Cwestiynau i'r Gweinidog dros Ddiwylliant, Chwaraeon a'r Gymraeg Questions to the Minister for Culture, Sport and the Welsh Language

Swyddogaethau a Chyfrifoldebau Cyngor Celfyddyddau Cymru Functions and Responsibilities of the Arts Council of Wales

C1 Rhodri Glyn Thomas: A oes unrhyw gynlluniau i gyflwyno newidiadau i swyddogaethau a chyfrifoldebau Cyngor Celfyddyddau Cymru? (OAQ17655)

The Minister for Culture, Sport and the Welsh Language (Jenny Randerson): The Arts Council of Wales has recently revised its structure, and it should now be given the opportunity to bed down. There are no plans at present to introduce changes to its functions and responsibilities, but a quinquennial review is planned for later this financial year, together with the arts council's review of its new structure, following 12 months of implementation. The Culture Committee and I will carefully consider any recommendations arising from those reviews.

Rhodri Glyn Thomas: Cyhoeddwyd papur ymgynghori sy'n awgrymu y dylai Cyngor Celfyddyddau Cymru drosglwyddo'i gyfrifoldebau am ariannu llenyddiaeth i Gyngor Llyfrau Cymru ac i'r Academi Gymreig. Mae rhai yn teimlo y gallai hynny fod yn fuddiol i awduron a chyhoeddwr Cymru. A fydd y Pwyllgor Diwylliant yn trafod goblygiadau hynny?

Jenny Randerson: In line with what happened for previous transfers of funding, it would be appropriate for the Committee to discuss the outcomes of the arts council's current consultation exercise. Perhaps it would be more appropriate to do so when arts council officials are present, but we will certainly find a way to discuss it.

Tom Middlehurst: Given that national flagship companies account for a large part of the Arts Council of Wales's budget, will you consider funding institutions with national

Q1 Rhodri Glyn Thomas: Are there any plans to introduce changes to the functions and responsibilities of the Arts Council of Wales? (OAQ17655)

Y Gweinidog dros Ddiwylliant, Chwaraeon a'r Gymraeg (Jenny Randerson): Mae Cyngor Celfyddyddau Cymru wedi diwygio'i strwythur yn ddiweddar, a dylid rhoi cyfle'n awr iddo ymsefydlogi. Nid oes unrhyw fwriad ar hyn o bryd i gyflwyno newidiadau i'w swyddogaethau a'i gyfrifoldebau, ond bwriedir cynnal adolygiad pum-mlynnyddol yn ddiweddarach yn y flwyddyn ariannol hon, ynghyd ag adolygiad cyngor y celfyddyddau o'i strwythur newydd, ar ôl 12 mis o'i weithredu. Bydd y Pwyllgor Diwylliant a minnau'n ystyried yn ofalus unrhyw argymhellion sy'n codi o'r adolygiadau hynny.

Rhodri Glyn Thomas: A consultation paper has been published suggesting that the Arts Council of Wales should transfer its responsibility for funding literature to the Welsh Books Council and the Welsh Academy. Some feel that that could be beneficial to authors and publishers in Wales. Will the Culture Committee discuss the implications of that?

Jenny Randerson: Yn unol â'r hyn a ddigwyddodd ar gyfer trosglwyddiadau arian blaenorol, byddai'n briodol i'r Pwyllgor drafod canlyniadau ymgynghoriad presennol cyngor y celfyddyddau. Efallai y byddai'n fwy priodol gwneud hynny pan yw swyddogion cyngor y celfyddyddau'n bresennol, ond byddwn yn sicr o ganfod modd i'w drafod.

Tom Middlehurst: O ystyried mai cwmnïau cenedlaethol o bwys sy'n mynd â rhan helaeth o gyllideb Cyngor Celfyddyddau Cymru, a wnewch ystyried ariannu

status in Wales directly from your own budget? We currently fund some of our major cultural institutions, such as the National Museums and Galleries of Wales and the National Library of Wales, to name only two. That would leave the arts council free to do its important work in developing community arts.

Jenny Randerson: Several people have put forward that opinion, but I do not intend to do that at present. However, as I signalled with the funding of chamber orchestras, I do not regard the Arts Council of Wales as having a monopoly on the provision of grants. Section 32 of the Government of Wales Act 1998 provides us with flexibility. However, that would be a big decision to make, following a turbulent time for the arts council, and I am not considering it at present.

Glyn Davies: Sut ydych yn sicrhau bod Cyngor Celfyddydau Cymru yn rhoi chwarae teg i grwpiau gwirfoddol fel y grŵp yn Nhreffyclo, Powys, sy'n ceisio gwella neuadd eglwys St Edwards er mwyn parhau i hyrwyddo'r celfyddydau perfformio?

Jenny Randerson: The arts council now functions within the overall strategy of 'Creative Future: Cymru Creadigol', which I announced last February, and which gives a strong role to voluntary groups. The arts council's current five-year plan, on which it is consulting, is set firmly within that strategy, and strongly reflects the role of voluntary groups. The arts council has an excellent record in providing lottery grants to Powys, which has received over £7 million. That would probably be the route for that sort of group to take.

sefydliadau sydd â statws cenedlaethol yng Nghymru'n uniongyrchol o'ch cyllideb eich hun? Ar hyn o bryd yr ydym yn ariannu rhai o'n prif sefydliadau diwylliannol, fel Amgueddfeydd ac Orielau Cenedlaethol Cymru a Llyfrgell Genedlaethol Cymru, ac enwi dim ond dau. Byddai hynny'n rhyddhau cyngor y celfyddydau i wneud ei waith pwysig o ddatblygu celfyddydau cymunedol.

Jenny Randerson: Mae sawl un wedi cynnig y farn honno, ond nid wyf yn bwriadu gwneud hynny ar hyn o bryd. Fodd bynnag, fel y dangosais yn achos ariannu cerddorfeidd siambr, nid wyf yn ystyried bod gan Gyngor Celfyddydau Cymru fonopoli ar ddarparu grantiau. Mae adran 32 Deddf Llywodraeth Cymru 1998 yn rhoi hyblygrwydd i ni. Fodd bynnag, byddai hynny'n benderfyniad mawr, ar ôl cyfnod cythryblus i gyngor y celfyddydau, ac nid wyf yn ei ystyried ar hyn o bryd.

Glyn Davies: How are you ensuring that the Arts Council of Wales gives a fair deal to voluntary groups such as that in Knighton, Powys, which is trying to improve St Edwards church hall in order to continue to promote the performing arts?

Jenny Randerson: Mae cyngor y celfyddydau'n gweithredu bellach yn ôl strategaeth gyffredinol 'Creative Future: Cymru Creadigol', a gyhoeddais fis Chwefror diwethaf, sy'n rhoi rôl bwerus i grwpiau gwirfoddol. Mae cynllun pum mlynedd presennol cyngor y celfyddydau, y mae'n ymgynghori arno, wedi'i osod yn bendant o fewn y strategaeth honno, ac mae'n rhoi lle amlwg i rôl grwpiau gwirfoddol. Mae gan gyngor y celfyddydau record ragorol o ran darparu grantiau loteri i Bowys, sydd wedi derbyn dros £7 miliwn. Mae'n debyg mai hwnnw fyddai'r llwybr i grŵp o'r fath ei ddilyn.

Adeiladu Canolfan Mileniwm Cymru Building the Wales Millennium Centre

Q2 Alison Halford: How many north Wales contractors are/will be involved in building the Wales Millennium Centre? (OAQ17649)

C2 Alison Halford: Faint o gontactwyr o ogledd Cymru sydd/a fydd yn gysylltiedig ag adeiladu Canolfan Mileniwm Cymru? (OAQ17649)

Jenny Randerson: I am pleased to say that we expect to procure slate for the front of the building from north Wales, worked by north Wales slaters. Subcontracting, however, is still at an early stage, with only the highly specialised steelwork having been subcontracted so far. North Wales contractors may win subcontracted work as the project progresses, and I will be pleased to give you more information when it becomes available.

Alison Halford: I do not have a supplementary question. I am pleased with that answer, but I hope that you will remember the need for jobs for north Wales.

Peter Rogers: Do you agree that there is a danger of promoting the idea that people in north Wales begrudge Cardiff the millennium centre, when the real problem is that such projects do not come to north Wales also?

Jenny Randerson: There is an unfortunate perception that north Wales does not get a full share of the money available, and I hope that, if we reach Alison's second question for today, question 5, I will be able to dispel that, because it is not the case.

Gareth Jones: Yr wyf yn falch o glywed yr ateb i gwestiwn Alison Halford. Wrth sôn am y manteision economaidd a ddaw i'r Gogledd yn sgil datblygiadau yn y brifddinas, yr ydych wedi dweud y bydd Cymru gyfan yn elwa o'r cyleoedd a ddaw os bydd cais Caerdydd i fod yn Brifddinas Diwylliant Ewrop 2008 yn llwyddiannus. A wnewch chi ddatganiad ar y cyleoedd hyn? Pa fanteision economaidd yr ydych yn eu rhagweld ar gyfer y Gogledd?

Jenny Randerson: If Cardiff's bid is successful, that will reflect well on all of Wales. Ideas have flooded into Cardiff from the whole of Wales on projects that can be taken forward in the next few years. I am aware of this, because some of them have come via me. I am delighted that people throughout Wales want to be engaged in this exciting project.

Jenny Randerson: Yr wyf yn falch o ddweud ein bod yn disgwyli caffael llechi ar gyfer blaen yr adeilad o'r Gogledd, wedi'u gweithio gan weithwyr llechi o'r Gogledd. Fodd bynnag, mae'r isgontractio mewn cyfnod cynnar o hyd, a dim ond y gwaith dur tra arbenigol sydd wedi'i isgontractio hyd yn hyn. Efallai y bydd contractwyr o'r Gogledd yn ennill gwaith o dan isgontract wrth i'r prosiect fynd yn ei flaen, a byddaf yn falch o roi rhagor o wybodaeth ichi pan fydd ar gael.

Alison Halford: Nid oes gennyl gwestiwn atodol. Yr wyf yn fodlon ar yr ateb hwnnw, ond gobeithiaf y byddwch yn cofio am yr angen am swyddi i'r Gogledd.

Peter Rogers: A ydych yn cytuno bod perygl o hyrwyddo'r syniad bod pobl y Gogledd yn gwarafun canolfan y mileniwm i Gaerdydd, er mai'r wir broblem yw nad yw prosiectau o'r fath yn dod i'r Gogledd hefyd?

Jenny Randerson: Mae canfyddiad anffodus nad yw'r Gogledd yn cael cyfran lawn o'r arian sydd ar gael, a gobeithiaf, os cyrhaeddwn ail gwestiwn Alison am heddiw, cwestiwn 5, y byddaf yn gallu chwalu'r canfyddiad hwnnw, oherwydd nid felly y mae.

Gareth Jones: I was pleased to hear your answer to Alison Halford's question. In referring to the economic advantages that will come to north Wales as a result of developments in the capital, you have said that the whole of Wales will benefit from the opportunities afforded if Cardiff's bid to be Cultural Capital of Europe 2008 is successful. Will you make a statement on these opportunities? What economic advantages do you anticipate for north Wales?

Jenny Randerson: Os bydd cais Caerdydd yn llwyddo, bydd hynny'n adlewyrchu'n dda ar Gymru gyfan. Mae syniadau wedi llifo i Gaerdydd o Gymru gyfan am brosiectau y gellir eu datblygu yn y blynnyddoedd nesaf hyn. Yr wyf yn ymwybodol o hyn, gan fod rhai ohonynt wedi dod drwof fi. Yr wyf wrth fy modd bod pobl ledled Cymru am gymryd rhan yn y prosiect cyffrous hwn.

**Pecyn Dathlu'r Jiwbilî Aur
The Golden Jubilee Celebrations Toolkit**

Q3 David Davies: What arrangements has the Minister made to distribute the Golden Jubilee celebrations toolkit to organisations and official bodies in Wales? (OAQ17662)

Jenny Randerson: The Golden Jubilee toolkit was distributed in Wales by the Golden Jubilee office in November 2001 to a wide range of local and community bodies. It has been possible to download the toolkit, in English and Welsh, from the Golden Jubilee website since September 2001.

David Davies: What do you say in response to complaints that information on organising the Jubilee celebrations has not been made as readily available as it could have been, and that officialdom has not appeared to be enthusiastic about the Jubilee? Is this Government fully committed to the monarchy and to ensuring that all those who wish to celebrate 50 glorious years of Her Majesty's reign across Wales can do so?

The Presiding Officer: Order. This question is not about the monarchy. It is about the Jubilee celebrations.

Jenny Randerson: The Golden Jubilee toolkits, and the funding of the celebrations, are the responsibility of the Department for Culture, Media and Sport. I am certain that DCMS officials have been no less enthusiastic in Wales than in the rest of the UK. However, the matter is DCMS's responsibility.

C3 David Davies: Pa drefniadau y mae'r Gweinidog wedi'u gwneud ar gyfer dosbarthu pecyn dathlu'r Jiwbilî Aur i sefydliadau a chyrrff swyddogol yng Nghymru? (OAQ17662)

Jenny Randerson: Dosbarthwyd pecyn y Jiwbilî Aur yng Nghymru gan swyddfa'r Jiwbilî Aur yn Nhachwedd 2001 i amrywiaeth eang o gyrff lleol a chymunedol. Mae modd llwytho'r pecyn, yn y Gymraeg a'r Saesneg, i lawr o wefan y Jiwbilî Aur ers Medi 2001.

David Davies: Beth a ddywedwch mewn ymateb i gwynion nad yw'r wybodaeth am drefnu dathliadau'r Jiwbilî ar gael mor rhwydd ag y gallasai fod, ac nad yw'r byd swyddogol wedi ymddangos yn frwdfrydig am y Jiwbilî? A yw'r Llywodraeth hon wedi llwyr ymrwymo i'r frenhiniaeth ac i sicrhau bod pawb sy'n dymuno dathlu'r 50 mlynedd gogoneddus o deyrnasiad Ei Mawrhydi ledled Cymru'n gallu gwneud hynny?

Y Llywydd: Trefn. Nid yw'r cwestiwn hwn yn ymwneud â'r frenhiniaeth. Mae'n ymwneud â dathliadau'r Jiwbilî.

Jenny Randerson: Mae pecynnau'r Jiwbilî Aur, ac ariannu'r dathliadau, yn gyfrifoldeb i'r Adran dros Ddiwylliant, y Cyfryngau a Chwaraeon. Yr wyf yn sicr y bu swyddogion yr adran honno yr un mor frwdfrydig yng Nghymru ag y buont yng ngweddill y DU. Fodd bynnag, yr Adran dros Ddiwylliant, y Cyfryngau a Chwaraeon sy'n gyfrifol am y mater hwn.

**Sianelau Teledu yn Saesneg
TV Channels in English**

David Davies: What is the Minister doing to ensure that all viewers are able to receive the four main television channels in their mother tongues?

The Presiding Officer: Order. That is not the tabled question.

David Davies: Beth y mae'r Gweinidog yn ei wneud i sicrhau bod yr holl wylwyr yn gallu derbyn y pedair prif sianel deledu yn eu mamiaith?

Y Llywydd: Trefn. Nid hwnnw yw'r cwestiwn a gyflwynwyd.

Q4 David Davies: Will the Minister give consideration to ensuring that English-speaking viewers are able to receive all four main television channels in their mother tongue? (OAQ17663)

I apologise, Llywydd. I did not have my glasses on.

Jenny Randerson: You will appreciate, David, that that was a significantly different question.

Broadcasting is not a devolved matter. Three of the four main analogue television channels in Wales broadcast in English only. Furthermore, with the gradual roll-out of digital television, Channel 4 will be available to all viewers in Wales. The majority of programmes broadcast on S4C are in English, with Welsh-language programmes at peak hours. Most of the Welsh programmes may be viewed with English subtitles.

David Davies: Nevertheless, a significant number of people living in largely English-speaking areas of Wales, such as Monmouthshire, cannot receive all the English-language channels. Do you agree that that is unfair and that they should have access to all four television channels in their mother tongue?

Jenny Randerson: The situation is far from satisfactory. It is the mirror-image of the situation Nick Bourne referred to earlier in the term, when he pointed out that people living in east Powys are unable to receive Welsh television. The development of digital television will overcome this. Wales has suffered this situation for many decades and it is not satisfactory. However, I repeat that 75 per cent of the Welsh-language programmes on S4C have English subtitles.

John Griffiths: Do you agree that it is important that all households in Wales can receive BBC Wales, HTV Wales and S4C, and that it should be made as easy as possible for Welsh households to receive Welsh channels? If the people of Wales are to be properly informed about matters which directly affect them, and if we are to ensure that community, civic and political life benefits from better informed participation, it

C4 David Davies: A wnaiff y Gweinidog ystyried sicrhau bod gwylwyr Saesneg eu hiaith yn gallu derbyn y pedair prif sianel deledu yn eu mamaith? (OAQ17663)

Ymddiheuraf, Lywydd. Nid oeddwn yn gwisgo fy sbectol.

Jenny Randerson: Byddwch yn sylweddoli, David, fod y cwestiwn hwnnw'n un tra gwahanol.

Nid yw darlledu'n fater a ddatganolwyd. Mae tair o'r pedair prif sianel deledu analog yng Nghymru'n darlledu yn y Saesneg yn unig. At hynny, wrth i deledu digidol gael ei gyflwyno'n raddol, bydd Channel 4 ar gael i'r holl wylwyr yng Nghymru. Mae'r rhan fwyaf o'r rhagleni a ddarllledir ar S4C yn rhai Saesneg, gyda rhagleni Cymraeg ar yr oriau brig. Gellir gwyliau'r rhan fwyaf o'r rhagleni Cymraeg gydag is-deitlau Saesneg.

David Davies: Er hynny, mae nifer sylweddol o bobl sy'n byw mewn ardaloedd o Gymru sy'n Saesneg eu hiaith gan mwyaf, fel sir Fynwy, yn methu â derbyn yr holl sianeli Saesneg. A ydych yn cytuno bod hynny'n annheg ac y dylent allu derbyn pob un o'r pedair sianel deledu yn eu mamaith?

Jenny Randerson: Mae'r sefyllfa ymhell o fod yn fodhaol. Mae'n adlewyrchiad o'r sefyllfa y cyfeiriodd Nick Bourne ati'n gynharach yn y tymor, pan dynnodd sylw at y ffaith nad yw pobl yn nwyrain Powys yn gallu derbyn teledu o Gymru. Bydd datblygu teledu digidol yn fodd i oresgyn hyn. Mae Cymru'n dioddef y sefyllfa hon ers degawdau lawer ac nid yw'n fodhaol. Fodd bynnag, dywedaf eto fod is-deitlau Saesneg ar gyfer 75 y cant o'r rhagleni Cymraeg ar S4C.

John Griffiths: A ydych yn cytuno'i bod yn bwysig bod pob teulu yng Nghymru'n gallu derbyn BBC Wales, HTV Wales ac S4C, ac y dylid ei gwneud mor rhwydd â phosibl i deuluoedd Cymru dderbyn sianeli Cymru? Os ydym am hysbysu pobl Cymru'n briodol am faterion sy'n effeithio arnynt yn uniongyrchol, ac os ydym i sicrhau bod y bywyd cymunedol, dinesig a gwleidyddol yn cael budd o gyfranogi mwy gwybodus, mae'n

is important that we ensure that provision.

Jenny Randerson: It is important that people receive information about the country in which they live and the events that take place there in their chosen language. That is increasingly important now that the Assembly has been established. I am concerned when I stay in hotels in Wales that only provide English television channels. I would be grateful if Members would complain, as I do, if they come across this problem and ask the management of the hotels to make an effort to receive Welsh television channels.

Owen John Thomas: In the past, you have assured us that you aim to improve the reception of Welsh television channels throughout Wales, possibly by using transmitters on English soil. What action have you taken on this?

Jenny Randerson: I am vigorously discussing the issue with the UK Government and with broadcasters. I attended a meeting at which this issue was addressed earlier this week.

Brian Gibbons: Do you agree that it is important that everyone in Wales can get some television reception? For some, receiving any television, let alone programmes in their mother tongue, is a luxury. Do you agree that the roll-out of digital television means that the proportion of people who will not be able to receive free-to-air television will increase significantly?

Jenny Randerson: I agree that there are major concerns about the roll-out of digital television. I discuss the issue with Kim Howells regularly. The UK Government has set an availability target of 95 per cent. However, at this point, what to do about the other 5 per cent has not been addressed in sufficient detail. I am sure that it will be addressed. There are difficult decisions to be made in the coming years. However, in this day and age, it is unacceptable that anyone should be unable to receive television.

Jenny Randerson: Mae'n bwysig bod pobl yn cael gwybodaeth am y wlad lle y maent yn byw ac am ddigwyddiadau yno yn eu dewis iaith. Mae hynny'n fwyfwy pwysig ers sefydlu'r Cynulliad. Mae'n peri pryder i mi pan arhosaf mewn gwestai yng Nghymru nad ydynt ond yn darparu sianeli teledu o Loegr. Byddwn yn ddiolchgar pe byddai'r Aelodau'n cwyno, fel y gwnaf fi, os ydynt yn profi'r broblem hon a gofyn i reolwyr y gwestai wneud ymdrech i dderbyn sianeli teledu o Gymru.

Owen John Thomas: Yn y gorffennol, yr ydych wedi'n sicrhau mai'ch bwriad yw gwella derbyniad sianeli teledu o Gymru ledled Cymru, efallai drwy ddefnyddio trosglwyddydion yn Lloegr. Pa gamau yr ydych wedi'u cymryd i wireddu hyn?

Jenny Randerson: Yr wyf yn trafod y mater hwn yn egniol gyda Llywodraeth y DU a chyda'r darlledwyr. Bûm yn bresennol mewn cyfarfod lle y trafodwyd y mater hwn yn gynharach yr wythnos hon.

Brian Gibbons: A ydych yn cytuno ei bod yn bwysig bod pawb yng Nghymru'n gallu derbyn rhywfaint o deledu? I rai, mae derbyn rhyw fath o deledu, heb sôn am raglenni yn eu mamiaith, yn foeth. A ydych yn cytuno bod ehangu teledu digidol yn golygu y bydd cyfran fwy o lawer o bobl yn methu â derbyn teledu sydd ar gael am ddim?

Jenny Randerson: Cytunaf fod pryderon mawr ynglŷn â chyflwyno teledu digidol. Yr wyf yn trafod y mater yn rheolaidd â Kim Howells. Mae Llywodraeth y DU wedi gosod targed argaeledd o 95 y cant. Fodd bynnag, ar hyn o bryd, ni thrafodwyd yn ddigon manwl beth y dylid ei wneud am y 5 y cant arall. Yr wyf yn sicr yr ymdrinnir â hynny. Bydd yn rhaid gwneud penderfyniadau anodd yn y blynnyddoedd i ddod. Fodd bynnag, yn yr oes sydd ohoni, mae'n annerbyniol bod rhai nad ydynt yn gallu derbyn teledu.

Y Gyllideb ar gyfer Diwylliant The Culture Budget

Q5 Alison Halford: What percentage of the culture budget has gone to north Wales ventures in the last financial year, and what percentage of the budget is planned to go to north Wales ventures in the current financial year? (OAQ17605)

Jenny Randerson: I hope that Members will bear with me, given the detail in this answer; the culture budget is distributed in many different ways.

The Presiding Officer: Order. Members may bear with the Minister, but I will not. If there is detail, it should be published in appropriate form, that is, in a written statement on the internet. Questions to Ministers is a chance for Members to ask questions, not for Ministers to make surrogate statements.

Jenny Randerson: It is impossible to give an accurate answer without giving at least a bare minimum of detail, Presiding Officer.

The latest round of Arts Council of Wales lottery applications allocated 42 per cent of the total grant available to north Wales. Thirty-one per cent of Sports Council for Wales funding under local development was spent in north Wales last year; 32 per cent expenditure is planned for this year. Since the lottery began, 30 per cent of all regional awards have gone to north Wales. Thirty per cent of the Council of Museums in Wales grants were awarded to north Wales, rising to 36 per cent this year. However, the hard truth is that the only theatre in my area, which you know well, is falling apart and desperately needs a face-lift. Jenny Randerson: I assume that you are referring to the importance of a strategic approach. I agree that that is important. Part of my strategy takes account of the importance of tourism, and I know that north Wales has particular attractions to offer. My answer to Alison's original question shows that north Wales gets more than its share of grant, given its population. It is important that we consider the potential of projects, rather than population figures alone.

The music development fund has also committed £8 million over three years through the grants for education support and training scheme, and funding for that programme has been extended for a further year.

Jenny Randerson: The music development fund has been extended for a further year—it was originally to be for three years—while we consider a youth arts fund and youth music fund. I am aware of the issues and

Carwyn Jones: I know the farmer and I am aware of the proposed project. He has e-mailed me this morning and I will ensure that his e-mail is dealt with as quickly as possible and his concerns addressed.

Carwyn Jones: The Assembly Government is committed to supporting and developing the organic sector throughout Wales. A strong organic sector is a key part of our vision to create a future for varied, sustainable and high quality agriculture in Wales.

Owen John Thomas: The image of pure organic food sits well with the idea of an open countryside and fresh air. Production is one thing, but selling that produce is another. What efforts are being made to try to persuade the tourism industry to promote the use of organic food?

Carwyn Jones: We all have a duty to promote tourism by using all kinds of produce from all parts of Wales. When I

Carwyn Jones: You have raised an important question. How seriously should we consider ongoing subsidies? That must be considered in view of what is happening elsewhere in Europe; the UK Government is considering it.

Clwy'r Traed a'r Genau Foot and Mouth Disease

Q4 Alun Cairns: Will the Minister make a statement on any changes that have been introduced regarding the way his department will try to prevent/deal with any future foot and mouth disease outbreak? (OAQ17675)

Carwyn Jones: The responsibility for dealing with a foot and mouth disease outbreak continues to rest with the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs. However, we are in the process of transferring powers, in agreement with DEFRA—which has not registered any objection—to deal with farm animal health issues. We await the results of the Anderson inquiry and the Follett inquiry to be fully briefed on what the future should hold in terms of controlling foot and mouth disease.

Alun Cairns: Why has the UK not banned imports from countries where animals are suffering from foot and mouth disease, and

travel around Wales I am surprised that so many bed and breakfasts advertise English breakfasts rather than a Welsh breakfast. We must develop Welsh food to promote tourism and the image of Wales throughout the world. That is important. Some hotels only offer organic food. That has developed over the last few years. We must promote organic food from Wales, and a group, under the aegis of the Welsh Development Agency's agri-food partnership is considering exactly how that can be done. It is an important part of the way forward for farming in Wales.

Jonathan Morgan: Sut y gall y Cynulliad helpu'r sector organig i sicrhau na chaiff ei danseilio gan fewnforion tramor rhatach a chyfraddau cymhorthdal uwch mewn gwledydd eraill?

Carwyn Jones: Mae'r cyfrifoldeb dros ddelio ag achosion o glwy'r traed a'r genu'n dal i fod gan Adran yr Amgylchedd, Bwyd a Materion Gwledig. Fodd bynnag, yr ydym ar ganol trosglwyddo pwerau, gyda chydysniad yr adran—sydd heb fynegi unrhyw wrthwynebiad—i ymdrin â materion iechyd anifeiliaid fferm. Yr ydym yn disgwl canlyniadau ymchwiliad Anderson ac ymchwiliad Follett er mwyn cael ein briffo'n llawn am yr hyn sy'n debygol o fod yn yr arfaeth o ran rheoli clwy'r traed a'r genu.

Alun Cairns: Pam nad yw'r DU wedi gwahardd mewnforion o wledydd lle y mae anifeiliaid yn dioddef gan glwy'r traed a'r

why does the UK not have border controls similar to those of Ireland, New Zealand and Australia, to check meat imports?

Carwyn Jones: Ireland has no such border controls. I am familiar with the border between Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland and it is completely open. Animals travel back and forth regularly, which allows the subsidy systems of both countries to be investigated. The Irish border is not closed. I accept that New Zealand and Australia have stronger controls than the European Union. The UK has no such power and it would not be effective for it to introduce unilateral power, given the fact that the UK's only international border is porous. However, the EU must consider that carefully, and it is doing so as we speak.

Q5 The Leader of the Welsh Conservatives (Nick Bourne): What discussions has the Minister had with Westminster colleagues regarding the import of illegal meat? (OAQ17676)

Carwyn Jones: I have raised the matter with Margaret Beckett on several occasions in the monthly ministerial meetings of all four UK

Derbyniaf fod gan Seland Newydd ac Awstralia reolaethau cryfach na rhai'r Undeb Ewropeaidd. Nid yw'r DU yn meddu ar bŵer o'r fath ac ni fyddai'n effeithiol iddi gyflwyno pŵer unochrog, o gofio bod unig ffin ryngwladol y DU yn hydraidd. Fodd bynnag, rhaid i'r UE ystyried hynny'n ofalus, ac mae'n gwneud hynny ar hyn o bryd.

The Leader of the Opposition (Ieuan Wyn Jones): As the Minister knows, new regulations are being introduced in England at present to respond to any such event in the future. The Minister knows that England's transmissible spongiform encephalopathies regulations were introduced in April. Will the Minister introduce similar regulations for Wales, and, if so, will he ensure that a detailed discussion is held either in Plenary or in Committee before those regulations become law?

Carwyn Jones: The Committee decides what it discusses. I know that these regulations are being considered in detail in Westminster, and we will consider what steps are necessary when those discussions have been concluded.

administrations. The National Assembly and its officials are represented on the relevant working groups, which are considering the matter at present.

Nick Bourne: You will be aware that there is an ongoing inquiry into illegal meat imports, and written submissions must be in by tomorrow. Will you give an indication of any submissions by the Government in relation to the need to have more stringent controls at ports? As you know, port authorities at present, do not have powers to stop and search, nor do local authorities, although they are given the primary responsibility for control of imports. Her Majesty's Customs and Excise therefore give it a lower control. What is the administration's view on that, and has it formed part of any submission to that Committee?

Carwyn Jones: I understand that the products of animal origin legislation will come into effect on 22 May, giving greater powers to enforcement officers. HM Customs and Excise is looking at running an awareness campaign over the peak summer holiday period and the Metropolitan Police will begin training detective dogs shortly. This needs to be considered carefully; there is scope for tightening up on imports into the EU from countries where foot and mouth disease exists. I have said so publicly on many occasions and it has been reiterated in ministerial meetings.

On Assembly Government actions, we have no power over border controls, but I have written to all airlines using Welsh airports to remind them of their responsibilities in terms of informing passengers that they should not bring meat into the UK from countries where foot and mouth disease is endemic. There are direct flights from those countries to Wales.

Mick Bates: The process of control involves five different agencies, which creates much confusion about jurisdiction. What discussions have you had with your colleagues in the Westminster Government to

Carwyn Jones: Deallaf y bydd y ddeddfwriaeth ar gynhyrchion sy'n tarddu o anifeiliaid yn dod i rym ar 22 Mai, gan roi mwy o bwerau i swyddogion gorfodi. Mae Tollau Tramor a Chartref Ei Mawrhydi'n ystyried cynnal ymgyrch hybu ymwybyddiaeth yn ystod cyfnod brig gwyliau'r haf a bydd Heddlu Llundain yn dechrau hyfforddi cŵn synhwyro cyn hir. Carwyn Jones: HM Customs and Excise has primary responsibility for dealing with imports. It is charged with that responsibility at ports and airports. The new legislation to be introduced will give enforcement officers greater powers; the lead agency must be HM Customs and Excise.

Rhodri Glyn Thomas: The Minister referred to the dangers that arise when meat is illegally imported. That can create all sorts of animal health problems in this country. The Minister and the Labour Government are only too happy to introduce stringent measures when dealing with farmers, but when it is a matter of controlling the importation of illegal meat, the Minister seems to take a very different line.

Carwyn Jones: Rhodri Glyn did not listen to my answer. I said many times that we need to consider tightening the current regulations across Europe. The current restrictions on movement were put in place after consultation with vets. I hope that those restrictions will be relaxed again in the summer.

Q6 Kirsty Williams: Will the Minister make a statement on any discussions he has had with his UK counterpart regarding agri-monetary compensation for livestock? (OAQ17641)

Carwyn Jones: It is a matter of public record that I have consistently pressed the UK Government to claim the maximum amount of agri-monetary compensation available, and I am extremely disappointed that it has felt unable to draw down that support.

Kirsty Williams: Will you therefore take unilateral action to support the livestock industry, particularly the dairy sector, given that many farmers are leaving it to go into meat production, which will affect the whole

livestock industry in Wales?

Carwyn Jones: The scope for unilateral support outside the common agricultural policy is limited, as are the resources that the Assembly Government has at its disposal. However, we will do all that we can to assist dairy farmers in particular, who are currently experiencing difficulties.

David Melding: Have you met with a member of the Treasury team to discuss this matter?

Carwyn Jones: The Assembly does not deal directly with the Treasury on these matters; the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs is the lead agency. We make our representations to DEFRA, which then takes up the matter with the Treasury. That practice is outlined in the concordats and has always been in place in terms of the Assembly's relationship with certain Whitehall departments.

Carwyn Jones: The Assembly Government places a high priority on building safer communities throughout Wales. The Crime and Disorder Act 1998 has created a

Rhodri Glyn Thomas: As far as the milk sector is concerned, would you accept that current milk prices are affected by the strength of the pound, which is a direct result of the monetary policies of the Labour Government in Westminster? This is merely compensation for the losses that farmers have suffered as a result of the Government's policies. Why does he not insist that DEFRA draws down the money to which farmers in Wales are entitled?

Carwyn Jones: The only long-term solution to this problem is to join the euro.

Q8 Ann Jones: Will the Minister make a statement on access to public services for people living in rural areas? (OAQ17617)

C8 Ann Jones: A wnaiff y Gweinidog ddatganiad ar fynediad i wasanaethau cyhoeddus ar gyfer trigolion cefn gwlad? (OAQ17617)

Carwyn Jones: The Assembly Government considers access to public services for people in rural areas to be a key element of its strategy to support and develop rural Wales. I am exploring a number of options in taking forward the document 'A Winning Wales' in rural areas and I am working closely with the rural partnership, Assembly sponsored public bodies and other partners on a range of issues. People in rural areas have a number of concerns regarding the loss of services. However, we must ensure that everything possible is done to preserve those services.

Carwyn Jones: Mae Llywodraeth y Cynlliad o'r farn bod mynediad i wasanaethau cyhoeddus ar gyfer pobl mewn ardaloedd gwledig yn elfen allweddol yn ei strategaeth i gynnal a datblygu'r Gymru wledig. Yr wyf yn ymchwilio i nifer o ddewisiadau wrth fwrw ymlaen â'r ddogfen 'Cymru'n Ennill' mewn ardaloedd gwledig ac yr wyf yn cydweithio'n agos â'r bartneriaeth wledig, cyrff cyhoeddus a noddir gan y Cynlliad a phartneriaid eraill ar amryw o faterion. Mae gan bobl mewn ardaloedd gwledig nifer o bryderon ynghylch colli gwasanaethau. Fodd bynnag, rhaid inni sicrhau y gwneir popeth posibl i gynnal y gwasanaethau hynny.

Ann Jones: Post offices have always been places where people can carry out a wide

Ann Jones: Mae'n bosibl erioed i bobl wneud amrywiaeth eang o fusnes llywodraeth

range of government business. That role will be further strengthened by current plans to make local post offices one stop shops. Their role in the community could be further strengthened if the rural post office network could also be used to access local government services, to provide advice on disabled parking badge applications, bus passes, home improvement grants and so on. Will you raise with local authorities the matter of the huge potential of rural post offices to help them connect with local people?

Carwyn Jones: I have great sympathy with that viewpoint, Ann. It is important that local authorities support rural post offices. That is one of the functions of local government: to assist with services in their own areas. Consignia's current restructuring plans do not affect rural post offices. However, the rural partnership, via the Wales co-operative centre, is currently assessing the scope for developing the one stop shops that you mentioned so that the local shop, pub, post office and any other services are located in the same building. The post office becomes, in effect, a centre for community services. We want to pursue that strongly.

Y Strategaeth i Bobl Hŷn The Older Persons' Strategy

The Deputy Presiding Officer: I have selected amendment 1 in the name of Jonathan Morgan and amendments 2 and 3 in the name of Jocelyn Davies.

The Deputy Minister for Health (Brian Gibbons): I propose that

the National Assembly

1. receives and notes the contents of the report of the advisory group on a strategy for older people in Wales which was e-mailed to Members on 9 May 2002;

2. in accordance with the Plenary resolution agreed on 1 March 2001, confirms as Welsh Assembly Government policy, the advisory group's conclusions in relation to free provision of personal care by the National Assembly;

3. welcomes the intention of the Welsh Assembly Government to provide its strategy for older people and implementation plan, following consultation on the advisory group report. (NDM1053)

The number of older people in our society is increasing significantly. Over the next 20 years, the number of people of retirement age in Wales will have increased by 11 per cent to 650,000. The number of over 85-year olds will increase by a third to 82,000. We must, therefore, plan for their future, not only for

options in the consultation document and I await the opinions of the different interest groups before I make a decision.

Glyn Davies: This issue is important to the agriculture industry. I congratulate you for the manner in which you have discussed the issue in the Agriculture and Rural Development Committee.

this generation, but for generations to come. That is why the Welsh Assembly Government decided to develop a comprehensive and integrated strategy for older people in Wales in collaboration with all our partners and stakeholders.

The strategy will consider how all aspects of the National Assembly's work impacts on older people and will provide a framework for the statutory bodies that work with the Assembly.

The report of the advisory group, which I chaired, is the culmination of almost a year's deliberation, which included extensive consultation, the personal involvement of hundreds of people and the response of over 1,000 people to our questionnaires. The deliberations have also been informed by the advice of professionals and other experts, and research evidence from the University of Wales, Bangor. Therefore, the report has added authority. The advisory report contains over 100 recommendations and many proposals to improve health and social care. However, the report also examines the broader context of how older people in Wales live.

I will comment on the report's highlights and recommendations. Addressing ageism and other forms of discrimination against older people and promoting a positive image of these people is essential. We must recognise their potential contribution to society and older people must recognise that it is never too late for them to start living the rest of their lives. I welcome Jonathan Morgan's support for this principle. However, amendment 1 is superfluous and adds nothing to the advisory group's report. I have no doubt that the Welsh Assembly Government will pick up the issue of age discrimination when it responds to the consultation later in the year.

Developing a dedicated research and development programme is important in order to study the context of ageing in Wales and to develop a better understanding of older people's needs and concerns. We must

A great deal of the evidence that we heard in our deliberations pointed out many of the barriers for older people who wish to participate in lifelong learning. While we recognise that we are not in a position to change welfare benefit levels, we can do a great deal to protect the incomes of poorer older people and promote their level of income through schemes such as encouraging benefit uptake.

The advisory group's report was launched on Monday 13 May and consultation will continue until August. During the debate on the NHS plan last year, the Minister for Health and Social Services promised that we would examine in Committee and Plenary the consequences of free personal care in Wales in the context of developing the strategy for older people. Therefore, the advisory group's remit was extended to include this issue. The Health and Social Services Committee discussed some of these issues on 1 May. Today's Plenary debate now fulfils the Minister's commitment.

I will not support Jocelyn Davies's amendments 2 and 3. Amendment 2, which invites us to condemn the UK Government, is typical of Plaid Cymru's negative and confrontational attitude. The Welsh Assembly Government is committed to working in partnership with the UK Government to address the issues raised in the report and other priorities with regard to older people; a necessity that the steering group has recognised.

Amendment 3 is concerned with the distinction between nursing and social care. The Royal Commission on Long Term Care for the Elderly envisaged that free nursing care could be both a stand-alone measure and a stepping measure towards free personal

The relatively generous arrangements for nursing care in Wales and our standard payment approach coupled with the unified assessment process ensures that people in Wales will get the holistic package of care that they need without any undue bureaucracy or unnecessary semantic arguments about the definition of health care or social care.

The Minister has made available the two main papers that helped to inform the advisory group's deliberations, one by the strategic policy unit and the other by Professor David Bell of the University of Stirling. It is worth highlighting a few points in the analysis. First, free personal care would need to be extended to include free domiciliary care, as free residential care on its own would create perverse incentives for people to go into residential homes, which 80 per cent of older people do not want to do. There would also be unpredictable and increasing costs for a relatively small number of self-funders. Providing extra money would do nothing to improve their quality of care or that of the overwhelming majority of people who are already entitled to free service. Our most realistic expectation is that this policy would cost £67.5 million to implement, with the cost rising to £130 million by 2021. However, there is uncertainty about the impact due to increased demand and changing patterns of care. The final figure could be as much as £181 million.

The cost of the policy would be in addition to the extra costs that will arise due to demographic changes and the above-inflation increases in the cost of care. These costs could be as much as £323 million, rising to £565 million by 2021—an increase of 72 per cent. As we know from Scotland's experience, implementing free residential care will result in the loss of attendance allowance, which could result in £14 million being lost from the Assembly's budget to the Treasury.

Implementing the recommendations of the Royal Commission on Long Term Care for the Elderly would not eliminate the needs for

Finally, and not least, implementing free personal care in Wales would require the ability to make primary legislation, which is not in our gift. However, the advisory group supported some aspects of the royal commission's report. We were impressed by the principle of diagnostic equity, in which people with different life-limiting conditions should come under the same funding regime, irrespective of their care setting.

We must consider the royal commission's recommendations. It recommended that free personal care should be funded from additional general taxation, not from current spending. It wants provision for free personal care to be made at UK level, which would feed back to the National Assembly through the Barnett formula. It did not support the notion that the Assembly should fund this from its own budget at a cost to the many other programmes that are essential to promote the health and wellbeing of older people in Wales.

I commend the advisory group's report to Members as a basis for further consultation to inform the Welsh Assembly Government's response and the formulation of its implementation plan—a plan that will be relevant to the needs and aspirations of older people in Wales now and for the next five to 10 years.

David Melding: I propose amendment 1 in the name of Jonathan Morgan. Add a new point:

acknowledges that age discrimination exists in society and therefore calls on the Welsh Assembly Government to fully recognise the rights of older people to access public services and opportunities for employment and leisure.

I will start with personal care, and respond to comments made during Dr Gibbons's confusing speech. [Interruption.] I will outline why I found it confusing. I have studied personal care for many years. The

proposition to accept the royal commission's recommendations on the funding of personal care is enticing. Plaid Cymru is convinced by it and takes a direct view on this. However, like the Government, I do not think that it is the best path to take. We must be cautious. However, the Government is playing a double game in hiding behind the device that we could endorse the principle of free personal care here but negotiate with the UK Government to implement and fund it on a UK basis. If we want to fund personal care, we must be adult enough, given that we have devolution, to make that decision or to say that it is beyond our competence. Some of Brian's distinctions are incoherent. The Royal Commission on Long Term Care report stated that personal care should also be funded, not residential care alone, and it extends to domiciliary care, as he knows.

Our increase in direct taxation is greater than the amount needed for funding personal care, which was estimated at 0.3 per cent. Even if the royal commission assessment is inaccurate—it was made several years ago—the latest figures in this strategy show that funding personal care would cost between £67 million and £125 million. Even if 0.3 per cent is a low estimate, a 1 per cent increase would be way above even the current worst-case scenario estimates. We have had an increase in direct taxation, and the First Minister, the Minister for Finance, Local Government and Communities and the Minister for Health and Social Services have all been careful to say that the increase in health spending is for healthcare in general, not necessarily for the NHS alone: translation—it could be used in what is currently the personal care and social services sector. Confusing tactics are currently being deployed.

On petitioning the UK Government, its position is clear: it has rejected the royal commission's recommendation of funding free personal care. No-one is naive enough to think that were the First Minister to abandon

his usual tirades against the Welsh Rugby Union, and take on the Treasury he would win. He will be given as short a shrift there as he was in Cardiff. We must accept the realities of our political situation. This motion is an empty gesture. It would be much more productive—as I thought the Minister was steering toward at a previous Health and Social Services Committee meeting—to ask the Committee to examine the question of healthcare and social care combined, to see if there is a way forward on these issues. We should hold an inquiry to examine this issue, then reach some coherent judgments and make recommendations. We should not play to the grandstand, running to the Welsh public blaming the UK Government for everything.

We must consider several options. The Assembly could fund what is currently classified as personal care. We know that the resources in health will increase substantially, coming to us as a block grant. The Government has already indicated that it will have flexibility to allocate that money. Instead of funding personal care directly, we could continue to charge, but have a national policy or a fairer, more standard policy. That could limit the charging policies that are applied to people who are deemed to have to pay for personal care.

The best way forward is to look at piloting a united care trust, with responsibility for delivering healthcare and personal and social care. We could then see how that operates in the outside world. If that is a coherent model—purely by being functional—it will end what many people regard to be—

David Lloyd: I propose the following amendments in the name of Jocelyn Davies. Amendment 2: add a new point:

condemns the UK Government for its failure to adopt the recommendation of the Royal Commission on Long Term Care for the Elderly to abolish charging for nursing and personal care.

I propose amendment 3. Add a new point:

recognises that an artificial and unfair distinction exists between nursing and social care.

I declare my usual interests as a general practitioner, county councillor, vice-chair of the Crossroads—Caring for Carers association and vice-president of the Alzheimer's Society in Swansea.

I welcome this debate and the commendable work contained in the report before us. More people live longer and are fitter than ever before. The new strategy affords us the opportunity to consider the issue anew, and to insist that, as a starting point, we should, ideally, try to keep elderly people in their own homes and enable them, by providing the necessary services, to live as independent a life as possible.

significant resources. As regards enabling people to stay in their own homes, we are talking about providing rapid response teams, primary care staff, district nurses, home care services, elderly care assessment teams, care and repair services and an array of physiotherapists and occupational therapists, as well as voluntary sector input from organisations such as Crossroads, Age Concern and the Alzheimer's Society. Prevention of falls, and active rehabilitation in terms of getting older people fitter and less prone to falls, must be a priority, coupled with more effective intermediate care.

There were common themes in the evidence-taking sessions for the older person's strategy: pensions; poverty; the take-up of benefits; free personal care; the care homes crisis; and the state of the health service. In terms of free personal care, it is Plaid Cymru policy to enact in full the recommendations of the Royal Commission on Long Term Care for the Elderly. Why have a royal commission unless you are going to listen to its recommendations? Recommendation 5.27 in the advisory group's report states that the Welsh Assembly Government should formally accept the royal commission's recommendations and should challenge the UK Government's stance. That recommendation needs to be translated into reality in the action plan that will follow the consultation. How will it be brought about? Or are we only going to have the grandstand today?

The distinction between nursing care and personal care is artificial. Personal care is what is traditionally called 'nursing', as it forms part of the extra help that someone might need in terms of washing and self-care by virtue of their frailty or disability. Personal care is best carried out by nurses who can pick up the early development of physical problems, such as sores and ulcers, before they would become evident to less-qualified eyes. That is health promotion par excellence, and why personal care means nursing care. However, the personal care of someone suffering from Alzheimer's disease in a home is charged for, while similar care for someone with advanced heart failure in

hospital is free. The UK Government's standpoint makes no clinical sense.

I will discuss domiciliary care, or home care services, which enable people to stay at home. Attention to prioritisation, financing, improved training and pay and workforce esteem within this form of care is long overdue. This should be the very bedrock of future policy development.

Finally, according to the evidence taken, the national health service is important to older people. Issues mentioned were the general pressures on the NHS, orthopaedic waiting lists, and services for the elderly, in terms of visual and hearing impairments, and the need for stroke units and multidisciplinary teams, as 5 per cent of over 75-year-olds suffer strokes. Also, a quarter of all people over the age of 84 will suffer from Alzheimer's disease. The phenomenal burden of arthritis, osteoarthritis and rheumatoid arthritis is hardly mentioned in the advisory group's report. We need a framework; priority must be given to addressing this significant cause of morbidity, as well as orthopaedic waiting lists.

The strategy for older people in Wales makes a significant contribution to raising the profile of issues that are important to older people everywhere—poor pensions, poverty, the care homes crisis, free long-term care for the elderly and the state of the health service. The challenge is to change aspiration into reality.

Kirsty Williams: I congratulate and thank the members of the advisory group for their commitment and hard work in developing this comprehensive and well-rounded report. The innovative way in which the group carried out its work, in gathering views and consulting people, is welcome, and hopefully will be replicated for subsequent reports. It is inevitable that members of the Health and Social Services Committee would not be able to resist talking about free personal care. I know that that will disappoint some people, because this report is about so much more than just the health service. However, I

cannot resist doing it either, and I welcome the partnership Government's acceptance of the principles outlined by the Sutherland report, following the lead of Scotland's partnership Government in implementing free personal care and the Westminster Liberal Democrats' call for the full implementation of the recommendations of the Royal Commission on Long Term Care for the Elderly. Public desire for this policy was starkly demonstrated by the recent BBC 'Your NHS' day poll. Of all the issues on which people could vote, this topped the poll, above increased expenditure on accident and emergency services, and recruiting more doctors and nurses. This issue exercises the minds of many people in England and Wales, and they look to us to take this policy forward. The acknowledgement by Welsh Labour that it needs to press its colleagues in Westminster to take action on this policy is a first step.

However, it is only the first step. I welcome the policies and initiatives already announced by the Minister for Health and Social Services on how Wales can lighten the burden on older people who face the prospect of having to pay for their long-term care. For instance, we have the introduction of free home care following release from hospital, the commitment to consider the disregard of disability benefits when assessing charges for domiciliary care, and the opportunity to consider capital allowances, that is, the value that people are allowed to retain in their home before they are forced to sell it to pay for their care.

We cannot get away from this fact—it was confirmed again this morning by Dame June Clark—that we need primary legislation to implement free personal care in Wales. I hope that you will take the opportunity today, Minister, to clear the mist for David Melding. I also hope that you will give a commitment that, if Westminster will not act and will not implement the Sutherland report, you will seek, on behalf of the Welsh Assembly Government, the powers and the resources to pursue this policy in Wales. I hope that you will consider how we can best use the increased resources that the Assembly will

receive following the Chancellor's budget announcement in London to alleviate the burden that many older people in Wales face. Tony Blair said in the 1997 general election campaign that he did not want to live in a country where older people were forced to sell their homes to pay for care. I am sure that you would not want that to be the case in Wales where we have the resources, and, potentially, powers to act differently.

On other aspects of the report, a significant amount of attention will be paid to how we can strengthen the voice of older people in the Assembly and local government. The report presents several options—a minister for older people, a joint Cabinet committee and a commissioner for older people similar to the children's commissioner that we have already achieved in Wales. I do not want to pre-empt the consultation, but I hope that we will carefully consider how we can mainstream older people's issues into policy development in the National Assembly, as well as ways of demonstrating to older people that they are being listened to. Older people are discriminated against in Wales. We must do all that we can to challenge discrimination and the perception of discrimination. To send a clear message today to the older people of Wales that we are listening to their needs, will the Minister say that she will pursue the issue of free personal care, not only in Westminster, but here in the National Assembly for Wales?

Yr wyf yn sicr na fyddch am iddi fod felly yng Nghymru lle y mae gennym yr adnoddau, a'r pwerau, yn ddichonol, i weithredu'n wahanol.

Ynghylch agweddau eraill ar yr adroddiad, rhoddir cryn sylw i'r modd y gallwn gryfhau llais pobl hŷn yn y Cynulliad ac mewn llywodraeth leol. Mae'r adroddiad yn cyflwyno sawl dewis—gweinidog i bobl hŷn, cydbwyllgor Cabinet a chomisiynydd i bobl hŷn, a fyddai'n debyg i'r comisiynydd plant yr ydym eisoes wedi'i sicrhau yng Nghymru. Nid wyf am achub y blaen ar yr ymgynghoriad, ond gobeithiaf y byddwn yn ystyried yn ofalus sut y gallwn roi materion pobl hŷn yn y brif ffrwd wrth ddatblygu polisi yn y Cynulliad Cenedlaethol, yn ogystal â dulliau o ddangos i bobl hŷn ein bod yn gwrandio arnynt. Gwahaniaethir yn erbyn pobl hŷn yng Nghymru. Rhaid inni wneud popeth a allwn i herio gwahaniaethu a'r canfyddiad o wahaniaethu. Er mwyn anfon neges glir heddiw at bobl hŷn Cymru ein bod yn gwrandio ar eu hanghenion, a wnaiff y Gweinidog ddweud y gwnaiff ddilyn mater gofal personol am ddim, nid yn unig yn San Steffan, ond yma yng Nghynulliad Cenedlaethol Cymru?

Rhodri Glyn Thomas: I echo what Dai Lloyd said earlier. I hope that Members agree that our aim should be to enable people to remain in their own homes for as long as possible, and that when they need care and support, that it be provided in their own homes. However, we must accept some people in our society require care homes. I hope that the Assembly Government accepts that there is a real crisis facing that sector at the moment. In my constituency, Carmarthen East and Dinefwr, there are several cases of people who are forced to stay in community hospitals because there is no way of transferring them to care homes. We must

Pwy sydd â'r cyfrifoldeb dros y cartrefi hyn? Yng Nghymru, er bod y sector preifat wedi cyfrannu, yn draddodiadol, mae cartrefi gofal wedi bod yn gyfrifoldeb awdurdodau lleol. Fodd bynnag, oherwydd yr angen i godi safonau yn y cartrefi hyn—ac yr ydym i gyd yn cytuno â hynny gan fod mwy o angen yng Nghymru, o bosibl, nag mewn rhannau eraill o Brydain—mae pwysau ar awdурdoadau lleol i drosglwyddo eu stoc. David Melding: The Chief Inspector of Social Services says that we have a dangerous situation in Wales because councils are concentrating too much on their

ensure that this situation is remedied. As David Melding said, we must scrutinise how the health and care budgets are used. That money could perhaps be used more effectively to provide the sort of care people need, rather than forcing them to stay in inappropriate institutions.

We have lost 47,000 care beds since the Labour Government was elected in 1997. This is totally unacceptable because we need those beds. A total of 108 care homes have closed in Wales since 1997—four of which were in Carmarthenshire. We cannot tolerate such losses; we need these homes. What will this Government do to secure their survival?

Where does the responsibility for these care homes lie? In Wales, although the private sector has contributed, care homes have traditionally been the responsibility of local authorities. However, because of the need to raise standards in these homes—and we all agree with that, as there is possibly greater need in Wales than other parts of Britain—there is pressure on local authorities to transfer their stock. Why can local authorities not draw down the funds that would enable them to keep these homes within their remits? Consultation is taking place at present in Carmarthenshire, and the majority of those who come to my surgeries want to see care homes remain within the local authority's remit. They feel safe with that, and believe that it is the Government's responsibility to ensure that it happens.

I tabled a written question on this matter, and the answer I received was reassuring. However, I want a commitment that local authorities will be able to draw down funds to raise standards, and will retain responsibility for these homes. I challenge—

David Melding: Dywed Prif Arolygydd y Gwasanaethau Cymdeithasol fod gennym sefyllfa beryglus yng Nghymru am fod y cynhorau'n canolbwytio'n ormodol ar eu

role as care providers and not enough on their role as care commissioners, and that they should start to move away from providing in such quantities. Your proposal goes against that, Rhodri.

Rhodri Glyn Thomas: Yr wyf yn eich sicrhau mai dymuniad defnyddwyr y cartrefi yw eu bod nhw'n aros o dan reolaeth awdurdodau lleol. Val Lloyd: I declare an interest as a registered nurse and a member of Swansea City and COunty Council. I welcome this comprehensive strategy, and I am sure that the consultation process will result in many and varied comments. In a small way, I have carried out my own consultations. In the last few weeks, I have had the opportunity to talk about the strategy's aims and recommendations with a few interested groups. Everyone whom I talked with saw the purpose and need for such a strategy, even when there was animated discussion about the recommendations. It makes sense to review services for older people and other issues related to their wellbeing in an integrated way, and also to do that before exponential growth in the number of retirement age people.

The perception of retirement has changed radically for individuals and society. I hope that that continues, especially as I approach retirement. The era of retirement should and can be exciting. It affords opportunities to change direction and perspective. However, to enable that requires the ability to vary lifestyle, have suitable housing and transport and focused health and social care. I especially welcome the consideration of more innovative and diverse patterns of housing

Rhodri Glyn Thomas: I assure you that those who use the homes want them to remain within the local authorities' remits. We must recognise that the private sector—and there is a place for the private sector—is driven by profit. Is David Melding claiming that he wants to entrust the care of older people in need to a sector dependent on profit, rather than to the local authorities, which are directly accountable to the people whom they serve? We must create a situation where there is an option for homes to remain within the remit of the local authority. That will not happen in every case, but it is important that the option is considered fully in any consultation process.

Val Lloyd: Datganaf fuddiant fel nyrs gofrestredig ac aelod o Gyngor Dinas a Sir Abertawe. Croesawaf y strategaeth gynhwysfawr hon, ac yr wyf yn sicr y bydd y broses ymgynghori'n arwain at sylwadau niferus ac amrywiol. Yr wyf wedi ymgynghori â phobl fy hun, ar raddfa fach. Yn yr wythnosau diwethaf, cefais gyfle i sôn am nodau ac argymhellion y strategaeth gydag ychydig o grwpiau sydd â budd yn hyn. Yr oedd pawb y siaradais â hwy'n gweld pwrpas strategaeth o'r fath a'r angen amdani, hyd yn oed pan oedd trafodaeth frwd am yr argymhellion. Mae'n ddoeth adolygu'r gwasanaethau i bobl hŷn a materion eraill sy'n ymwneud â'u lles mewn modd integredig, gan wneud hynny hefyd cyn i nifer y bobl o oed ymddeol gynyddu'n gyflymach gyflymach.

provision. Appropriate transport provision should be integrated with this. Practical recommendations on a range of transport options are not only essential to older people, but will benefit the whole community. Older people do not just want for things to be done for them; they want to actively participate in community life and to continue to contribute. That is in line with the strategy's aim of bringing new opportunities to promote self-fulfilment and independence.

On the recommendations relating to health and social care, much of what I wanted to say has already been said. However, I highlight the anomaly, dating from 1974, whereby local authorities are responsible for and make provision for basic nursing care, but are not allowed to provide the nurses that give such care. Another issue that concerns me is the unified assessment framework—though not as a concept, as I believe that it is an excellent recommendation. I presume that it is intended to be a single, holistic assessment tool for universal and equitable application. However, I understand that that will not be the case in practice, as there will be local arrangements for its application. That could lead to 22 different assessment tools. Some central guidance would be beneficial and I would value the Minister's comments on these issues.

Ann Jones: Most of us should declare an interest in this debate, as we will all stand to benefit from the strategy at a later stage of our lives. To paraphrase Lennon and McCartney, to the question 'Will you still love me, will you still need me, when I'm 64?'—I want society to say 'yes'.

The document aims to ensure that older people can play a fuller role and feel valued by society. This is extremely important as people are living longer. It is equally important to my constituency, with the second largest number of pensioners in Wales, about a third of the constituents. It is also important that such a document as this does not gather dust on shelves or prop up piano legs. Older people have much to

contribute to society and I support the move to replace the term ‘age of retirement’ with the term ‘age of entitlement’. Such a change would reflect the fact that, in the twenty-first century, retirement is not the end of the road, but simply a change of lifestyle. People are increasingly taking up second careers after their official retirement, partly to earn money and partly to keep busy. In the US, these are called bridge jobs; they bridge the gap between full employment and full retirement. However, it is not all work and no play. Many more retired people these days enjoy robust good health into their 60s and 70s. That includes the crown green bowlers among us.

I am concerned about the issue of free personal care. For eight out of 10 people in residential care in Wales, their care is already paid for by the taxpayer. The Assembly is taking steps to ease the costs of care. We have abolished charges for nursing care, with a simpler and more generous funding system that costs £13 million. We now provide six weeks of free home care for all elderly people leaving hospital, at a cost of £3 million. We also allow three months of personal care before assessing the value of people’s houses, so that nobody has to sell their home before it is clear that they will not be able to move back home.

Free personal care would not mean a single extra person receiving care. It would benefit a small minority of elderly people who have assets of over £19,000. It would not even benefit them; the only real beneficiaries would be their heirs. The cost would be vast and I would much rather have a policy that raises thresholds, for example, by disregarding income from industrial injury pensions and other benefits, and by increasing substantially the amount of savings that can be disregarded, before we consider the payments system. That would be a better solution, by which more people in our society would be genuinely helped.

Jocelyn Davies: I will comment on the Conservatives' amendment 1, which argues that the Government should recognise the rights of older people to access public services and opportunities for employment and leisure. I fully support those sentiments because society is changing and people are living longer and healthier lives. People of retirement age and over comprise some 20 per cent of Wales's population, which is about half a million people. By 2016, that figure is expected to rise to 23.5 per cent. The largest increase will be in the number of those who are over 80. Most of us can now expect to live into our 80s and 90s.

Living longer, healthier lives sounds great but, for some, it may mean many years in poverty. You can now expect to spend perhaps a third of your life in retirement. It can prove a financially difficult time for women, especially.

Geraint Davies: According to Age Concern, three out of five elderly people are living in poverty. Do you agree that the fact that Consignia is now putting a surcharge of £1.65 on paying electricity bills, given that old people often want to pay in small amounts, is adding to the poverty of old people?

Jocelyn Davies: Those small amounts make a big difference to individuals. The situation is even worse for women because they will have been poorly paid in their working lives and then have a poorly paid retirement. Rates of poverty among women pensioners are high; three-quarters of pensioners on income support are women.

We ought to recognise that older people are a large group but that there are smaller groups within that group who are much worse off. One way in which we can help those who are in the worst financial situations is by providing effective and easily accessible independent information and advice on the benefits available. Research shows that in 1999 over a third of pensioners who were entitled to income support and council tax discount failed to claim them and that 15 per

Older people sometimes complain that they are discriminated against. We must press for legislation to make discrimination on the grounds of age illegal. We can do a great deal without legislation to change attitudes to older people. For example, what is the Assembly's record on employing people who are over 55? We can lead by example. If the Minister cannot tell me today how many people over 55 have been employed by the Assembly since 1999, perhaps an answer could be provided later. Let us not say that discrimination is wrong and then ignore this group when we recruit staff.

Take the example of golden handshakes for councillors; the Government proposes that 60 is a suitable retirement age for councillors. We believe that that is a little too young. Many people do not consider becoming councillors until they retire. Harry Jones is running Newport County Borough Council in his mid-70s. Who here would say that he is too old to do that? Any takers? No, I did not think that there would be.

We can also influence the voluntary sector. Many older people gain huge satisfaction in volunteering and their contribution to that sector is vital. I was disappointed to hear on the radio yesterday that the Stroke Association has now imposed an upper age limit of 80 on all its volunteers. Will the Minister consider whether we could encourage voluntary bodies not to have upper age limits for their volunteers?

The report is thoughtful. Brian told us how it came to be drawn up, and therefore I am not surprised that it is so comprehensive. However, there are one or two omissions to which I am sure that Brian would admit. For example, why has the issue of sexuality been omitted? After all, older gay people find

Gallwn wneud llawer iawn heb ddeddfwriaeth i newid yr agweddau at bobl hŷn. Er enghraifft, beth yw record y Cynulliad ar gyflogi pobl dros 55? Gallwn arwain drwy osod esiampl. Os na all y Gweinidog ddweud wrthyf heddiw pa nifer o bobl dros 55 a gyflogwyd gan y Cynulliad ers 1999, efallai y gellid darparu ateb yn ddiweddarach. Gadewch inni beidio â dweud bod gwahaniaethu'n anghywir ac yna anwybyddu'r grŵp hwn pan ydym yn reciwtio staff.

Cymerwch y tâl ymadael i gynghorwyr yn enghraifft; mae'r Llywodraeth yn cynnig bod 60 yn oed ymdeol addas i gynghorwyr. Credwn fod hynny braidd yn rhy ifanc. Mae llawer nad ydynt yn ystyried mynd yn gynghorwyr nes eu bod yn ymdeol. Mae Harry Jones yn rhedeg Cyngor Bwrdeistref Sirol Casnewydd ac yntau yng nghanol ei saith degau. Pwy yma a ddywedai ei fod yn rhy hen i wneud hynny? Unrhyw gynnig? Nac oes, nid oeddwn yn credu y byddai.

Gallwn hefyd ddylanwadu ar y sector gwirfoddol. Mae llawer o bobl hŷn yn cael llawer o fodhad drwy wirfoddoli ac mae eu cyfraniad i'r sector hwnnw'n hollbwysig. Yr oedd yn siom imi glywed ar y radio ddoe fod y Gymdeithas Strôc bellach wedi gosod terfyn oedran uchaf o 80 ar ei holl wirfoddolwyr. A wnaiff y Gweinidog ystyried a allem annog cyrff gwirfoddol i beidio â chael terfynau oedran uchaf i'w gwirfoddolwyr?

themselves even more isolated than their heterosexual counterparts. They are least likely to have children and families and they may miss out on normal support networks that other people enjoy and rely on. Legally, they are at a huge disadvantage when it comes to inheritance laws and accessing their partner's pension entitlement.

These are not devolved matters, but we could look at the tenancy rules of local authorities and housing associations. We must acknowledge that older gay couples may not have conventional families, therefore the rules on assignment of tenancy on the death of a tenant should acknowledge that. We should also consider the fact that care services for older people are delivered on the assumption of their being single persons or different sex couples. Getting a hospital to accept that a same sex partner is the next of kin is almost impossible. It is difficult for people who are not married to get the hospital to accept that the next of kin is your partner; for gay people that is even more difficult.

Most of us take these matters for granted. They are in our gift, are simple and we could put them right. As for all strategies, we need to know the principles on which policies and services for older people will be based and against which principle they will be measured. The key principle should be respect for the individual and their choices. Older people should be seen as partners in all the work affecting them and society should stop patronising them. This is a cross-cutting strategy—

Hwy yw'r lleiaf tebygol o fod â phlant a theuluoedd a gallant fod heb y rhwydweithiau cynnal arferol y mae eraill yn eu mwynhau ac yn dibynnu arnynt. Y pwnc gwleidyddol llosg yn y strategaeth hon yw darbwyllo Llywodraeth y DU i fabwysiadu argymhelliaid y Comisiwn Brenhinol ar Ofal Tymor Hir i'r Henoed i

charging for nursing and personal care. Although health must feature strongly in any strategy on older people, the strength of this report is its cross-cutting approach to this issue. It recognises that health and wellbeing depends as much on good housing and an active life and healthy environment as it does on good primary care and the availability of appropriate care to maintain independence as long as possible.

In that context, I will concentrate on the housing agenda. It is a matter of concern that there is a projected backlog of £1 billion in repairs and improvements in the owner-occupied sector in Wales. In addition, one in five privately rented homes are classed as unfit. Many of the homes in need of repair and improvement will be occupied by older people, who are often on a low income and unable to afford the necessary works.

Up until the last few years, resources for grants have been cut year-on-year since 1992. The partnership Government has now reversed that trend, but there is still not enough money in the system and, realistically, there will not be any in the near future. It is important that this problem is dealt with imaginatively. I applaud the extra funding that has been found for Care and Repair Cymru and the increasingly important role of that organisation in assisting older people to remain in their own homes and to live in warmth and comfort. It is no coincidence that the amount of money spent on disabled facility grants and adaptations has been rising. The money for these grants has reduced the resources available for more general improvement grants. The investment in the home energy efficiency scheme is also welcome, as is how that has been linked to crime prevention measures in some areas. However, more needs to be done to improve this scheme's integration with other grant measures to ensure a more holistic approach to the homes of those most in need. However, it is an important step forward.

Yn ogystal â hynny, mae un ym mhob pump o'r tai preifat sydd ar osod wedi'i ddynodi'n anaddas. Hyd at y blynnyddoedd diwethaf hyn, mae'r adnoddau ar gyfer grantiau wedi'u torri flwyddyn ar ôl blwyddyn ers 1992. Mae'r Llywodraeth bartneriaeth wedi gwrtthdroi'r duedd honno bellach, ond nid oes digon o arian yn y system byth ac, mewn gwirionedd, ni fydd digon yn y dyfodol agos. Mae'n bwysig trin y broblem hon yn greadigol. Canmolaf yr arian ychwanegol a ganfuwyd ar gyfer Gofal a Thrwsio Cymru a rôl gynyddol bwysig y corff hwnnw wrth helpu pobl hŷn i aros yn eu cartrefi eu hunain a byw mewn cynheswydd a chysur. Nid yw'n gydd-digwyddiad bod cynnydd wedi bod yn y swm a gaiff ei wario ar grantiau cyfleusterai'r anabl ac addasiadau. Mae'r arian i'r grantiau hyn wedi lleihau'r adnoddau sydd ar gael ar gyfer grantiau gwella mwy cyffredinol. I am pleased that this report has identified the one measure that can best help those living in their own homes to deal with repairs and improvement, namely the use of equity release schemes. Those schemes enable owner-occupiers to borrow against the equity in their homes to finance improvement, but defer payments on the capital and the interest until the property is sold. The Council of Mortgage Lenders is interested in these schemes and I hope that we can move forward the further research and development recommended by this report as soon as possible in order to progress this matter and to make this the rule, not the exception, in Wales. The swift implementation of adaptation works in the homes of older people is also important. Too often, there are unacceptable backlogs in local councils, and in some cases, this can leave someone housebound for a year or more. The fund that was set up this year to fast track some of these adaptations is welcome and should be expanded in future years. However, the key issue is to secure independence for older people through housing improvements. Although we have made a start, we still have a long way to go to achieve that. I hope that the report's recommendations are another step towards achieving that goal.

Peter Law: The older persons' strategy is a beacon of good practice and is long overdue. We are not discussing one or two issues with regard to our senior citizens or something that might be useful for a Liberal Democrat election platform. We are discussing recognising the needs of senior citizens throughout Wales. That has many facets and the advisory group is working on them. I compliment it on its good work. This will go out to consultation, and we all look forward to that. We do not have a monopoly on wisdom, and it will be pleasing to hear what the people on the ground have to say. We want to hear from senior citizens and their representative organisations. I was delighted that Age Concern Cymru, Age Alliance Cymru, the National Old Age Pensioners Association of Wales and many other organisations played a part in this advisory group. That reflects on the network of organisations that exist throughout Wales.

We owe them a great debt. Wales is a better nation today because of the contribution of the senior citizens of this country. We must thank them and recognise their contribution. We must remember that many of us will become senior citizens over the coming years. We take matters for granted far too often. It is nice to be able to reflect upon all those senior citizen and pensioner organisations throughout Wales, which meet every week and provide a great deal of support, enriching the lives of our pensioners. We all know of them—there are thousands in our constituencies. Those organisations are doing an excellent job and it is nice to be able to thank them.

Blaenau Gwent benefits from Age Concern local constituency workers. They do a wonderful job. There are many similar organisations to which I am sure all of you can refer. This is an opportunity to celebrate their work and ensure that we get it right this time and do even more for our pensioners in future. I received the Pensioners Forum for Wales manifesto document this week, which was interesting. Good luck to it: I admire the support it has from so many high powered organisations, from the trade union movement to the Federation of Sub Post Officers. There is support for the forum across Wales. It lays out 12 items in its manifesto for Wales. I cannot discuss all of them now, but the manifesto states that the strategy is welcome and it refers to several issues. Its first manifesto point is to create a mechanism to enable pensioners to contribute fully and effectively to the development of policies and legislation that affects them. I hope that will be the case. We need a standing forum for our senior citizens to make that link with the National Assembly, within our limited powers. We must remember that those powers are limited. There is no point in our tilting at windmills, but we must do as much as we can.

The manifesto also refers to the need to work towards an integrated public transport system—which my colleague, Sue Essex is doing—that enables pensioners to travel free

by road and rail. We have already achieved free bus transport for pensioners, and I am pleased that that was a flagship Labour policy in 1999. That has been delivered, but we must consider rail. Let us say that we are going over the boundary and let us consider what we can do for pensioners in terms of rail transport. That is a reasonable point to make.

The manifesto also suggests positive action to improve crime prevention and detection and to alleviate pensioners' fear of crime. I note that the working group considered that issue thoroughly. It is important; it is about making the streets safer for our pensioners and combating the confidence tricksters, the rogue tradespeople and others who prey on or abuse older people in our communities. We need to control those people. That would probably involve passing new UK Government legislation. However, the Assembly should be behind the call to tackle the problem, because pensioners in Wales deserve to be treated with respect, not taken advantage of.

I also support legislation to make discrimination on the grounds of age illegal. Kirsty Williams's earlier comments on this issue were correct. Many Members have said in the past that a commissioner for older people should be appointed. If we can have a commissioner for children, we should also have a commissioner for older people. I hope that that issue will be pursued. There are many ways in which we can help to enrich older people's lives. The document is commendable and I am pleased to support it.

Eleanor Burnham: I also welcome the strategy as the Assembly's stamp on developing a more caring Wales. I declare an interest as a former domiciliary care manager who worked with older people. I have an elderly mother living alone and I am aware of the challenges of old age. I had the privilege of attending the launch of the Care and Repair scheme in Wrexham last week. The ability of older people to call on help in their own home is essential. That is done in partnership with the police and local authorities. My mother, at the age of 84, is still motivated and, like many other older people, has much to offer her local community of Llandrillo, Denbighshire. For example, she still chairs the local friends of Gobowen Orthopaedic Hospital committee after 25 years and is a chapel deacon. She makes a real effort to take an active part in her local community, including attending the excellent luncheon club, which is supported by many wonderful local volunteers.

The report's emphasis on challenging and addressing ageism and discrimination is most welcome. Older people have much to offer their communities and society at large; they have invaluable experience, insight and skills. They are often overlooked and disregarded by employers and others who do not recognise the valuable contribution that they can make. Given the increasing number of older people in the population, we need a change of attitude in society. We need to wake up and realise that older people can be an asset, given some community support, such as that my mother received from dedicated local carers and Crossroads. With that support, she was able to care for my father at home until his death earlier this year. We do not have to consider older people as a burden. In today's more tolerant society, we need to consider how we can continue to improve the lot of older people.

Gwenda Thomas: I support the appointment of an older people's commissioner for Wales and the establishment of a designated minister and older people's committee to

Eleanor Burnham: Yr wyf finnau'n croesawu'r strategaeth fel stamp y Cynulliad ar ddatblygu Cymru fwy gofalgar. Datganaf fuddiant fel cyn reolwr gofal yn y cartref a weithiai â phobl hŷn. Mae gennyf fam oedrannus sy'n byw ar ei phen ei hun ac yr wyf yn ymwybodol o heriau henaint. Cefais y faint o fod yn bresennol yng nghyfarfod lansio'r cynllun Gofal a Thrwsio yn Wrecsam yr wythnos diwethaf. Mae'n hollbwysig bod pobl hŷn yn gallu galw am gymorth yn eu cartrefi eu hunain. Gwneir hynny mewn partneriaeth â'r heddlu a'r awdurdodau lleol. Mae fy mam, a hithau'n 84 oed, yn dal i fod yn frwdrydig ac, fel llawer o bobl hŷn eraill, mae ganddi lawer i'w gynnig i'w chymuned leol yn Llandrillo yn sir Ddinbych. Er enghraifft, mae'n dal i fod yn gadeirydd y pwyllgor lleol o gyfeillion Ysbyty Orthopaedig Gobowen ar ôl 25 mlynedd ac mae'n flaenor mewn capel. Mae'n gwneud ymdrech gwirioneddol i gymryd rhan weithredol yn ei chymuned leol, gan gynnwys mynchu'r clwb cinio rhagorol, a gefnogir gan lawer o wirfoddolwyr lleol gwych.

Mae pwyslais yr adroddiad ar herio a mynd i'r afael ag oedranaeth a gwahaniaethu i'w groesawu'n fawr. Mae gan bobl hŷn lawer i'w gynnig i'w cymuned leol ac i gymdeithas yn gyffredinol; mae ganddynt brofiad, mewnwelediad a sgiliau amhrisiadwy. oversee the work. You may recall that I also called for these measures for children and young people in Wales.

On employment, Benefit Agency rules already allow people to work beyond retirement age while still receiving their retirement pension. The earnings rule has long been abolished and national insurance contributions cease at retirement age. The potential of older people as reliable employees needs to be recognised.

Free personal care must be the aim, but intensive social care could be avoided for longer if the traditional home help was reintroduced to provide help with housework and shopping, for example. Garden clearance schemes could also be extended. Sheltered housing schemes, which allow independent living linked to 24-hour care, should also be promoted.

I strongly support the proposal that local authorities should develop their own strategies, which should contribute to partnership working, with budgets planned and shared jointly with other statutory bodies and the voluntary sector. The meaningful monitoring and evaluation of these partnerships must be developed. Joint care plans must not be merely documents on a shelf. Social workers must consult with the local police, district nurses with home carers, and so on. The fire service's community safety policies should also be a part of the care planning strategy.

Local authorities, as lead agencies, must encourage older people to participate in the Communities First initiative, and groups such as the University of the Third Age must be consulted on lifelong learning opportunities. The work already being carried out by welfare rights teams, Citizens Advice Bureaux, and others, in maximising benefit entitlement among older people, should be recognised. There has been significant success.

I strongly support the recommendation that the cost of using available vehicles out of

Day centres could be used during weekends and evenings to minimise isolation and encourage community participation among older people. I also support the recommendation that a monitoring process be developed to prevent abuse of the elderly. A register of elderly people at risk could form part of preventative measures.

I welcome the reference to carers' needs and rights and a recent change to benefit regulations that, from October, will see the end to the age ceiling of 65 placed on claiming invalid care allowance. While most carers aged over 65 will not receive invalid care allowance as it overlaps the retirement pension, they may gain up to £24.80 per week through the inclusion of the carers' premium.

To close, the advisory group's report is welcome, and I acknowledge its hard work under the chairmanship of Dr Brian Gibbons. Its recommendations are wide-ranging, and successfully put into words the experiences many of us have faced in our own families.

Janice Gregory: The most significant aspect of this report is the recognition that, as a society with an ageing population, we must be proactive in our approach to older people, and put a proactive framework in place, to ensure that older people's needs are met. This is about ensuring that people have the opportunity to live their lives to the full. It is also about barriers to opportunity, which must be removed.

People deserve independence, dignity and security whatever their age. To pick up on Peter Law's points, crime is one of the greatest direct threats to independence and opportunity for our older population. Older people present vulnerable targets to criminals, and shocking cases are often highlighted in the media. In my constituency, people have lost their life savings to con men, bogus callers and confidence tricksters. Crime, and the fear of it, can lead to isolation and have a hugely detrimental effect on

people's ability to participate fully in their communities. It can greatly reduce quality of life. Therefore, I welcome the report's recommendation that the Government should review how strategies for tackling crime impact on older people, and how more can be done to focus on their needs. I hope that the Government will take note of the contribution of neighbourhood watch groups in identifying local and practical needs, such as street lighting, and in police liaison.

I hope that we can be much more proactive, working with local government and the voluntary sector, in considering how we can best promote older people's participation in their communities and how we can strengthen community groups and voluntary organisations. Such action should also address how older people can be best involved in the political process.

I was particularly interested in the recommendation on the role that champions for older people could play in local health boards. I hope that that could be extended to encompass other public bodies. That would not only enhance the democratic process, but ensure that someone at every level is shouting for the needs of older people and for their access to the high-quality services and facilities that are essential to enable them to live their lives to the full.

Finally, I draw attention to practical considerations. All levels of Government have launched worthy initiatives for pensioners—free bus passes, free TV licences and the minimum income guarantee, to name but a few. These are great initiatives; no-one can deny that. However, we must ensure that they are delivered in an appropriate, practical and sympathetic way, which best suits the needs of older people. Well-meaning policies are no good if they do not reach those they are intended to benefit. We must maximise their uptake and break down barriers, no matter how big or small, so that those who are most in need receive what they are entitled to.

Christine Chapman: I welcome this strategy

and thank the advisory group for its tremendous hard work. I declare an interest as a patron of the Alltwen Residents Association, which provides sheltered accommodation for the elderly. It is a measure of our success and desire to provide open and accountable government that we can hold this debate on older people and a debate on young people in politics—which is to take place later—in the same Plenary session.

The problems facing older people are becoming increasingly prevalent. Fewer births and longer lives mean that the number of people aged 65 and over will increase at 10 times the overall population in the next 40 years. Older people's issues also comprise a disproportionate amount of constituency casework. I am pleased that we are developing a strategy that will give older people a stronger political voice.

One of the most powerful messages in this report is that society should not write older people off. Unfortunately, older people are often stereotyped, and the media, at times, does not help matters. Assumptions are made about older people's ability to play a full part in society. In my discussions with groups of older people in my constituency, they have been frank about the labels placed on them. Those labels can sometimes lead to poor services and exploitation by ruthless salespeople. Older people can be patronised and assumptions made about the sort of people they are, particularly if they live in sheltered accommodation. That is nothing less than ageism and discrimination. I welcome the fact that this report highlights the need to address those issues.

I turn to the fear of crime—and I declare an interest as president of Cynon Valley Victim Support. While, statistically, older people are less likely to suffer serious violent crime than younger people, the psychological, social and emotional effects of the fear of crime are more prevalent among older people and affect more than any other age group. At this point, I offer my condolences to the families of those who have been brutally murdered in Llangollen; that community is now in shock.

Many older people will take drastic action. They will stay at home to avoid danger or perceived danger. They are therefore more vulnerable and more likely to be physically frail. Many of them live alone. They will try to minimise the risk of suffering from a crime. Therein lies the problem: if the Assembly is serious about tackling social exclusion among older people, it cannot afford for them to be isolated and cut off from society. I welcome the emphasis in the report on the need for active citizenship and for ownership of this strategy.

Access to services is crucial for older people. Poor transport links, deprivation and debilitating long-term illness often conspire to limit older people's access to essential services and amenities, and limit their independence. People often think that improving healthcare means building a new hospital or surgery. We must be more imaginative. Often, healthcare can be substantially enhanced for older people by improving their access to services at home. I am pleased that this report has drawn attention to that.

We have begun to make a difference to the lives of older people in Wales, with free bus travel and free nursing care provided by this Welsh Assembly Government. We need to do much more, but this strategy is a positive step forward.

John Griffiths: I welcome today's debate, and congratulate Brian and the representatives of the organisations who served on the advisory group, on their hard work, and the time and commitment involved in producing this report.

The report recognises that older people now live differently than in previous generations and have different expectations. On retirement, people look forward to a new lease of life and an active old age. They have

longer and fitter lives. During the recent Commonwealth Parliamentary Association conference in Cardiff, a delegate from Cyprus told me that she had just bought a holiday hut on a beach in Cyprus from a Welsh couple in their mid-90s. They had decided to sell it, because they wanted to travel the world. She had kept tags on their progress and the couple had travelled about half way around and were confident of completing the world tour.

I have run six London marathons and in every one I have seen people in their 80s taking part. One woman told me that she had begun to run marathons in her 80s; she had already run three or four, and intended to continue until she was 90. After that, she would look to other activities. I have run six marathons, but have stopped now. I am not sure whether I will run a marathon in my 80s, if I am lucky enough to live that long, but I know that old people today are taking advantage of the opportunity to live full and active lives and that that is positive. The University of the Third Age provides great opportunities and, through that organisation, many senior citizens take degrees and study at all levels, keeping their minds active and meeting new people.

The Assembly, and Government in general, must accept this new reality and realise that there is growing confidence and independence among older people. We must foster that and enable older people to be independent. I welcome the recommendation that we ensure that older people can participate fully in every aspect of society. It is about dignity, and respect for the lives they have lived and the wisdom and experience that they have accumulated. There is a view that other countries and cultures accord older people much more respect. We must ensure that older people in Wales get the respect to which they are entitled. Age discrimination is wrong and must be tackled.

Some companies make a point of employing older people and prosper as a result. Taking

Yn ystod cynhadledd Cymdeithas Seneddol y Gymanwlad yng Nghaerdydd yn ddiweddar, dywedodd cynrychiolydd o Gyprus wrthyf ei bod newydd brynu cwt gwyliau ar draeth yng Nghyprus oddi wrth bâr o Gymru a oedd yn eu naw degau canol. Yr oeddent wedi penderfynu ei werthu, am eu bod am deithio'r byd. Mae wedi cadw llygad ar eu hynt ac yr oedd y pâr wedi teithio tua hanner y ffordd ac yn ffyddiog y byddent yn cwblhau'r daith o amgylch y byd.

Yr wyf wedi rhedeg mewn chwe marathon yn Llundain ac ym mhob un fe welais bobl yn eu hwyth degau'n cymryd rhan. Dywedodd un fenyw wrthyf ei bod wedi dechrau rhedeg mewn marathonau yn ei hwyth degau; yr oedd eisoes wedi rhedeg mewn tri neu bedwar, a bwriadai barhau nes ei bod yn 90. Wedi hynny, byddai'n ystyried gweithgareddau eraill. Yr wyf wedi rhedeg mewn chwe marathon, ond yr wyf wedi rhoi'r gorau iddynt bellach. Nid wyf yn sicr a fyddaf yn rhedeg marathon yn fy wyth degau, os wyf yn ddigon ffodus i fyw mor hen â hynny, ond fe wn fod hen bobl heddiw'n achub ar y cyfle i fyw bywydau llawn a bywiog ac mae hynny'n beth cadarnhaol. Mae Prifysgol y Drydedd Oes yn cynnig cyfleoedd gwych a, drwy'r corff hwnnw, mae llawer o hen bobl yn gwneud graddau ac yn astudio ar bob lefel, gan gadw eu meddyliau'n effro a chwrdd â phobl newydd.

Rhaid i'r Cynulliad, a Llywodraeth yn gyffredinol, dderbyn y realiti newydd hwn a sylweddoli bod ymdeimlad cynyddol o hyder ac annibyniaeth ymysg pobl hŷn. an enlightened approach helps their business, because they can draw on older people's experience and accumulated wisdom. In its strategy, the Assembly should lead the way in changing mindsets and perceptions so that old age is viewed more positively and realistically. I welcome the recommendations about challenging and addressing ageism and other forms of discrimination, and promoting more positive images. Older people are a great resource in terms of voluntary work and community activities. We must use their experience and time better.

To combat poverty and poor housing, we must ensure that older people are better informed about benefits and that more of them are persuaded to take up benefits. Life opportunities exist, but poverty stops some pensioners taking full advantage of them. We must tackle that.

We must ensure that the Government and the Assembly recognises the new reality of old age, and takes decisions on that basis. A more realistic and positive view of old age should prevail. Only if that happens will we ensure that the opportunities for an active and fulfilled old age are fostered across Wales.

The Minister for Health and Social Services (Jane Hutt): We should celebrate the fact that so many more people live substantially longer and have generally healthier lives. Older people make a great contribution to Wales and all of us will benefit from that as years go by. The challenge is to ensure that we have the policies and programmes to enable older people to make the most of the opportunities that they have in Wales and that high quality services and choice are available when they need care and support. However, as Age Concern said in response to the strategy, this must not be seen as just health and social care territory. I am pleased that the strategy's all-embracing nature has been welcomed by everyone today. I, too, thank Brian for chairing the advisory group, and all those Members and officials who helped develop it.

Other equality issues are also relevant, and the Committee on Equality of Opportunity may wish to tackle that. We want a voice for older people in politics and communities, as Janice and Christine said, and even to open up whole new horizons, such as running marathons, which John mentioned—I do not think that I will be joining the 90-year-olds in that challenge.

As Val and Peter Black mentioned, the strategy is about housing, lifelong learning—you are right that the University of the Third Age has an important role—transport, and education, as well as health and social care. This is a cross-cutting issue and that will inform the Welsh Assembly Government's response.

On free personal care, today's motion confirms the advisory group's conclusions as Welsh Assembly Government policy. Following today's debate, I will write to Paul Murphy to support the advisory group's recommendation that this issue be addressed in the context of UK taxation and benefits policy. Like the advisory group, the Welsh Assembly Government is clear that it would be impractical for the Assembly to pursue a policy of free personal care in Wales. If we are not successful, Kirsty, we will press the UK Government for the powers and resources to consider the matter in Wales.

David Melding: The UK Government has formally responded to the royal commission. Will you now ask it to withdraw its response rejecting the funding of personal care from general taxation and issue a new one? Do you realistically hope that the UK Government will do that?

Jane Hutt: I have made it clear that I will write to Paul Murphy in support of the advisory group's recommendation that this issue should be addressed in the context of UK taxation and benefits policy, and to ensure that those views are shared with the UK Government.

Jane Hutt: Those principles are in every chapter of the report and have clearly steered and influenced the advisory group.

To return to the distinctive Welsh policy that we are developing, it is coherent and it is about building on flexibility, as Gwenda Thomas said, and developing health and wellbeing strategies that the local health boards will have the statutory responsibility to implement. Older people will be engaged at a community level to help develop those strategies. The fundamental principles of the Welsh strategy for older people are maximising independence, alleviating financial hardship and providing fairness and opportunity. We need the increases to our budget to deliver our aspirations for older people, Dai. There is much to be done. We are progressing the reform of charging arrangements in Wales, including free nursing care for self-funders at a much higher level than is the case in England and Scotland. A review of capital limits will examine the needs of low income owner-occupiers, of whom we have a large number in Wales.

As Ann and Peter remarked, we have a 12-week disregard of capital assets when somebody goes into care. Also, six weeks' free home care following hospital discharge was announced in April. That provides us with a great opportunity, Gwenda, to develop the kind of coherent, local provision you mentioned. There are also regulations that allow local authorities to take charge over a person's home to pay for care, rather than selling the home during their lifetime, as Peter Black mentioned, and statutory guidance to achieve greater fairness in

Gareth Jones: While you are discussing budget and taxation issues, will you give an assurance that the Assembly's important principles on sustainable development, equality of opportunity and social inclusion will be an integral part of the strategy?

Rhodri Glyn Thomas: Did I hear you say that £17 million will go to local authorities throughout Wales? The assessment for Carmarthenshire states that, if you opt for the higher standards, you will need to invest £20 million.

Jane Hutt: Local government and our partners in the care sector are pleased that the Welsh Assembly Government ring-fenced an extra £17 million for local authorities to help them deal with delayed transfers of care. That is the partnership that they want. This is a substantial package of reforms to tackle unfairness and to reduce the pressures on individuals in a way that is affordable and allows us to most effectively target the resources available. This Welsh package of reforms forms our response to the royal commission. I thank the advisory group for helping us to take this forward. We must remember that the advisory group spent over a year considering these issues. We must give it credit for taking longer than we are taking today to consider these challenging issues. This is about deciding what older people want by listening to them, and recognising that we all have a responsibility to make that a priority in terms of our budgets, powers and

Dadl Fer Short Debate

Cyfranogiad Pobl Ifanc mewn Gwleidyddiaeth The Participation of Young People in Politics

Jonathan Morgan: I am delighted that we are having this debate, which has been rescheduled twice, at long last. I will be cheeky and declare an obvious interest in the title of the debate.

Mick Bates: That is ageist.

Jonathan Morgan: Listen to the rest of my speech, Mick. I have agreed to let Eleanor Burnham, Owen John Thomas and Christine Chapman contribute to the debate, according to convention.

Jonathan Morgan: Yr wyf wrth fy modd ein bod yn cael y ddadl hon o'r diwedd, a hithau wedi'i hailamserlennu ddwywaith. Byddaf yn ddigywilydd a datgan buddiant amlwg yn nheitl y ddadl hon.

Mick Bates: Mae hynny'n oedranaethol.

Jonathan Morgan: Gwrandewch ar weddill fy arraith, Mick. Yr wyf wedi cytuno iadael i Eleanor Burnham, Owen John Thomas a Christine Chapman gyfrannu i'r ddadl, yn unol â'r arfer.

I chose this topic for three reasons. First, I am the youngest Assembly Member, as I have mentioned on several occasions. I feel passionately that we should do all we can to open up the political process in Cardiff bay and to engage with people, especially those of my generation, who find this sort of institution a turn-off. Secondly, we are three years into the first Assembly, and this is a timely opportunity for us to examine the impact of the younger generation on elected politics, particularly in a post-devolution Britain, and to examine whether the Assembly has taken the necessary steps to interact with young people. Thirdly, I chose this topic because the conventional view that young people are somehow not interested in the political process and political issues must be continuously and publicly challenged.

Opening up the political process is a key theme of this institution. Themes, ideas and good intentions are all very well, but the opportunities for young people to influence what happens here are still limited. Research undertaken by the BBC and organisations such as the Joseph Rowntree Foundation, the Institute for Public Policy Research and the Adam Smith Institute indicates a growing problem in attitudes towards parties, politicians and elected bodies such as the Assembly. The BBC's research and ongoing work on this topic is impressive, and provides the basis for further work. The research is important because, according to recent work by the IPPR, young people, especially those aged between 18 and 24, are less likely to register and vote than the population as a whole. Ensuring that a greater proportion of young people vote in local and national elections is only part of the challenge. More important is finding more sustainable ways of including young people in public policy discussions.

Political parties, while largely viewed in a negative light by young people, should promote elected politics as a career. It may appear strange to say that we must start to do that. As members of parties, we cannot afford to be defeatist simply because young people do not always flock to the cause of party

politics. We are the only profession in the world that seems damned useless at proactive public recruitment. We can recruit civil servants and support staff for politicians, but we are not doing enough to promote the profession of the elected politician to a younger generation. As we can all appreciate, it is a somewhat predictable career, but elected institutions such as this will have a limited future if we do not see young people elected.

There are four Assembly Members—if I may refer to David Davies, Alun Cairns, Kirsty Williams and myself, without insulting anybody else—who were all under the age of 30 when elected here three years ago. The impact of the younger generation of Assembly Members should be used to encourage the younger generation to consider politics as a career, and also to participate in politics and in the decisions that we take here. We need new people and new ideas and not to be shackled to the kind of image that turns people off. We need a new image, created in this post devolution era, which inspires confidence that life in Cardiff bay is somewhat different from the yah-boo environment of Westminster.

If you examine what the younger generation of politicians have done in Cardiff bay—and in Scotland and Northern Ireland—and the range of issues that have excited us, the campaigns that we have been involved in, and the persistence with which we have worked, our enthusiasm for this job is clear. We all have different styles and views, and we are not afraid to express them, but there is one strand that unites us: young people in this institution want to contribute to debate in this new political arena. We are not untypical of many thousands of young people throughout Wales, who also want to contribute but who, for whatever reason, feel that this institution, and politicians in general, are out of touch and out of reach.

If this institution—and democracy, in terms

of the elected parliaments and institutions of Britain—is to succeed in the long term, then we need to address the difficult issue of a generation that has less intention than any other of expressing its will at the ballot box. Without a healthy turnover of younger politicians, the stale nature of politics—whether that be local government or national politics—will continue to assist this process of disengagement. We have seen that in many Welsh local authorities. In the run-up to the English local elections in May, several young politicians decided to become radio DJs and broadcast their own shows. Have no fear: I have no intention of starting to wear a baseball cap and I am not convinced that gimmicks will convince the public and the younger generation to take politics seriously. Nor am I convinced—and research bears this out—that changing or extending polling day, putting ballot boxes in shopping centres, or extending postal votes, will convince the younger generation to vote. Young people do not want to vote, and we must ask ourselves what it is we are doing which contributes to that dangerous process.

I mentioned earlier that young people are interested in issues and debates, but do not feel that we listen to their views. The Llais Ifanc/Young Voice initiative was a welcome start. However, it would be appropriate at this point in our term of office to hear of progress and responses. How many young people have expressed an interest in the schemes that we have run? How does the Government of Wales follow up the ideas, views and interests expressed by young people? One main complaint discovered in the research was that young people felt that sitting in front of a computer and offering information about their interests and views on the internet was even more disengaging than sitting in front of a politician. While modern technology may be useful and swift, it is not the same as putting politicians and policy decision-makers in a room with young people to listen to their views. Research seems to suggest that youth fora are the most positive method of youth involvement. The European Youth Parliament discussions in this Chamber have offered the kind of environment in which young people at school can debate issues.

However, that scheme provides an opportunity for those who, in all probability, would have the confidence to voice their opinions even if the forum did not exist. Creating interest and debate at school can influence involvement in issues beyond the school setting and into adult life. We should congratulate the education team in the Assembly, which has done sterling work in organising 433 visits for educational groups since 1999. Many of those visits are linked to the curriculum and developing the personal and social education agenda. However, not everybody would feel that visiting this institution is important. It is all very well attacking disengagement at school level, but disengagement is greatest among those aged 18 to 24. Some evidence suggests that it extends beyond that, to those heading into their early thirties.

In terms of those who are less confident but no less interested in politics, we face a difficult challenge. How do we ensure that the views of those young people who lack the confidence to come to the Assembly, become as important to us as they are to them? Perhaps we could expand the remit of the Committee on Equality of Opportunity—I do not know whether that would be possible—to include the cross-cutting theme of young people. We could then consider, in depth, youth disengagement, how we feed young people's views into policy development, and how we can ensure that a generation that is becoming somewhat lost, becomes important in our consultations on legislative matters. The seriousness of this issue warrants swift action. Again, I do not know whether this is possible, but the Assembly could also consider how it shows young people that we take them, and their views on issues and policies, seriously. We should show them that we consider their views to be as important as those of the established, usual suspects that make up our standard list of consultees.

The Assembly should aim to actively encourage schools, colleges, universities, and youth associations to become involved in furthering discussions on matters of interest

I have always been suspicious of using educational institutions in Wales to promote citizenship, but I am coming round to the argument that the Assembly and its advisory bodies should examine the role of schools and how they can develop awareness of community issues. Young people should be able to debate these issues within our schools. We should not be afraid of allowing schools the freedom to develop young people's ability to think and discuss issues.

In conclusion, youth disengagement, and the lack of young people involved in the political process, threatens the future of democracy. Research bears out that those young people who are currently uninterested in politics show no sign of becoming more interested in it as they age. Therefore, we are in danger of losing this generation, and the next, for good. We should begin to challenge this decline, and consider what the Assembly can do in that respect.

Eleanor Burnham: I am sure that we all agree that the apathy displayed by many young people towards politics is worrying. We face the threat of most people not taking advantage of their right and responsibility to participate in a democratic election. When we consider that thousands of people queued for days, without anything to eat or any comforts, to vote for Nelson Mandela in South Africa, it is appalling that the youth of today do not appreciate that the continuation of democracy depends on them. Wales has a long history of being a driving force in British democracy, most notably in the Chartist movement. Without such gains we would not have had, among other things, the NHS, or free universal education. The list of democracy's achievements is long and illustrious. If young people get into the habit of not voting, democracy is in serious trouble.

The Welsh Liberal Democrats take pride in the fact that we have a disproportionately large amount of support—

Pan ystyriwn fod miloedd o bobl wedi ciwio am ddyddiau, heb ddim i'w fwyta nac unrhyw gysuron, i bleidleisio dros Nelson Mandela yn Ne Affrica, mae'n warthus nad yw ieuenciad heddiw'n sylweddoli bod democratiaeth yn dibynnau arnynt hwy am ei pharhad. Mae gan Gymru hanes hir o fod yn ysgogwr yn nemocraidaeth Prydain, ym mudiad y Siartwyr yn fwyaf arbennig. Heb welliannau o'r fath ni fyddem wedi cael, ymmsg pethau eraill, y GIG, neu addysg am ddim i bawb. Mae rhestr yr hyn a gyflawnwyd drwy ddemocratiaeth yn hir ac yn ddisglair. Os yw pobl ifanc yn mynd i'r arfer o beidio â phleidleisio, bydd democratiaeth mewn trafferth dirifol.

must wind up; you have already had a minute and a quarter.

Eleanor Burnham: We have a large amount of support among young people, whereas the average Conservative supporter is 67 years old. We want all people, of all ages and backgrounds, to engage in the political process.

Owen John Thomas: We must address apathy among young people, which is fostered by media images of politics and politicians—many of which are not unfounded. We see sleaze, spin, the convergence of British politics, and the loss of hope for young people. For example, how can you spot the difference between the parties in the National Assembly? Is David Melding to the left of Lorraine, is Peter Black more Conservative and centralist than David Davies? The confusion is considerable. Plaid Cymru offers a distinctive policy that, given the proper medium, would encourage young people to vote. Increasingly, young people in Wales recognise that they have a choice, which can rid them of their apathy. It gives them hope.

Christine Chapman: I thank Jonathan for raising this important issue. Sometimes, we presume that young people are not interested in politics, but in fact, many of them have strong views about globalisation, world poverty, fox hunting, the environment, and other issues that directly affect them. In some ways, this is an issue of definition.

In my constituency, the young people of the Fernhill Youth Project are highly political. They care for their community; they want to play a part in its regeneration and, in testimony of this, they won a Wales youth award some months ago.

Serious challenges remain—I do not dispute that—but we must build on what has already been done. We should acknowledge how much the Assembly has already achieved in bringing politics closer to young people. We have mentioned Llais Ifanc/Young Voice, but

Mae Plaid Cymru'n cynnig polisi neilltuol a fyddai, o gael y priod gyfrwng, yn cymhell pobl ifanc i bleidleisio. Christine Chapman: Diolchaf i Jonathan am godi'r mater pwysig hwn. Weithiau, yr ydym yn rhagdybio nad yw pobl ifanc yn ymddiddori mewn gwleidyddiaeth ond, mewn gwirionedd, mae gan lawer ohonynt ddaliadau cryf am globaleiddio, tlodi byd, hela llwynogod, yr amgylchedd, a materion eraill sy'n effeithio arnynt yn uniongyrchol. Ar ryw ystyr, mae hyn yn fater o ddiffinio.

Yn fy etholaeth i, mae pobl ifanc Prosiect Ieuencid Fernhill yn dra gwleidyddol. Maent yn gofalu am eu cymuned; maent am chwarae rhan yn ei hadfywiad ac, yn brawf o hynny, enillasant wobr i ieuencid Cymru rai misoedd yn ôl.

Mae heriau anodd o hyd—nid wyf yn amau hynny—ond rhaid inni adeiladu ar sail yr hyn a wnaethpwyd eisoes. Dylem gydnabod cymaint y mae'r Cynulliad wedi'i gyflawni eisoes wrth ddod â gwleidyddiaeth yn agosach at bobl ifanc. Yr ydym wedi sôn am

we must also remember how much the Assembly is making it easier for everybody—including young people—to access Assembly Members, via letters, e-mail or visits to the Chamber. We must build upon this improvement in open government.

The Minister for Education and Lifelong Learning (Jane Davidson): I thank Jonathan for tabling this debate, and I am delighted that, three weeks late, we have had a chance to listen to you. No-one needs convincing of the importance of including young people in the political process. Our democratic future depends on capturing the interest of young people, not simply as voters, but as active participants in political life. Members' contributions suggested different ways to capture interest in the democratic process, but the means are not as important as achieving that end.

I reply on behalf of the Welsh Assembly Government, and the contribution that we can make to this process. These issues are relevant to every Minister's portfolio. The Government cannot intervene in the life of political parties, but we can invest in the groundwork that prepares young people for involvement in political life, by creating ways in which young people can engage with our political structure. We can try to ensure that young people gain the confidence to participate in public affairs and help them to develop a sense of citizenship and an understanding of what it means to make a difference. Unless we carry out that preparatory work, we will have failed to provide our young people with the basic building blocks to develop active participation in the political process.

Some Members may have walked into the Chamber when we were not using it, as I have done, and found young people in debate, thanks to such initiatives as the European Youth Forum. My Cabinet colleague, Sue Essex invited sixth-formers to debate local issues in the Chamber. Many of us have spoken with secondary school pupils, and visited young people in our constituencies. That is a matter for us as individual Members.

Nid oes angen argyhoeddi neb mor bwysig yw cynnwys pobl ifanc yn y broses wleidyddol. Mae dyfodol ein democrataeth yn dibynnu ar ein gallu i ennyn diddordeb pobl ifanc, nid yn unig fel pleidleiswyr, ond fel cyfranogion gweithredol mewn bywyd gwleidyddol. Yr oedd cyfraniadau'r Aelodau'n awgrymu gwahanol ddulliau o ennyn diddordeb yn y broses ddemocrataidd, ond nid yw'r modd mor bwysig â chyrraedd y nod honno.

Ymatebaf ar ran Llywodraeth Cynulliad Cymru, a'r cyfraniad y gallwn ei wneud i'r broses hon. Mae'r materion hyn yn berthnasol i bortffolio pob Gweinidog. Ni all y Llywodraeth ymyrryd ym mywyd y pleidiau gwleidyddol, ond gallwn fuddsoddi yn y gwaith sy'n paratoi pobl ifanc i gymryd rhan mewn bywyd gwleidyddol, drwy greu modd i bobl ifanc gysylltu â'n strwythur gwleidyddol. Gwahoddodd fy nghyd-Weinidog yn y Cabinet, Sue Essex, ddisgyblion dosbarth chwech i gynnal dadl ar faterion lleol yn y Siambr. Mae llawer ohonom wedi siarad â disgyblion ysgol uwchradd, ac wedi mynd i weld pobl ifanc yn ein hetholaethau. Mae

hynny'n fater i ni fel Aelodau unigol.

Helen Mary Jones: Do you agree that one of the best examples of such an occasion was when young disabled people, some with learning difficulties, asked questions of Ministers as though they were Assembly Members? I congratulate the Cabinet for arranging that, and I sincerely hope—particularly for those who are more excluded from the democratic process than others—that we can continue to build on what we have achieved.

Jane Davidson: That goes to the heart of the Assembly's philosophy, not only the Cabinet's. We want to ensure that past processes, which may have attracted more articulate young people, now attract all young people to political debate. Our approach in the documents 'Children and Young People: A Framework for Partnership' and 'Extending Entitlement: Supporting Young People in Wales' concerns finding mechanisms to encourage all our young people—whatever their background—to influence the development of Assembly policy. Children and young people should be treated as valued members of the community, whose voices are heard and whose needs are considered across the range of policy making.

That ideal is firmly based on our belief in the importance of active citizenship, social inclusion and the involvement of our children and young people in activities in their communities and beyond.

Christine Chapman: Do you agree that the Assembly must not be seen as merely a building in Cardiff bay, but that all politicians must engage actively with young people in their communities? It is almost a virtual Assembly, not just a building in Cardiff bay. What we do in our constituencies is equally important.

Jane Davidson: This is not just about what we as Members do. It is about putting the right structures in place to enable young people to participate better. Through the agendas that I described, 'Children and Young People: A Framework for Partnership' and 'Extending Entitlement', we are

Helen Mary Jones: A ydych yn cytuno mai un o'r goreuon o blith y digwyddiadau o'r fath oedd hwnnw pan oedd pobl ifanc anabl, a rhai ohonynt ag anableddau dysgu, yn gofyn cwestiynau i Weinidogion fel pe byddent yn Aelodau Cynulliad? Mae'r ddelfryd honno wedi'i seilio'n gadarn ar ein cred ym mhwysigrwydd dinasyddiaeth weithredol, cynhwysiant cymdeithasol a'r rhan a gymerir gan ein plant a'n pobl ifanc mewn gweithgareddau yn eu cymunedau a'r tu hwnt.

Christine Chapman: A ydych yn credu bod yn rhaid i'r Cynulliad gael ei ystyried yn fwy na dim ond adeilad ym mae Caerdydd, a bod rhaid i'r holl wleidyddion ymwneud o ddifrif â phobl ifanc yn eu cymunedau? Mae'n Gynulliad rhithiol bron, nid adeilad ym mae Caerdydd yn unig. Mae'r hyn a wnawn yn ein hetholaethau yr un mor bwysig.

Jane Davidson: Mae hyn yn ymwneud â mwy na'r hyn a wnawn fel Aelodau. Mae'n golygu rhoi'r strwythurau iawn ar waith i alluogi pobl ifanc i gyfranogi'n well. Drwy'r agendâu a ddisgrifiaus, 'Plant a Phobl Ifanc: Fframwaith ar gyfer Partneriaeth' ac 'Ymestyn Hawliau', yr ydym yn ystyried

considering setting structures at national and local levels that will involve young people in the planning and review of their services, involving local authorities, health services and schools. Let us remember that young people were involved in the appointment of the Children's Commissioner for Wales. The establishment of Llais Ifanc/Young Voice as an effective all-Wales body that enables the young to play a full part in decision making has been mentioned. The body will comprise representatives from local youth forums, other people-led groups and voluntary sector projects. All Members will be as proud as I was when I discovered that that particular initiative was used as a key example of best practice in the European White Paper on youth. We want young people to become active players in local government and local health services planning by consulting them on their needs through their local fora and by involving them in the production of local community and framework plans. I agree with Jonathan that schools are key. We consulted on proposals in 'The Learning Country' to have a school council in every primary and secondary school in Wales. Whenever I visit schools as Minister for Education and Lifelong Learning—which is three times a week at least, and six times this week—that have school councils, young people tell me how valuable it is as a means for them to contribute to the debate. They are particularly important in providing opportunities to put into practice the principles of active citizenship and in contributing to the curriculum at secondary level.

Gareth Jones: Mae sefydlu'r fath gynghorau ymhob ysgol yn holl bwysig. Mae'n rhoi cyfle arbennig i'r disgylion gyfrannu a bod yn rhan o wneud penderfyniadau. Yr ydym am i bobl ifanc gymryd rhan weithredol mewn cynllunio mewn llywodraeth leol a gwasanaethau iechyd lleol drwy ymgynghori ar eu hanghenion drwy eu fforymau lleol a thrwy'r rhan a gymerant mewn cynhyrchu cynlluniau fframwaith a chymunedol lleol. Cytunaf â Jonathan fod yr ysgolion yn allweddol. Gwnaethom ymgynghori ar y cynigion yn 'Y Wlad sy'n Dysgu' i gael cyngor ysgol ym mhob ysgol gynradd ac uwchradd yng Nghymru. Pryd bynnag yr ymwelaf ag ysgolion fel y Gweinidog dros Addysg a Dysgu Gydol Oes—sef teirgwaith yr wythnos o leiaf, a chwe gwaith yr wythnos hon—sydd â chynghorau ysgol, mae'r bobl ifanc yn dweud wrthyf mor werthfawr ydyw fel modd iddynt gyfrannu i'r ddadl. Maent yn arbennig o bwysig o ran cynnig cyfleoedd i roi ar waith yr egwyddorion o ddinasyddiaeth weithredol a chyfrannu i'r cwricwlwm ar y lefel uwchradd.

Gareth Jones: Establishing such councils in every school is crucial. It gives pupils a unique opportunity to make a contribution and participate in decision making. Do you believe that we should examine the method of delivering the curriculum in our schools? I do not mean the compulsory core subjects, but the experiences that the children have in the classroom. That is where it counts. Unless we change our method of delivering the curriculum, many young people will leave school with the wrong experiences and will feel disaffected by politics.

Jane Davidson: We will be reviewing the curriculum for 14 to 19-year olds later this year. Yesterday, at a school in Gwynedd, I observed the alternative curriculum delivery and saw how important it is for young people in terms of challenging disaffection. That is happening throughout Wales. Citizenship is key, and is part of the personal and social educational framework that requires young people to learn about their rights and responsibilities in a democratic society under rule of law. That can encourage a political literacy in young people to help enable them to make effective decisions and judgments. In developing the Welsh baccalaureate, we are keeping in mind the importance of citizenship and political literacy. That programme will include activities where students can examine political systems and their importance. As I said when I announced the 19 pilot centres, young people will complete the first Welsh baccalaureate in 2005. They will have subject qualifications under their belts that will give them the best possible chance of entering work or further study, in Wales or elsewhere. They will be able to talk confidently of the voluntary work, work experience and enterprise activities they will have engaged in. Future employers will notice the transferable skills—the thinking skills that Jonathan referred to—that will help them perform better at work or study. They will know their local communities in some depth.

They will be confident in their roots and identity. Who knows, their first holidays abroad as young adults could see them using their baccalaureate Spanish in Gran Canaria or their baccalaureate French in Tunisia.

Eleanor Burnham: Do you agree with the Liberal Democrat policy of lowering the voting age to 16 years of age, as we entrust young people with taxation and so on, at that age?

Jane Davidson: Byddwn yn adolygu'r cwricwlwm i bobl ifanc 14 i 19 mlwydd oed yn ddiweddarach eleni. Ddoe, mewn ysgol yng Ngwynedd, arsylwais ar gyflwyno'r cwricwlwm amgen a gwelais mor bwysig ydyw i bobl ifanc o ran herio ymddieithrio. Mae hynny'n digwydd ledled Cymru. Mae dinasyddiaeth yn allweddol, ac mae'n rhan o'r fframwaith addysgol personol a chymdeithasol, sy'n mynnu bod pobl ifanc yn dysgu am eu hawliau a'u cyfrifoldebau mewn cymdeithas ddemocratiaidd o dan reolaeth y gyfraith. Fe all hynny hybu llythrennedd gwleidyddol ymmsg pobl ifanc i'w helpu i wneud penderfyniadau a dyfarniadau effeithiol. Wrth ddatblygu'r fagloriaeth Gymreig, yr ydym yn cofio am bwysigrwydd dinasyddiaeth a llythrennedd gwleidyddol. Bydd y rhaglen honno'n cynnwys gweithgareddau lle y caiff myfyrwyr archwilio systemau gwleidyddol a'u pwysigrwydd. Fel y dywedaïs wrth gyhoeddi'r 19 canolfan beilot, bydd pobl ifanc yn cwblhau'r Fagloriaeth Gymreig gyntaf yn 2005. Byddant wedi ennill cymwysterau pwnc a fydd yn rhoi'r cyfle gorau posibl iddynt gael gwaith neu astudio ymhellach, yng Nghymru neu mewn man arall. Byddant yn gallu siarad yn hyderus am y gwaith gwirfoddol, y profiad gwaith a'r gweithgareddau menter y byddant wedi cymryd rhan ynddynt. Bydd cyflogwyr y dyfodol yn sylwi ar y sgiliau trosglwyddadwy—y sgiliau meddwl y cyfeiriodd Jonathan atynt—a fydd yn eu helpu i wneud yn well yn eu gwaith neu eu hastudiaethau. Byddant yn adhabod eu cymunedau lleol yn eithaf manwl.

Bydd ganddynt hyder yn eu gwreiddiau a'u hunaniaeth. Pwy a wyr, ar eu gwyliau cyntaf dramor fel oedolion ifanc, efallai y byddant yn arfer y Sbaeneg o'u bagloriaeth yn Gran Canaria neu'r Ffrangeg o'u bagloriaeth yn Nhïwnisia.

Eleanor Burnham: A ydych yn cytuno â pholisi'r Democratiaid Rhyddfrydol o ostwng yr oed pleidleisio i 16 mlwydd oed, gan ein bod yn ymddiried pobl ifanc â threthiant ac yn y blaen, yn yr oed hwnnw?

Jane Davidson: I will return to the Welsh Assembly Government's response to the issues raised in this debate.

The theme of participation and citizenship runs through our approach to the provision of support services for young people—the approach advocated through 'Extending Entitlement'—focusing on giving young people a chance to succeed, develop self-confidence and be independent. A key message that we can convey as politicians in a world where people increasingly consider which qualifications are appropriate for jobs is that we have jobs that do not require qualifications but which require us to be driven by a passion to improve society. I often see that passion when I meet young people, as Jonathan has, and as has Jane Hutt in her role as the Minister for young people.

Last summer we arranged events at which over 400 young people from diverse backgrounds across Wales had an opportunity to air their opinions about our approach to youth policy as set out in 'Extending Entitlement'. I spent several days with these young people and I was immensely impressed with their huge amount of enthusiasm, their willingness to tell us their opinions and the common sense and realism that they demonstrated. We must demonstrate that willingness to listen and take their views on board in terms of taking the agenda forward. Young people are not asking for the impossible. They want the adults who come into contact with them to listen to them and show them some respect. They tell us that they want good quality information on matters such as sexual health, substance misuse, careers, housing and benefits, and in a form that they can understand so that they can make informed choices. We have already put this in hand with Assembly funding to Canllaw Online information services, and a range of other initiatives supported by the Cabinet.

Young people also tell us that they need skilled support and sometimes expert counselling of different kinds and varying degrees throughout their adolescent years to enable them to grow into confident and effective citizens. This support, if it has been

Mae thema cyfranogiad a dinasyddiaeth yn rhedeg drwy ein dull o ddarparu gwasanaethau cymorth i bobl ifanc—y dull sy'n cael ei argymhell yn 'Ymestyn Hawliau'—sy'n canolbwytio ar roi cyfle i bobl ifanc lwyddo, meithrin hunanhyder a bod yn annibynnol. Maent am i'r oedolion a ddaw i gysylltiad â hwy wrando arnynt a dangos rhywfaint o barch tuag atynt. Maent yn dweud wrthym fod arnynt angen gwybodaeth o ansawdd da am faterion fel iechyd rhywiol, camddefnyddio sylweddau, gyrfaoedd, tai a budd-daliadau, a hynny ar ffurf y gallant ei deall fel y gallant wneud dewisiadau gwybodus. Yr ydym eisoes wedi rhoi hynny ar waith drwy roi arian y Cynulliad at wasanaethau gwybodaeth Canllaw Ar-lein, ac amryw o fentrau eraill a gefnogir gan y Cabinet.

We are now taking steps to rectify the situation through the network of young people's partnerships, which will be in place through statute from September 2002. Wales is the only part of the UK where youth work will be statutory because of our commitment to young people and informal and formal learning opportunities.

We are directing local authorities to set up young people's partnerships to put in place a more comprehensive support structure. Those partnerships will be expected to work with young people, and not for young people, as services have tended to do in the past, to audit existing provision and need in relation to service provision and support services, to identify key priorities and to develop planning to meet young people's needs on a year by year basis.

We have asked local authorities working with young people on this agenda to dream the dream and consider developing proposals through to 2008. They can be ambitious about how they will work with young people in their areas. If these partnerships work and the support mechanisms are established, and if we engage young people through Llais Ifanc—as Jonathan said, evidence suggests that youth fora are the best way of engaging with young people—and make it meaningful, listen to young people as politicians and demonstrate in our policies that we are delivering for them, then Wales could show the way forward, not only for other parts of the UK, but for the world. That is why I was so pleased to see that the European White Paper on youth recognised the immense contribution that has already been made in developing policies in Wales for young people. Therefore, there are major challenges for the future.

Jonathan, I am pleased that you brought this debate forward today. Involving young people in the political process is not a party political issue, it is about engaging them in democracy, and engaging with them so that they do not have to fight or die for the vote as

Cymuned yr Armeniaid yng Nghymru a'r Hil-laddiad yn Nhwrci The Armenian Community in Wales and Genocide in Turkey

Cynog Dafis: Yn ystod y ddwy flynedd ddiwethaf mynchais nifer o gyfarfodydd a drefnwyd gan gymdeithas brawdgarwch Cymru ac Armenia. Un rheswm dros ei ffurfio oedd i berswadio'r Cynulliad Cenedlaethol i wneud datganiad i'r perwyl ei fod yn cydnabod yn swyddogol wirionedd hil-laddiad yr Armeniaid yn Nhwrci yn 1915.

Cynhaliwyd gwasanaeth coffáu arbennig yn y Deml Heddwch yng Nghaerdydd ar 24 Ebrill 2001—pen-blwydd cychwyn yr hil-laddiad—y bu Rhodri Morgan a Jenny Randerson yn bresennol ynddo. Flwyddyn cyn hynny, cynhaliwyd arddangosfa yno o luniau arswydus Armin Wegner, sy'n rhan allweddol o'r dystiolaeth am yr hil-laddiad. Bu arddangosfa yn y Cynulliad, hefyd. Traddodwyd darlithoedd pwysig yn y Deml Heddwch ar achlysuron eraill a bu gwasanaeth a chyflwyniad yn y Cynulliad ar 25 Ebrill 2002.

Nid digwyddiadau 1915 oedd yr enghraift gyntaf o'r Armeniaid yn cael eu herlid yn ffiaidd yn Nhwrci. Rhwng 1894 ac 1896, er enghraift, lladdwyd dros 100,000 o Armeniaid gan filwyr arbennig ar orchymyn y swltan. Serch hynny, yr oedd digwyddiadau 1915 a'r blynnyddoedd wedi hynny yn wahanol: hil-laddiad yng ngwir ystyr y gair arswydus hwnnw. Mae'r gair hwnnw'n cael ei orddefnyddio, ond nid yn yr achos hwn lle y cafwyd proses systematig a threfnedig o ddileu poblogaeth gyfan.

Yn 1915 yr oedd 2 filiwn o Armeniaid yn byw yn Nhwrci: 10 y cant o boblogaeth y wlad. Yn ystod 1915 lladdwyd 1.5 miliwn ohonynt, a dadgludwyd mwyafrif y gweddi. Ym Mai 1918, wrth i fyddin Twrci ymosod tua'r dwyrain lladdwyd 100,000 yn

Cynog Dafis: During the last two years I have attended a number of meetings organised by Wales-Armenia Solidarity. One reason for forming that organisation was to persuade the National Assembly to make a statement to the effect that it officially recognises the authenticity of the Armenian genocide in Turkey in 1915.

A special service of remembrance was held in Cardiff's Temple of Peace on 24 April 2001—the anniversary of the start of the genocide—at which Rhodri Morgan and Jenny Randerson were present. A year earlier, an exhibition was held there of the shocking pictures taken by Armin Wegner, which form a key part of the evidence for the genocide. There was also an exhibition in the Assembly. Important speeches have been given in the Temple of Peace on other occasions and on 25 April 2002 a service and presentation was held at the Assembly.

The events of 1915 were not the first example of the Armenians being brutally persecuted in Turkey. Between 1894 and 1896, for example, over 100,000 Armenians were killed by special forces on the sultan's orders. However, the events of 1915 and the following years were different: it was genocide in the true sense of that terrifying word. The word is overused, but not in this case where there was a systematic and organised process to exterminate an entire population.

In 1915 there were 2 million Armenians living in Turkey: 10 per cent of the country's population. During 1915, 1.5 million of them were killed, and the majority of the rest was taken away. In May 1918, as the Turkish army made an eastward incursion, a further

Af yn ôl i 1915 ac at wahanol gamau’r dinistr. Gwnaed y cyfan ar orchymyn y triwr a lywodraethai Dwrci ar y pryd, y ‘Tyrciaid ifanc’ fel y’u gelwid. Cafwyd cynhadledd arbennig, cynulliad cyfrinachol o ryw 75 o brif arweinyddion Twrci yn Istanbwl, i gwblhau cynllun gweithredu i ddatrys y cwestiwn Armeniaidd. Y cam cyntaf oedd portreadu’r Armeniaid fel gelynion mewnol ac annog eu herlid. Y cam nesaf oedd diarfogi 40,000 o filwyr Armeniaidd ym myddin Twrci, a’u lladd. Wedyn arestiwyd rhyw 300 o ddeallusion ac arweinyddion allweddol, a’u dienyddio. Tro’r gwragedd, y plant a’r oedrannus oedd nesaf; cawsant eu gorfodi o’u cartrefi gan esgus bod yn rhaid gwneud hynny er eu diogelwch. Cafodd llawer eu lladd a bu eraill farw o newyn, syched ac effeithiau noethni. Mae’r disgrifiadau o’r dioddefaint yn ddirdyngol. Gallwch eu gweld ar wefan ymgyrch cydnabod hil-laddiad yr Armeniaid.

Beth yw’r dystiolaeth fod hyn wedi digwydd? Cafwyd dystiolaeth gan Almaenwyr a oedd yn Nhwrci ar y pryd, gan gynnwys Armin Wegner yn arbennig, a adawodd archif anferth o ffordograffau. Yr oedd llygad-dystion o blith diplomyddion a chenhadon Americanaidd. Cyhoeddwyd erythglau yn y wasg orllewinol a chyhoeddodd Llywodraethau Prydain, Ffrainc a Rwsia rybudd i Dwrci y byddai aelodau ei Llywodraeth yn cael eu dal yn gyfrifol am yr hyn a oedd yn digwydd.

Yn Chwefror 1916, comisiynwyd yr hanesydd Arnold Toynbee ac eraill gan Lywodraeth Prydain i gasglu’r dystiolaeth a’i chyhoeddi mewn llyfr glas seneddol. Gwyddom yng Nghymru am lyfrau gleision seneddol, ond dyma lyfr glas seneddol

100,000 were killed. The ‘Armenian difficulty’, in David Lloyd George’s bitterly ironic words, had been ‘simplified’. When Kemal Ataturk came to power in 1920, the work, of destroying every trace of the Armenians’ heritage, including architectural masterpieces, libraries, archives, and entire cities and villages continued just as systematically—destroying 3,000 years of history.

I will go back to 1915 and the different stages of the destruction. It was all carried out at the order of the triumvirate that governed Turkey at the time, the ‘young Turks’ as they were known. A special conference was held, a secret assembly of some 75 of the major Turkish leaders in Istanbul, to complete the action plan that would solve the Armenian problem. The first step was to portray the Armenians as the enemy within and encourage their persecution. The next step was to disarm 40,000 Armenian soldiers serving in the Turkish army and execute them. Then about 300 key intellectuals and leaders were arrested and executed. Next it was the turn of women, children and the elderly; they were marched from their homes, under the pretext that that had to be done for their own safety. Many of them were killed and others died of starvation, dehydration and the affects of exposure. The descriptions of the suffering are heart-rending. You can see them on the website of the campaign for recognition of the Armenian genocide.

What is the evidence that all this happened? There was evidence from Germans who were in Turkey at that time, including Armin Wegner in particular, who left a massive archive of photographs. There were eyewitnesses among American diplomats and missionaries. Articles were published in the western press, and the Governments of Britain, France and Russia issued a warning to Turkey that members of its Government would be held accountable for the events.

In February 1916, the historian Arnold Toynbee and others were commissioned by the British government to collect the evidence and publish it in a parliamentary blue book. We in Wales know all about parliamentary blue books, but this was an

Soniodd Lloyd George yn 1939 am holocaustau 1915. Mae'r gair 'holocaust' yn arwyddocaol, yn enwedig o'i ddefnyddio yn 1939. Byddwch wedi sylwi ar y tebygrwydd oerllyd rhwng y digwyddiadau a'r meddylfryd oedd y tu ôl iddynt, a'r hyn a wnaethpwyd i'r Iddewon gan y Natsiaid chwarter canrif yn ddiweddarach. Yn ôl Michael Joseph, sydd wedi astudio'r hanes, nid cyd-ddigwyddiad mo hynny. Yn hytrach, daethpwyd â gwersi hil-laddiad yr Armeniaid yn ôl i'r Almaen gan filwyr a ymunodd â'r Natsiaid ar ôl dychwelyd o Dwrci, ac fe'u cymhwyswyd i brosiect Adolf Hitler. Wrth annerch ei gadfridogion yn Awst 1939, ac yntau'n cynllunio lladdfa didostur ar y Pwyliaid, dywedodd Hitler:

'Pwy, wedi'r cwbl, sy'n sôn heddiw am ddilead yr Armeniaid?'

Parhaodd drwy ddweud mai eu bwriad oedd cyflwyno polisi o ailanheddu. Dywedodd wrthynt i feddwl am y dadgludiadau Beiblaidd a chyflafanau'r Oesoedd Canol, ac i gofio difodiant yr Armeniaid.

Ei bwyt oedd ei bod yn bosibl cyflawni hil-laddiad a bod yn rhydd o unrhyw gosb ac y cai'r digwyddiad ei anghofio. Yr oedd yn sôn am y Pwyliaid ar y pryd, ond mae'n amlwg ei fod yn meddwl am yr Iddewon hefyd.

A oes angen gofyn, felly, pam ei bod yn bwysig cydnabod hil-laddiad yr Armeniaid? Beth yw ein ded fryd ni ar unrhyw un sy'n gwadu ymdrech Hitler i ddileu'r Iddewon o wyneb y ddaear? Mae gadael trosedd mor enbyd yn erbyn y ddynoliaeth heb ei chydnabod, yn drosedd ynddi ei hun.

Pwy sydd yn cydnabod yr hil-laddiad diamheuol hwn? Dechreuwn yn agos i gartref. Drwy gydol y rhyfel byd cyntaf, bu i Aneurin Williams, Aelod Seneddol o Gymro nad wyl yn gwybod dim o'i hanes, dynnu sylw'r Swyddfa Dramor at y perygl, ac yna at

exceptionally important blue book. There is no doubt about the facts: genocide had been perpetuated.

In 1939, Lloyd George talked of the 1915 holocausts. The word 'holocaust' is significant, particularly when used in 1939. You will have noticed the chilling similarity between these events and the philosophy behind them, and what the Nazis did to the Jews a quarter of a century later. According to Michael Joseph, who has studied the history, this was no coincidence. Rather, the lessons of the Armenian genocide were brought back to Germany by soldiers who joined the Nazis on returning from Turkey, and were applied to Adolf Hitler's project. In an address to his generals in August 1939, while planning the merciless slaughter of the Poles, Hitler said:

'Who, after all, talks nowadays of the annihilation of the Armenians?'

He went on to say that it was their intention to introduce a policy of repatriation. He told them to think of the Biblical diaspora and the massacres of the Middle Ages, and to remember the extermination of the Armenians.

His point was that it was possible to commit genocide without facing punishment and that the event would be forgotten. He was referring to the Poles at the time, but it is obvious that he was also thinking about the Jews.

Do we need to ask, therefore, why it is important to recognise the Armenian genocide? How do we judge those who seek to deny the authenticity of Hitler's efforts to exterminate the Jews? To leave such a terrible crime against humanity unrecognised is a crime in itself.

Who recognises this indisputable genocide? We will start close to home. Throughout the first world war, Aneurin Williams, a Welsh Member of Parliament about whom I know nothing, drew the Foreign Office's attention to the threat, and then the reality, of a

'Yn sicr, mae bai ar Lywodraeth Twrci am wadu'r hil-laddiad. Ac...fel un a fu'n hanesydd, yr wyf yn gwybod sut i farnu tystiolaeth a thafoli dadleuon, a barnu lle mae'r gwir...Mae'r digwyddiadau hyn yn gwbl nodwediadol o hil-laddiad'.

Yr oedd Rhodri Morgan yn bresennol yn y cyfarfod hwnnw hefyd. Derbyniodd gopi o'r llyfr glas seneddol a gosododd dorch ar y gofeb. Yn dilyn y cyfarfod, dywedodd llefarydd ar ran Rhodri Morgan nad oedd presenoldeb dau o Weinidogion y Cynulliad Cenedlaethol o anghenraig yn golygu bod y weinyddiaeth yn cydnabod yr hil-laddiad, ond nad oedd hynny yn eu rhwystro, fel gwleidyddion, rhag ei gydnabod. Dyna ichi gydnabyddiaeth, er y byddwn yn croesawu geiriad mwy diamwys na hynny.

Mae'r ymgyrch i gael mwy o bobl i ddatgan cydnabyddiaeth yn mynd rhagddi. Mae dros 100 o seneddau, cynulliadau rhanbarthol a chynghorau lleol wedi gwneud hynny eisoes. Mae gobaith y bydd Senedd y Swistir yn gwneud hynny hefyd cyn bo hir. Ar 28 Chwefror 2002, bu i Senedd yr Undeb Ewropeaidd, drwy fwyafrif o 391 yn erbyn 96, ddatgan bod yn rhaid i Dwrci gydnabod yr hil-laddiad Armenaidd cyn y gall ymuno â'r Undeb Ewropeaidd. Amen i hynny. Hoffwn ychwanegu amodau eraill at hynny, yn enwedig yr angen i gydnabod hawliau diwylliannol a gwleidyddol y Cwrdiaid.

Pwy sy'n gwrthod cydnabod yr hil-laddiad? Yn gyntaf, wrth gwrs, y mae Llywodraeth Twrci, sydd yn rhedeg ymgyrch systematig, drwyndl i wadu'r hil-laddiad yn llwyr. Nododd Jenny Randerson i gynrychiolwyr o Lywodraeth Twrci bwyso arni i gau ei cheg ar ôl iddi fynegi barn ar y pwnc. Beth arall sydd i'w ddisgwyl gan wlad sy'n gormesu ei lleiafrif Cwrdaidd yn greulon o awdurdodus, yn wir, yn gwadu ei fodolaeth—gwlad a

massacre in Turkey. He may also have been influential in the subsequent inquiry set up by the British Government. Lloyd George's use of the words I quoted earlier were an unambiguous recognition of the genocide. Even closer to home, during the memorial service at the Temple of Peace, the Assembly Minister, Jenny Randerson, said that:

'Turkey can certainly be blamed for its modern denial. And...as someone who in past life was a historian, I know how to judge evidence and weigh up the pros and cons, and to judge where the truth lies...[These] events bear all the hallmarks of genocide'.

Rhodri Morgan also attended that service. He received a copy of the parliamentary blue book and placed a wreath on the memorial. Following the service, Rhodri Morgan's spokesperson said that the presence of two Assembly Ministers did not necessarily mean that the administration recognises the genocide, but that does not prevent them, as politicians, from recognising the events. That is recognition enough, although I would have welcomed a less ambiguous wording.

The campaign to encourage more people to recognise the genocide is ongoing. Over 100 parliaments, regional assemblies, and local councils have already done so. It is hoped that the Swiss Parliament will also do so soon. On 28 February 2002, the European Union Parliament, by a majority of 391 to 96, stated that Turkey must recognise the Armenian genocide before it could join the European Union. Amen to that. I would apply other conditions, particularly the need to recognise the cultural and political rights of the Kurds.

Who is unwilling to recognise the genocide? First, of course, is the Turkish Government, which is conducting a systematic and thorough campaign to deny the genocide outright. Jenny Randerson said that representatives of the Turkish Government brought pressure to bear on her to be silent after she spoke out on this issue. What else would you expect from a country that so cruelly oppresses its Kurdish minority,

Fodd bynnag, yr hyn sydd yn ofnadwy yw gafael rhyfeddol Llywodraeth Twrci ar wledydd y Gorllewin ac ar Brydain, yr Unol Daleithiau a'r Almaen yn enwedig. Mae'r gwledydd hynny yn gwrthod cydnabod mai hil-laddiad oedd yr hyn a wnaethpwyd i'r Armeniaid. Maent yn cydnabod bod ysgelerderau wedi digwydd ond maent yn gwrthod defnyddio'r gair cywir na'r enw priodol amdanynt—yn yr yn modd ag y mae Llywodraeth Prydain yn gwrthod cydnabod mai trosedd yn erbyn y ddynoliaeth oedd y farchnad gaethwasiaeth. Rhag eu cywilydd—dyna safonau dwbl. Beth a ddywedai'r Llywodraeth wrth y rhai sydd yn gwrthod cydnabod yr holocaust Iddewig am yr hyn ydoedd?

Beth allwn ni ei wneud? Yn anffodus, ni allwn basio penderfyniad o gydnabyddiaeth gyda'r bwriad o roi pwysau ar Lywodraeth y Deyrnas Gyfunol i gydnabod yr hil-laddiad. Hynny fyddai'n ddelfrydol. Fodd bynnag, cyflwynwyd datganiad o farn Rhif 2000-0029 ym mis Mawrth 2000. Mae'r datganiad yn cydnabod y gwirionedd am yr hil-laddiad. Mae'n galw ar Dwrci i derfynu'r gwarchae economaidd ar Weriniaeth Armenia, sy'n fater arall sy'n codi ei ben ar hyn o bryd. indeed, denies its very existence—a country with such a terrible record on human rights?

I spent a day in a court of law in Ankara, during the trial of a Kurdish Member of Parliament, who was facing charges relating to his use of the Kurdish language and referring to the Kurdish problem. That was his crime and he was on trial. A picture of Kemal Ataturk was hanging on the wall above the bench, and his spirit permeated the place.

However, what is even worse is the remarkable hold that the Turkish Government has over Western countries, particularly Britain, the United States and Germany. These countries refuse to acknowledge that what was suffered by the Armenians was genocide. They acknowledge that these atrocities took place, but they refuse to use the correct word or the proper name for them—in the same way as the British Government refuses to acknowledge that slavery was a crime against humanity. They should be ashamed of themselves—that is what I call double standards. What would the Government say to those who refused to recognise the Jewish holocaust for what it was?

What can we do? Unfortunately, we cannot pass a resolution of acknowledgement with the aim of putting pressure on the UK Government to acknowledge the genocide. That would be ideal. However, a statement of opinion No. 2000-0029 was tabled in March 2000. The statement acknowledges the true nature of the genocide. It asks Turkey to end its economic blockade on the Republic of Armenia. That is another issue. The Republic of Armenia, which is situated to the east of Turkey, used to be part of the former Soviet Union, and it is being blockaded by Turkey. The statement also calls for the British Government to oppose Turkey's entry into the European Union until it acknowledges the genocide and ends the blockade on the Republic of Armenia.

At the moment, only 15 Members from only three parties have signed the statement. If a majority of Assembly Members signed, that would be as good as a majority resolution

The Minister for Rural Affairs and Assembly Business (Carwyn Jones): There is no doubt that the first world war had tragic consequences, not just for the people of Western Europe but for the peoples of the former Ottoman Empire and the former Austro-Hungarian Empire. In 1918, at the conclusion of that war, the victorious powers—Britain, France, USA and Italy—met to discuss and sign the Treaty of Versailles. At the time, it was said that the first world war was a war to defend small nations. In 1918, Woodrow Wilson, the US President, attempted to recognise and protect the rights of small nations. They proved to be fine words at the time. The aftermath of the

following a debate. It would be even better if it were an overwhelming majority.

That is my appeal today, not only to Members present in the Chamber, but to all Assembly Members. In such an extraordinary case, it may be possible to make an exception to the rule that party leaders and Cabinet Members are not allowed to sign such statements.

I quote Jenny Randerson again:

'We must work together within the Assembly and throughout society to ensure that this massacre, this genocide, is fully recognised [by the British Government], because recognition and commemoration are the vital steps to ensure that it never happens again'.

An acknowledgement of genocide would also be a key element in securing peace in that region, which borders Europe and Asia. Signing a statement of opinion is a small gesture. However, it would not be a small gesture for the National Assembly for Wales to make a declaration. It would boost the campaign in Wales and beyond. We must have general acknowledgement of the truth of what happened in Armenia in order to begin to right these appalling wrongs. I appeal for the support of all Assembly Members.

events of 1918 was quite different; those events led directly to the rise of Nazism and the second world war.

Many of the victorious powers—including Britain—abdicated their responsibility of protecting emerging small nations. Britain and France, in particular, were guilty of taking over former German territories with no intention of allowing them self-determination. We know what happened in what was then called Arabia and in Palestine. The right to self-determination, as far as Britain was concerned at that time, did not extend to Ireland. It took four years for that recognition to be granted. Armenia was caught up in all of this. It was supposedly offered the protection of the victorious powers, but that protection was subsequently withdrawn. Recognition of an independent Armenia was never forthcoming.

The turmoil after the end of the first world war and the defeat of the Ottoman armies led to much death, mayhem and displacement across the Caucasus and in parts of what was then the Ottoman empire. Turkey became a secular state in the early 1920s. When Kemal Ataturk took over the country, the move from a religious sultanate was completed, and Turkey became a secular state in the western fashion. The banning of the fez was one example of what happened in Turkey at that time. Turkey still prides itself on being a secular state. Pictures of Kemal Ataturk are still seen in many cafes and shops in Turkey, and he is still revered as the founding father of modern Turkey.

The Armenian people contend that a massacre that amounted to genocide took place in the years preceding the first world war and, in particular, in the years after the war ended—in 1918 to 1923 and perhaps beyond. It is ingrained in the folk memory of the Armenian people, who refer to it as *metz yeghern*—the time of great evil. There is evidence to suggest mass displacement of Armenian people around Europe at that time. The Turkish Government contends that what happened was regrettable but that it was nothing more than the fortunes of war, and

It is difficult to judge. Many victims of the holocaust during the second world war, as well as many of those who liberated the death camps, are still alive. I have had the honour of meeting members of the British armed forces who liberated the camp at Belsen, and hearing of their experiences. The evidence before us of the holocaust is strong, as there is living evidence and evidence on film. The only conclusion that a sensible person can draw is that mass murder on a grand scale occurred against the Jewish people. When trying to justify the holocaust to his staff, Hitler said that no one would remember in time because 'who, after all, speaks today of the annihilation of the Armenians?' That is a chilling quotation. I am unqualified to judge as to what happened in this case, although there is strong evidence to suggest that what happened amounted to a massacre. However, many people in Europe do not know of the full extent of what happened, and need to know more about it.

One historian in particular believes that the holocaust never happened. You will always find people to

That document confirms that genocide took place, as an entire population of Armenians in Turkey were annihilated. Does the Minister accept that the only people who allege that they have academic evidence against the claim of genocide are the Turks themselves? That evidence cannot be taken seriously. Any historian who considered this matter would reach the conclusion that genocide occurred and that there is clear evidence that it was a model for Hitler. Will the Minister acknowledge that this morning?

I cannot ignore the fact that there is strong evidence to suggest that such a massacre or genocide took place. I cannot ignore the fact that so many national and regional parliaments, including those of France, Belgium, Sweden and the European Parliament, have taken the same view. Most importantly, the Lebanese Parliament also shares that view. One of the allegations that is sometimes thrown at those who contend that genocide took place is that it is the result of anti-Muslim feeling—that it is a conspiracy by Christian governments and parliaments to deprecate a state where the majority of people are Muslims. To say that we live in Christian states in western Europe is an oversimplification. The drive of Christianity is more blunted now than it was 100 or 200 years ago. It is important that the Lebanese Parliament took that view because its state has a majority of Muslims, and that has been the case for some time. We know from the history of the Lebanon in the early 1980s that it also has a large Christian population. However, it has a Muslim majority, therefore Muslims cannot allege that this is an example of prejudice against them.

The Turkish Government needs to reconsider carefully what happened in the years after the first world war. It is not good enough to say that this is a plot by non-Muslims or by those who are trying to prevent Turkey from joining the EU; it is not as simple as that. Turkey has the right to exist, as does the new state of Armenia. Turkey should reconsider carefully all of the evidence, not only the parts that it considers to be important.

Other states have recognised their past misdemeanours and crimes. Those states have grown and prospered as a result of that recognition. They have cleared the decks. People have accepted that difficult and bad incidents have occurred and now they can move on. In reconsidering what happened to Armenians between 1909 and 23, the Turkish Government must decide whether it wants to clear the decks, whether it should recognise

Successive British Governments have not been persuaded that the evidence is sufficiently unequivocal to categorise the Armenian massacres as genocide, as defined by the 1948 United Nations Convention on Genocide. That does not suggest that what happened should be forgotten, or that it can be brushed under the carpet, or that there are people who will not continue to delve and work so that the truth is made known. It is important that the Welsh Assembly Government—for what it is worth, because we do not have a foreign policy role—urges the Governments of Armenia and Turkey to look to the future, to build a better relationship, and to work towards peace, security and mutual understanding in a region that, for so much of its history, has been torn by strife and war. The recent visit to Wales by delegates from the National Assembly of Armenia helped in that process.

The one thing that the history of Armenia teaches us, as indeed does the history of the second world war and the history of Yugoslavia in the early 1990s, is that we cannot simply sit back and hope that the problem goes away. The massacres and the genocide that took place in Yugoslavia in the early 1990s, which we saw on our television screens, was a disgrace. What happened in Bosnia-Herzegovina, particularly to those Muslims who were in the wrong place at the wrong time, was a disgrace that is only now being rectified. It would have been better if there had been some form of intervention at the time rather than bringing people to trial 10 years after the event. However, in the finest tradition of western European foreign office departments, people sat on their hands

We must never forget what is done in the name of one race against another, by one country against another, or say that what we need to do is just sweep it under the carpet and forget about it. If we do that, it shows that as human beings we never learn from mistakes. We can never allow that to happen. While the Assembly Government cannot give a definitive answer to Cynog's short debate, and I am aware of the statement of opinion that Cynog mentioned, we must bear in mind what the weight of evidence actually is. When people examine that weight of evidence, they may wish to draw certain conclusions.

I emphasise that there has been no pressure on me, and there has been no communication from the Turkish Embassy and the Turkish Government, or from the Foreign Office in London. This is my individual viewpoint, and I speak today on behalf of the Government. If any attempt had been made to put pressure on me, I guarantee that I would have told you, because I am not prepared to buckle under such pressure. Much still needs to be done to inform people of what happened in those terrible years in Armenia and what happened to the people of Armenia. We must encourage those organisations, which Cynog mentioned, that seek nothing more than the truth.
