fundamental component in the economic wellbeing of the local community. Its long-term ambition is to see the railway extended towards Ruabon and the main line connection in one direction, and possibly further towards Bala in the other. There may be major engineering obstacles to overcome, but it is considered to be feasible. Corwen and the Dee valley would then be accessible from the national rail network. Just think—a through ticket from Corwen to London once again.

Commuters could travel by train to their place of work and perhaps a park and ride scheme could alleviate problems in Llangollen. Assistance will continue to be required to fund major projects. However, if one accepts that Llangollen railway is an operator in the public transport sector, is that any different from the subsidies received by a train operating company?

Amcangyfrifir bod angen tua 250 o wyrfoddolwyr i gadw'r rheilffordd ar waith. Eleni neilltuwyd ymron i £1 filiwn i dri phrosiect pwysig, gan gynnwys tua £400,000 o gronfa treftadaeth y loteri. Cafwyd bod taer angen atgyweirio dwy or saf a thraphont—sy'n adeiladwaith rhestredig—ar gost o tua £360,000. Mae contractwyr yn cwblhau rhannau olaf y gwaith hwn. Dyma'r gwaith cyntaf ar y draphont ers 1936. Cafwyd ei bod yn amhosibl cael cymorth grant sylwedol ar gyfer y gwaith hwn ac mae'r rheilffordd wedi lansio apêl i'r cyhoedd. Felly, rhoddwch yn hael, os gwelwch yn dda.

Y trydydd prosiect oedd codi adeilad i ddarparu lle dan do i gadw'r cerbydau. Mae rheilffordd Llangollen yn bwriadu rhedeg trenau i Gorwen o fewn y pedair blynedd nesaf. Mae pawb sy'n gysylltiedig o'r farn bod hynny'n hollbwysig er mwyn adfywio Corwen.

Mae rheilffordd Llangollen wedi hen ymadael â'r darlun ystrydebol o griw o selogion yn 'chwarae trêñ', ac mae'n hanfodol i les economaidd y gymuned leol. Ei huchelgais yn y tymor hir yw gweld ymestyn y rheilffordd tua Rhiwabon a'r cysylltiad â'r brif linell i un cyfeiriad, ac ymhellach tua'r Bala, o bosibl, i'r cyfeiriad arall. Mae'n bosibl y bydd angen goresgyn rhwystrau peirianegol mawr, ond credir ei bod yn ymarferol. Wedyn gellid cyrraedd Corwen a dyffryn Dyfrdwy o'r rhwydwaith rheilffyrrdd cenedlaethol. Meddyliwch amdani—tocyn a aiff â chi yn syth o Gorwen i Lundain unwaith eto.

Gallai cymudwyr deithio ar y trêñ i'w gwaith ac efallai y gallai cynllun parcio a theithio liniaru'r problemau yn Llangollen. Bydd angen cymorth o hyd i ariannu prosiectau mawr. Fodd bynnag, os yw rhywun yn derbyn bod rheilffordd Llangollen yn gweithredu yn y sector trafnidiaeth gyhoeddus, a oes gwahaniaeth rhwng hynny a'r cymorthdaliadau a gaiff cwmni trenau?

The other railway line in question is the Bala railway line, which was opened in 1972 on part of the old Great Western Railway trackbed that stretched from Ruabon to Barmouth junction. The line was closed as part of the Beeching cuts and the land became the property of the council. George Barnes saw its potential and the land is now leased from Gwynedd Council. It is a narrow gauge railway and is different from that at Llangollen. The diesel locomotive and coaches were made especially for the railway. It has a 100-year-old 'Holy War' and a 92-year-old 'Maid Marian'. However, acquiring funding for this narrow gauge railway is difficult.

The private limited company does not have and cannot get charitable status. It is not eligible for the hundreds of thousands of pounds that Llangollen railway has acquired. However, it is eligible for tourist board grants for suitable projects. In the last few years, it has received a grant to refit the shop, resurface the platform and purchase a diesel locomotive. Its share of such schemes has to be funded from its revenue and borrowing and, if the Easter to September period does not generate enough revenue, the company has a problem. The railway company has always wanted to extend the line into Bala town and run it around the end of the lake, but failed to obtain the backing of Snowdonia National Park and the council; the scheme is now on hold indefinitely.

Investing in a long-term vision for an area requires lateral thinking and a debate on the reasons for evaluating line redevelopment. One must consider whether it is for the benefit of the rural economy or community improvement, to create a new or alternative route to provide hinterland access or whether it is to create a visitor experience or, possibly, a combination of these matters.

Comparisons could be made with the Montgomery canal renovation project. I do not have time to go into the details of that project, but one example is the renovation of moorings and canal-side residential land. The

Y llinell reilffordd arall dan sylw yw llinell reilffordd y Bala, a agorwyd yn 1972 ar ran o wely hen reilffordd y Great Western Railway a ymestynnai o Riwabon i gyffordd Abermo. Caewyd y llinell fel rhan o doriadau Beeching a daeth y tir yn eiddo i'r cyngor. Gwelodd George Barnes ei botensial ac mae'r tir wedi'i osod ar brydles yn awr gan Gyngor Gwynedd. Rheilffordd gul ydyw ac mae'n wahanol i'r un yn Llangollen. Gwnaed y locomotif diesel a'r cerbydau'n arbennig i'r rheilffordd. Mae ganddi 'Holy War' sy'n 100 mlwydd oed a 'Maid Marian' sy'n 92 mlwydd oed. Fodd bynnag, mae'n anodd sicrhau cyllid i'r rheilffordd gul hon.

Nid yw'r cwmni cyfyngedig preifat yn meddu ar statws elusen ac ni all ei gael. Nid yw'n gymwys i gael y cannoedd o filoedd o bunnoedd a roddwyd i reilffordd Llangollen. Er hynny, mae'n gymwys i dderbyn grantiau'r bwrdd croeso ar gyfer prosiectau addas. Yn y blynnyddoedd diwethaf, derbyniodd grant i adnewyddu'r siop, i roi wyneb newydd ar y platfform ac i brynu locomotif diesel. Rhaid iddo ariannu ei gyfran ef o gynlluniau o'r fath o'i refeniw a'i fenthyciadau ac, os nad yw'r cyfnod o'r Pasg i fis Medi'n cynhyrchu digon o refeniw, bydd y cwmni mewn anhawster. Bu'n ddymuniad gan y cwmni rheilffordd erioed i ymestyn y llinell i dref y Bala a'i rhedeg o gwmpas pen y llyn, ond methodd â chael cefnogaeth Parc Cenedlaethol Eryri a'r cyngor; mae'r cynllun wedi'i atal am gyfnod amhenodol.

Mae buddsoddi mewn gweledigaeth hirdymor ar gyfer unrhyw ardal yn gofyn meddwl ochrol a dadl ar y rhesymau dros werthuso ailddatblygiad llinell. Rhaid i rywun ystyried ai budd yr economi wledig neu welliannau cymunedol yw'r cymhelliaid, ynteu creu llwybr newydd neu amgen i gyrraedd y gefnwladd neu brofiad i ymwelwyr neu, o bosibl, cyfuniad o'r materion hyn yw'r bwriad.

unique selling point is that it is a holiday experience based around public transport and travelling on foot, without the use of cars. A car-free model has proven successful in many existing projects. In the context of developing tourism, the gain would be increased access via a sustainable transport route. At the moment, 90 per cent of visitors to Wales travel by car; that percentage should be reduced.

The Strategic Rail Authority is currently charged with setting up the Wales and Borders rail franchise and intends to let a 15-year enhanceable franchise with five-year review points. In a nutshell, it is a Treasury-driven lowest cost scenario, not an uplifting vision and economic investment to improve Wales's deprived rural economy in areas such as the Dee valley on the Ruabon to Barmouth line. The Treasury holds the purse strings and, as we say in Welsh, '*diwedd y gân yw'r geiniog*'—at the end of the day, it is money that counts.

It is vital to have a vision of investment in transport infrastructure to regenerate many of these unconnected rural beauty spots such as the Dee valley on the Ruabon to Barmouth line. Such areas could be revitalised and increase their gross domestic product this way, as well as being opened up to the rest of the UK, Europe and even the world. We can draw parallels with the north-south rail link because we do not have a realistic north-south connection other than through England. It is highly unusual for a country to lack ease of movement from one end to the other and to have such an incongruous link to its capital. Our geography and history has dictated this through our being tied to England and having most major routes run from east to west, as noted in the 1999 Babtie report.

The Assembly needs to overcome these out-of-date legacies if it is to be an effective instrument of government, regeneration and renewal and to be pertinent and acceptable to

Yn gryno, mae hwn yn senario a yrrir gan y Trysorlys yn seiliedig ar y gost isaf, yn hytrach na gweledigaeth ddyrchafol a buddsoddiad economaidd i wella economi wledig ddifreintiedig Cymru mewn ardaloedd fel dyffryn Dyfrdwy rhwng Rhiwabon ac Abermo. Gan y Trysorlys y mae llinynnau'r pwrs ac, fel y dywedwn yn y Gymraeg, diwedd y gân yw'r geiniog.

Mae'n hollbwysig cael gweledigaeth o fuddsoddi yn y seilwaith trafnidiaeth i adfywio llawer o'r mannau hardd digyswllt yng nghefn gwlad fel dyffryn Dyfrdwy rhwng Rhiwabon ac Abermo. Gellid ailfywio i ardal o'r fath a chynyddu eu cynyrrch mewnwladol crynswth fel hyn, yn ogystal â'u hagor i weddill y DU, Ewrop a hyd yn oed y byd. Gallwn gymharu hyn â'r cyswllt rheilffordd o'r gogledd i'r de, gan nad oes gennym gyswllt ymarferol o'r gogledd i'r de heblaw am yr un drwy Loegr. north Wales. We could spend all day discussing other routes. For example, as was pointed out to me recently, the former links in the east from north to south, which could encompass the whole area from Newtown to Newport, and then, in the west, from Holyhead to Carmarthen. That could be started by simply linking the Conwy valley line Maentwrog Road station to Llandecwyn halt, creating a link between Holyhead and Aberystwyth, and then reopening the Aberystwyth and Carmarthen section. That would provide a possible four-hour Bangor to Cardiff journey on the west side.

A Carmarthen business recently reported that access to Devon was easy, but not to north Wales because of the lack of rail transport. Such a route would also connect the growing university towns of Bangor, Aberystwyth, Lampeter, Carmarthen and Cardiff, with easy links to Swansea and Pontypridd.

This vision for regeneration could contribute substantially to the regeneration of all economically underdeveloped areas of Wales. Much of the route runs through Objective 1 areas, which could be an important financial factor. For example, on the Conwy valley line, I believe that Alfred McAlpine Slate, which owns the quarry in Blaenau Ffestiniog, plans to remove the slate waste from the town by rail. It is believed that they are ready to invest in the Conwy valley line to upgrade it to the necessary standard. I believe that the University of Wales, Lampeter is interested and willing to support the proposal.

In conclusion, the title of my speech is 'A Parallel for Wales'. To reconnect communities we need an adequately funded, integrated transport system. That would be a hugely beneficial investment to regenerate dying communities as opposed to penny-pinching. It would run in parallel with the inevitable developments of environmentally friendly lorries and cars. This is my vision to meaningfully reconnect Wales. Without

I note with great interest that Her Majesty, the Queen, who will address us this afternoon, visited Dolau on the beautiful Heart of Wales line for her picnic in mid Wales. That line is also starved of infrastructure investment. The first time that I travelled on that line I thought that there was a huge problem because the train travelled at about 5 miles per hour. However, the guard told me that they could not go any faster due to the infrastructure. The royal train has been pulled by the beautifully preserved steam locomotive, 'Duchess of Sutherland'. I hope that that bodes well for our future rail system.

I call on the Minister for Environment, Sue Essex, to commit funds to cover an adequate study of this vision, which is supported by many key players, including local government, the tourism industry—whose representatives I have already spoken to—and, humbly, myself. I will allow time for Peter Rogers to speak.

Peter Rogers: I welcome any opportunity to speak on an alternative form of transport. The recently introduced free bus passes for senior citizens has been a great success and has provided an opportunity to improve bus routes and services throughout the country. Eleanor's proposal can only help another alternative form of transport, namely the railways. To join Wales together we must have a greater emphasis and understanding of what railways can do. Even in terms of the route that she advocates, it is an important start for people to understand the importance of what it can do for Wales. We must get young people to think of modes of transport

Un o brif amcanion Llywodraeth Cynulliad Cymru yn ‘Cynllun i Gymru 2001’ a’i fframwaith trafnidiaeth yw datblygu a chynnal rhwydweithiau trafnidiaeth i ehangu dewis a chyfleoedd trafnidiaeth cyfleus a fforddiadwy i unigolion, busnesau a chymunedau.

The Deputy Minister for Rural Affairs, Culture and Environment (Delyth Evans): The Minister, Sue Essex, cannot be present today. She apologises for her absence and has asked me to speak on her behalf.

The Assembly Government shares your aspiration for better rail connections. One of the Welsh Assembly Government's key aims in 'A Plan for Wales 2001' and its transport framework is to develop and support a transport infrastructure to extend choice and opportunity for convenient and affordable transport to individuals, businesses and communities.

There is a strong lobby of rail enthusiasts—whom you have met, Eleanor, as we all have, I am sure—who have, over the years, campaigned for reopening railways in many parts of Wales for a variety of reasons. These include travelling to work and visitor enjoyment, not only between Ruabon and Barmouth, but also along the west coast of Wales between Bangor and Carmarthen, and also the link between Cardiff and Brecon.

Everyone who wishes to see such a scheme is under pressure to develop a business plan in order to see what the cost and the implications would be.

Brian Hancock: It links into the mainstream, so that we can all get to Ruabon and Barmouth. If we are talking about linking areas of Wales and generating access to work and tourism, it is an important point. The report mentions lack of funding and safety issues, and states that it will be 2009 or even later before they can work on this. I am concerned about safety issues that have arisen about the connection at Newport.

Delyth Evans: I am sure that the Minister will have noted your concerns, Brian.

O ran ailagor y rheilffordd o Riwabon i Abermo, nid oes dadansoddiad manwl wedi'i wneud o gost tebygol y cynllun hwn. Delyth Evans: Yr wyf yn sicr y bydd y Gweinidog wedi nodi'ch pryderon, Brian.

On reopening the Ruabon to Barmouth railway line, a detailed analysis of the likely cost of this scheme is not available. However, considering the experience of similar projects, we estimate that it would cost between £2 million and £3 million per mile where the trackbed still exists. Where the trackbed does not exist, we estimate a figure of £6 million per mile. If you consider that there are 55 miles of track between Ruabon and Barmouth, the cost of such a scheme would be about £300 million. These costs would depend on the amount of land that would need to be reacquired, the purchase of property that had been built on the line since its closure, and the infrastructure that would need to be renovated or replaced, such as bridges, embankments, cuttings, station facilities and signalling equipment. Therefore, the cost and implications of any such scheme would be significant.

In a short debate in May 2001, Janet Ryder referred to plans to extend the Llangollen railway to Corwen and Ruabon. You have referred to that, Eleanor. The tourist line currently runs between Llangollen and Carrog, and follows some of the original track's route between Ruabon and Barmouth for seven and a half miles. Janet subsequently tabled a question earlier this year asking how much assistance the Assembly would give to help Llangollen

You also mentioned the Strategic Rail Authority. No financial support can be offered by the SRA or Railtrack, in administration, to support restoring a link to Ruabon. Llangollen railway is privately owned and is classified as a steam heritage railway. It does not form an integral part of the UK rail network and cannot therefore be part of the Wales franchise. However, as you know, the Heritage Commission, the Wales Tourist Board and the European regional development fund have provided support to the Llangollen railway. This funding has been used to develop the route and facilities between Llangollen and Carrog, but not to establish a link to the main rail network at either Ruabon or Barmouth.

It is interesting to note in this context that a connection to Ruabon is not included in the transport plans of either Denbighshire County Council or Wrexham County Borough Council. Denbighshire council explained that, with regard to Llangollen, the unitary development plan aims to safeguard the former trackbed and adjoining land for the extension of the railway from Carrog to Corwen, in the direction of Barmouth, and the provision of a terminus and associated facilities for Corwen. There is no mention of

railway. The Minister explained at the time that no assistance would be forthcoming for this project from the Assembly. The trackbed had not been maintained in the past and there have been some developments along the line since then. It would therefore be difficult and expensive to restore the railway line, and a strong economic case would have to be made to do so.

Unfortunately, restrictions on the transport budget prevent us from funding the kind of infrastructure projects that you mention. We must give priority to maintaining existing lines, lines that currently serve a sufficient number of travellers, and lines that could be improved for passenger trains. For example, we are already doing this with our plans to reopen the Vale of Glamorgan railway line and to restore the train to Ebbw Vale.

Mae'n ddiddorol nodi yn y cyd-destun hwn nad yw'r cyswllt â Rhiwabon wedi'i gynnwys yng nghynlluniau trafnidiaeth Cyngor Sir Ddinbych na Chyngor Bwrdeistref Sirol Wrecsam. Eglurodd Cyngor Sir Ddinbych, mewn perthynas â Llangollen, fod y cynllun datblygu unedol yn ceisio diogelu'r hen drac a'r tir cyfagos ar gyfer ymestyn y rheilffordd o Garrog i Gorwen, i gyfeiriad Abermo, a darparu gorsaf derfynol a chyfleusterau cysylltiedig ar gyfer Corwen. Nid oes sôn am ei

an eastward extension toward Ruabon.

The Welsh Assembly Government is pleased that steps have been taken to resume the process of establishing a Wales and borders rail franchise, possibly with a 15-year franchise as you mentioned. We expect this franchise to be in place as quickly as possible and for it to lead to real improvements in services, making a positive contribution to economic growth, accessibility and mobility in Wales. The development of a single Wales and borders franchise will offer greater operational flexibility to the successful operator, particularly given the reduction in competition for key rail paths. The Assembly will work closely with the SRA to ensure that we have an operator that will, over time, introduce improved services in line with our commitments in the transport framework, reflecting the recommendations of the public transport review undertaken by the Environment, Planning and Transport Committee. Unfortunately, as I explained, this does not leave room, financially, for us or the SRA to support re-opening the line from Ruabon to Barmouth to passengers. Thank you for raising this matter in the Assembly.

Today it is my pleasure to invite you to address National Assembly Members. Her Majesty the Queen.

Her Majesty the Queen: Mr Presiding Officer, Members of the National Assembly for Wales, it is my pleasure to address you on the last day of what has been a wonderful tour of Wales. The Duke of Edinburgh and I have greatly appreciated the welcome that we have received in the places we have visited, large and small, from Bangor to Newport.

Here in Cardiff bay, we can see around us the imprint of the history of Wales. A thousand years ago, this was a piece of marsh ground forming part of the disputed kingdom of Glamorgan, ruled over by descendants of Rhodri the Great. One hundred years ago, in the first year of my great-grandfather's reign, this site was part of one of the busiest ports in the world, exporting almost 19 million tonnes of coal from the thriving pits of south Wales.

When I came to the throne, Cardiff's port had

our gratitude for your work for Wales, the United Kingdom and the Commonwealth throughout your reign. Speaking personally, I was very moved that you placed spirituality, and service to others, at the centre of your Jubilee celebrations. It was a privilege for me to represent the National Assembly, along with my fellow Presiding Officers from Scotland and Northern Ireland, at a memorable service in St Paul's Cathedral. I am sure that you will agree that the musical joy of the occasion was enhanced by Huw Williams, the brilliant Welsh organist.

Ei Mawrhydi, y Frenhines: Lywydd, Aelodau Cynulliad Cenedlaethol Cymru, mae'n bleser gennylf eich annerch ar y diwrnod olaf o'r hyn a fu'n daith ragorol drwy Gymru. Mae Dug Caeredin a minnau wedi tra gwerthfawrogi'r croeso a gawsom yn y lleoedd mawr a mân yr ymwelasom â hwy, o Fangor i Gasnewydd.

Yma ym mae Caerdydd, gallwn weld argraff hanes Cymru o'n cwmpas. Fil o flynyddoedd yn ôl, darn o gors oedd hwn a oedd yn rhan o deyrnas ddadleuol Morgannwg, a reolid gan ddisgynyddion Rhodri Fawr. Gan mlynedd yn ôl, ym mlwyddyn gyntaf teyrnasiad fy hen daid, yr oedd y fangre hon yn rhan o un o'r porthladdoedd prysuraf yn y byd, a allforiai ymron i 19 miliwn o dunelli metrig o lo o lofeydd ffyniannus de Cymru.

Pan ddeuthum i'r orsedd, yr oedd porthladd

already begun to change. The rise and fall of businesses due to the vagaries of supply and demand, and to alterations in the use of raw materials or in technology, are never easy. However, Wales is overcoming its difficulties. Over the last decade, new life has been breathed into this area. Hotels, marinas, exhibition centres, restaurants and residential and commercial properties have replaced the docks of the past.

Opposite this Assembly building, the new Wales Millennium Centre, which will be a base for the Welsh National Opera and other important cultural institutions, is being built where railway lines once ran. The growth and innovation in Cardiff bay is also found elsewhere in Wales. More than 70,000 people are now employed by overseas companies that have been attracted here.

In this Chamber, you are forging a new element in the constitution of this country, following the steady evolution of the way Wales has been governed over the last 50 years. The significance of the change that occurred in 1998 was that administrative devolution was replaced by a system which was to be more accountable to the electorate. It is an example of how our system of government can adjust to new demands peacefully and democratically.

I am not sure what Rhodri the Great, or indeed King Edward VII, would have made of this Assembly, or of present day Wales, but, as your Queen, I follow with great interest the work of the Parliaments and Assemblies of the United Kingdom. I hope and pray that you, as Members of the National Assembly for Wales, will continue to work together to serve the common good and the people of this proud and beautiful land. [Applause.]

You are celebrating your Golden Jubilee and heading expectantly and confidently forward to your Diamond Jubilee. We are a new

Gwelir y twf a'r arloesedd a geir ym mae Caerdydd mewn mannau eraill yng Nghymru hefyd. Bellach, cyflogir mwy na 70,000 o bobl mewn cwmniau tramor a ddenwyd yma.

Yn y Siambra hon, yr ydych yn ffurfio elfen newydd yng nghyfansoddiad y wlad hon, gan ddilyn y datblygu cyson a fu yn y dull o lywodraethu Cymru dros y 50 mlynedd diwethaf. Pwysigrwydd y newid a fu yn 1998 oedd bod datganoli gweinyddol wedi'i ddisodli gan system a oedd i fod yn fwy atebol i'r etholwyr. Mae'n engrhaift o'r modd y gall ein system o lywodraeth addasu i ofynion newydd yn heddychlon ac yn ddemocratiaidd.

Nid wyf yn sicr beth a feddyliai Rhodri Mawr, neu'n wir y Brenin Edward VII, am y Cynulliad hwn, neu am y Gymru gyfoes, ond, fel eich Brenhines, yr wyf yn dilyn gyda diddordeb waith Seneddau a Chynulliadau'r Deyrnas Unedig. Gobeithiaf a gweddiaf y byddwch chi, fel Aelodau Cynulliad Cenedlaethol Cymru, yn parhau i weithio gyda'ch gilydd er budd holl bobl y wlad falch a phrydferth hon. [Cymeradwyaeth.]

The First Minister: Your Majesty, thank you for your kind words and for your endorsement of our activities.

Yr ydych yn dathlu'ch Jiwbilí Aur ac yn anelu'n ddisgwylgar ac yn hyderus am eich Jiwbilí Ddeimwnt. Yr ydym ni'n sefydliad

institution barely three years old. We are only celebrating our anthracite Jubilee but, as any geologist will tell you, in time and under the pressure of events, anthracite will turn into diamond, if not gold. We are new, one of the youngest democracies in the world, but our national flag, *y Ddraig Goch*, is the oldest. We are unique in that respect; the only nation in the world to enter the third millennium with the same national flag with which we entered the second millennium. *Y Ddraig Goch* was already recognised in the age of Rhodri Fawr. Dewi Sant, our patron saint, had emerged as a towering Christian figure some centuries before. The Eisteddfod came about slightly later, and, later again, the three feathers. The leek became a national emblem around the time of Owain Glyndŵr, although partially supplanted by the greater delicacy of the daffodil at the 1911 investiture ceremony in Caernarfon. This was a masterpiece of floral spin over vegetable substance by David Lloyd George, one of the giants of Welsh, British and European politics.

Our national anthem, *Hen Wlad fy Nhadau*, emerged in the industrial era, as did the red jersey worn with such pride over the years by our national rugby, football and other sports teams, and borrowed with such great and victorious effect—along with two Owens—by England in the match against Argentina last week. While on the subject of sport, if there is one complaint about this Golden Jubilee—this is the only chance I will have to refer to it—it is that in 1952 Wales won the triple crown and, in 1977, your Silver Jubilee year, Wales won the triple crown again. What went wrong with this arrangement in 2002?

Wales entered the third millennium with all these symbols of our pride in our nationhood, but with one key missing element added—our National Assembly and the ability to run our own domestic devolved agenda. You are the reigning Monarch of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland. It is a very long name, not as long as

Daeth yr Eisteddfod ychydig yn ddiweddarach ac, yn ddiweddarach byth, y tair pluen. Daeth y genhinen yn arwyddlun cenedlaethol tuag adeg Owain Glyndŵr, er iddi gael ei disodli'n rhannol gan y genhinen Bedr fwy llednais yn seremoni'r arwisgo yn 1911 yng Nghaernarfon. Yr oedd hynny'n gampwaith o greu delwedd flodeuol ar draul sylwedd llysieuol gan David Lloyd George, un o gewri gwleidyddiaeth Cymru, Prydain ac Ewrop.

Ymddangosodd ein hanthem genedlaethol, *Hen Wlad fy Nhadau*, yn yr oes ddiwydiannol, fel y gwnaeth y crys coch a wisgir gyda'r fath falchder dros y blynnyddoedd gan ein timau cenedlaethol mewn rygbi, pêl-droed a chwaraeon eraill, ac a fenthyciwyd gyda'r fath effaith fawr a buddugoliaethus—ynghyd â dau Owen—gan Loegr yn y gêm yn erbyn yr Ariannin yr wythnos diwethaf. Wrth sôn am chwaraeon, os oes cwyn ynghyllch y Jiwbili Aur hon—dyma'r unig gyfle a gaf i gyfeirio ati—honno yw bod Cymru wedi ennill y goron driphlyg yn 1952, a'i bod, yn 1977, ym mlwyddyn eich Jiwbili Arian, wedi ennill y goron driphlyg eto. Beth a aeth o'i le ar y trefniant hwn yn 2002?

Aeth Cymru i'r trydydd mileniwm gyda'r holl symbolau hyn o'n balchder yn ein cenedligrwydd, a chydag un elfen goll yn ychwanegol—ein Cynulliad Cenedlaethol a'r gallu i redeg ein hagenda ddatganoledig fewnol ein hunain. Chwi yw Brenhines deyrnasol Teyrnas Unedig Prydain Fawr a Gogledd Iwerddon. Mae'n enw hir iawn, nid

Llanfairpwllgwyngyllgogerychwyrndrobwll-llynnwylwgogogoch, but nevertheless a long name for a nation state. Devolution is perhaps implicit in that name. Its day had to come, and it finally arrived in 1999 by a series of narrow squeaks and miracles, and you were here to open the National Assembly for Wales three years ago.

I ask myself sometimes when will this Assembly be hallowed in the same way in Wales as our national anthem, our patron saint, the Eisteddfod, the leek, the daffodil, the three feathers, the red jersey and y Ddraig Goch? Perhaps it will be long after you have surpassed your Diamond Jubilee, and certainly long after I am boring fellow denizens of the saloon bar witless with my political war stories. One day, the number of people who say 'Thank God we live in Wales', will exceed the number who say 'What has the Assembly ever done for us?'. We are laying the foundations now. If we apply ourselves with faith in our future, that day will dawn.
